- ▶ 1,915 Violations Were Reported During Calendar Year 2012. 28.8% of Those Violations, were Committed By 0.7% of the Waterworks Reporting Violations
- ▶ 2,125 Waterworks Reported No Violations during Calendar Year 2012

^{*}Violations at two very large waterworks, serving a total of more than 680,000 customers, accounted for over 60% of the people served by waterworks reporting violations.

- 71 Violations
- 16,659 Were Served by Waterworks Reporting GWR Violations
