

Once an inmate is identified as requiring services a HRCSB clinician will meet with that individual to assess the appropriate level of care needed. Weekly educational groups are available to the inmates by professionally trained HRCSB staff. These groups focus on substance abuse and mental health concerns. Participants are provided general education and taught coping skills and strategies targeted at aiding an individual in their recovery process in the community. If an inmate is identified to be in crisis, a HRCSB clinician will assess for any safety concerns and provide individual meetings if needed.
