LOANS: homeowners-occupants unable to obtain affordable credit elsewhere; applicants must have very low incomes (below 50% of the area median income). GRANTS: homeowners 62 years of age and older unable to repay a Section 504 loan.

Low- to moderate-income homeowners in rural areas needing loans to construct, refurbish and service their household well systems. Priority is given to applicants who are elderly, disabled, or with minor children. Loans may not be used for new dwelling construction or to substitute for water service available from collective water systems.
