

Instructions for Virginia Sanitizer's Permit

Any chemical spray method approved by the Virginia Board of Health for use on Bedding and Upholstered Furniture for the purpose of Sanitization must meet the following specifications:

1. Product must have an EPA Reg. No. and specific label for Bedding and Upholstered Furniture.
2. Efficacy data regarding its efficiency as a bactericide, fungicide, germicide, and insecticide, as well as safety, must be provided
3. Must be quick drying, non-staining, and contain identifiable crystals which will appear when viewed through an ultra-violet detection unit.
4. For Virginia, must register product with the Virginia Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services Pesticides and Hazardous Substances Section.
5. Must pass a pesticide laboratory test for label claim.
6. Must pass insecticide shelf life test; no loss in insecticide content after thirty (30) day storage at elevated temperature of 130 degrees Fahrenheit.
7. Must be in a non-concentration form so that Sanitization permit holders do not have to dilute into a weaker solution.

Any manufacturer making a product which will meet these standards may apply for its approval at any time through this office.
