# **Breastfeeding Peer Counselor Standards of Practice**

- Promote consistency of practices and services by encouraging a common systematic approach
- Provide recommended framework for educational programs and quality improvement efforts

## Standard 1. Professional Responsibilities

- 1.1 Act as an advocate for pregnant and breastfeeding women, infants, and children
- 1.2 Assist the participant in initiating and maintaining a breastfeeding relationship with her infant/ child
- 1.3 Maintain and expand knowledge and skills for lactation management by participating in continuing education opportunities
- 1.4 Undertake periodic and systematic evaluation of one's practice by the local agency breastfeeding coordinator

# **Standard 2. Legal Considerations**

- 2.1 Work within the policies and procedures of the Virginia WIC Program
- 2.2 Protect participant confidentiality at all times
- 2.3 Maintain records according to legal and ethical practices within the Virginia WIC Program
- 2.4 Yield to local agency breastfeeding coordinator, local agency WIC coordinator, or International Board Certified Lactation Consultant (IBCLC) for situations out of breastfeeding peer counselor scope of practice

## **Standard 3. Clinical Practice**

The role of breastfeeding peer counselors within the Virginia WIC Program includes:

- assessment, planning, intervention, and evaluation of lactation management within the WIC Program setting
- anticipatory guidance and prevention of problems
- complete, accurate, and timely documentation of care in Crossroads
- timely communication and collaboration with other WIC personnel and health care professionals

### 3.1 Assessment

- obtain and document an appropriate history of the participant
- discuss any pertinent assessment information with the participant and document communications appropriately

#### 3.2 Plan

- analyze assessment information to identify issues or problems
- develop a goal and plan of care based on identified issues
- arrange for follow-up evaluation where indicated

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### 3.3 Implementation

- implement a plan of care in a manner appropriate to the Virginia WIC Program and acceptable to the mother
- exercise principles of optimal health and safety
- provide appropriate oral and written instructions
- provide appropriate demonstrations of interventions, equipment, procedures, and/or techniques
- facilitate referrals to local agency breastfeeding coordinator, local agency WIC coordinator, International Board Certified Lactation Consultant (IBCLC), or other health care professional or community services
- document and communicate to WIC personnel appropriate:
  - o assessment information
  - o suggested interventions
  - o instructions provided
  - o evaluations of outcomes
  - o modifications to plan of care
  - o follow-up strategies

### 3.4 Evaluation

- Evaluate outcomes of planned interventions
- Modify the plan of care as needed
- Refer to local agency breastfeeding coordinator, local agency WIC coordinator or International Board Certified Lactation Consultant (IBCLC) when necessary.

### Standard 4. Breastfeeding Education and Counseling

- Promote breastfeeding as the preferred infant feeding method
- Educate participants and families to encourage informed decision-making about infant feeding
- Be sensitive to the participants culture, questions, concerns, and preferred learning techniques
- Provide anticipatory guidance and teaching to:
  - o promote optimal breastfeeding practices
  - o minimize potential breastfeeding complications
  - o provide positive feedback and support for continued breastfeeding
  - o share current evidence-based information related to lactation management with WIC participants and personnel
