Week 01 (Weekending date 01/08/2011):

Virginia's Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Activity Level

[Widespread]

% of visits for ILI by age group

0-4: ~6.8%

5-18: ~3.3%

19-24: ~2.8%

National Surveillance Summary

16.3% of tested specimens positive for Influenza

Of those: 26.2% were B

73.8% were A

Of those typed:


7.7% were A 2009 H1N1

31.5% were A H3

Antiviral resistance

No Oseltamivir (Tamiflu©) or Zanamivir (Relenza©) resistance has been reported in Influenza A (H3), Influenza A (2009 H1N1), or Influenza B specimens for the 2010-11 season.

VA ILI Levels




U.S. ILI Levels
