Surveillance

Virginia's Influenza-Like Illness (ILI) Activity Level (Week 08 02/26/2011): Widespread

% of visits for ILI by age group

- 0-4: ~7.5%
- 5-18: ~6.8%
- 19-24: ~4.3%

National Surveillance Summary (Week 08: 02/26/2011)

27.9% of tested specimens positive for Influenza

Of those: 26.0% were B
74.0% were A

Of those typed:

- 23.1% were A 2009 H1N1
- 32.4% were A H3

Antiviral resistance


Oseltamivir (Tamiflu®) or Zanamivir (Relenza®) resistance has been reported in:

1 of 454 (0.2%) samples of Influenza A (2009 H1N1) specimens.
