<b>Call to Order – Gary Critzer, Chair</b>	The Chair, Mr. Critzer, called the meeting to order at 1:07 p.m. Since there were several new State EMS Advisory Board members on the board as well as Symposium guests in attendance at the meeting, Mr. Critzer asked board members to introduce themselves.	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- The Chair asked the group to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance</li> <li>- Approval of August 8, 2014 Meeting Minutes- The August 8, 2014 meeting minutes were approved as presented.</li> <li>- Approval of November 5, 2014 Meeting Agenda – The November 5, 2014 meeting agenda was approved as presented.</li> </ul>	
<b>Chairman’s Report – Gary Critzer</b>	<p>Mr. Critzer congratulated Sterling Volunteer Rescue Squad who recently celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.</p> <p>Mr. Critzer gave an overview of events that have taken place since the last State EMS Advisory Board meeting.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• They have been working on finalizing the Mobile Integrated Healthcare Workgroup. Mr. Critzer said that in discussions with VDH Administration and the Office of EMS, it was decided that the workgroup needed to be expanded and some additional seats added. Dr. Allen Yee will be the group’s Chair and Debbie Akers will be the OEMS staff for the workgroup. The first meeting will probably take place in January.</li> <li>• HB1010 – Mr. Critzer reported that HB1010 is still tabled but there is a possibility that it might be brought back up in the upcoming General Assembly session.</li> </ul> <p>A multidisciplinary group was assembled to discuss proposals concerning certification requirements and the emergency medical responder.</p> <p>The consensus of the group is that Virginia EMS: (1) should maintain their position to stay with the national standards for EMS education curriculum; and (2) continue to work on recruitment and retention and leadership issues in EMS in an effort to foster recruiting and maintaining both volunteer and career EMS providers.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Criminal Background Checks – Mr. Critzer acknowledged the work of Michael Berg and his staff at OEMS on the criminal background checks. He also reported that the Office of EMS has hired a wage position for processing the criminal background checks.</li> </ul> <p>Mr. Critzer explained that some agencies, especially some career agencies, have complained that they need more information than just getting an answer that an individual is eligible or ineligible for affiliation because some agencies have requirements for membership that exceeds OEMS requirements.</p> <p>Mike Berg and his staff has met with members of the state police to try and work through these concerns; Mr. Critzer said that he also had some meetings with some individuals who work with the state police in the Virginia Criminal Information Network Division. Mr. Critzer reported that they have made progress to be able to release back to the agency through the</p>	

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	<p>Office of EMS disqualifying information.</p> <p>Mr. Critzer said that they also asked if the State Police would allow automatic submissions directly from the live scan machines to the state instead of them putting the cards in the mail. However, currently the cards still have to be mailed until some technical issues can be worked out. Mr. Critzer suggested that it is best to mail the cards using a tracking system such as FedEx, UPS, etc., a method that would allow you to have a certified receipt of mailing.</p>	
<p><b>Office of EMS Report – Gary Brown, Scott Winston and OEMS Staff</b></p>	<p>Mr. Brown welcomed everyone to the 35<sup>th</sup> EMS Symposium. Mr. Brown said he likes to hold this meeting during the Symposium so that the EMS constituents have an opportunity to see the State EMS Advisory Board and also to give the board members a chance to see the constituents for whom they have to make decisions that will affect them.</p> <p>New Board Members Orientation and Terms</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr. Brown said that any board members, who were unable to participate in the first orientation, please email Mr. Critzer or him and to let them know that you desire an orientation; and they will make arrangements to meet with you for a personal orientation to the State EMS Advisory Board.</li> <li>• Mr. Brown also announced that the Secretary’s office was informed of the 2012 legislation that staggered the appointments to the board of two, three and four years. As a result, the Secretary’s office and the Governor have reviewed all new appointments and extended particular terms by one year.</li> </ul> <p>EMS Voluntary Event Notification Tool (E.V.E.N.T.) – Scott Winston</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr. Winston explained that this tool is used to gather data to improve the safety, quality and consistent delivery of EMS across the Commonwealth and the United States. He said that the tool has been developed by the Center for Leadership, Innovation and Research in EMS in partnership with several national organizations, and it allows data to be collected unanimously and looked at to provide input in developing policies, procedures and training programs to improve the safe delivery of EMS.</li> </ul> <p>Ebola Update – Karen Owens</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ms. Owens said that the best source of current, up to the minute information on Ebola is the CDC website. She reported that currently, at that time, there were no Ebola cases in Virginia. There is a very small possibility that Virginia EMS providers will have to transport any patients that are severely contagious. With the screening processes in place, EMS providers should recognize potential Ebola patients very early in the process before they really become contagious. Ms. Owens also reported that VCU and UVA have been identified as the two hospitals designated for treating Ebola patients, and if smaller hospitals receive a Ebola patient they should be sent to one of those two facilities.</li> <li>• Ms. Owens and the Office of EMS recognize the work that the Regional EMS Councils have</li> </ul>	

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	<p>done to educate and communicate information to the EMS agencies in their service area. Ms. Owens reported that the Virginia Department of Health and Office of EMS are relying upon CDC guidance and working hand-in-hand with the VDH Office of Epidemiology to develop and create guidance or coordinate a location where EMS providers can go to get guidance.</p> <p>Virginia Department of Health Office of EMS Course Availability – Warren Short</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Mr. Short gave a presentation that talked about the availability of EMS education programs and the location of EMS providers in Virginia, primarily at the EMT level. His presentation gave an overview of all the CE courses that are offered throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia, and it also showed where the EMTs live.</li> </ul>  <p>110514 DED Advisory Board Presentation.pd</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Following his presentation, Mr. Short answered questions from the Board.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Board of Health EMS Representative Report – Bruce Edwards</b></p>	<p>Mr. Edwards gave an update on the Board of Health activities and the last meeting of the Board of Health.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Discussions at the Board of Health meeting included a report from the Commissioner on Ebola; Enterovirus 68 ; everyone is encouraged to get a flu shot; and they had a budget overview. Mr. Edwards explained that because VDH gets a lot of federal money and anytime anything has to be cut it is cut out of the General Fund revenue. He explained that creates a disadvantage because you cannot spend federal dollars for certain state programs.</li> <li>Gary Brown made a presentation to the Board of Health on 12VAC5-31, which was a fast track amendment to add back the word “affiliation” to the EMS regulations. This was mistakenly left out during the last revision. That regulation change was approved.</li> <li>Mr. Edwards said they heard several other regulations at the meeting. He reported that the Abortion regulations will be discussed at the December Board of Health meeting.</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Election of Officers, Coordinators and Committee Chairs – Ronald Passmore</b></p>	<p>Mr. Passmore chaired the Nominations Committee that consisted of Matt Tatum, Anita Perry, Marilyn McLeod, and Stephen Elliott. <b>Executive Committee – Gary Critzer</b>	Mr. Critzer said that they have not had a formal meeting since the August meeting because the Executive Committee dropped to a total of two members with the rotation off the Board. Mr. Critzer reported that Mr. Tatum and he did participate in the discussions regarding HB1010.	
<b>Financial Assistance Review Committee (FARC) – Robert Trimmer</b>	Mr. Trimmer reported that they did not have a quorum at their last meeting. The committee will meet on Thursday, November 6. They have 231 grant requests that they will have to consider this cycle.	
<b>Administrative Coordinator</b>	Mr. Samuels previously held that position, and he did not have a report.	
<b>Rules and Regulations Committee – Michael Bert</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Michael Berg gave an update on the regulatory packets that they have outstanding. He reported that the Financial Assistance Review fast track regulatory packet remains in the Office of the Attorney General. He has spoken with the AG Representative and they should have that packet moving forward very soon.</li> <li>Mr. Berg reported that the Affiliation word change packet needs to be signed by the AG’s Office and will be moving forward soon, as well.</li> <li>Mr. Berg reported that November 5 is the last day to submit any public comment in regards to the removal of the requirement of the practitioner’s signature on patient care reports. To date, there has been only one comment. On November 6, it will unofficially go into effect; and it will go into effect officially on November 24.</li> </ul>

They submitted their comments to the FARC.</li> <li>• Mr. Tatum reported that they also got an update from Michael Berg in regards to ambulance standards. <b>Emergency Management Committee – David Hoback</b>	Mr. Hoback reported that the Emergency Management Committee did not meet because of lack of a quorum. He said the committee continues to work with an opportunity to obtain the software Mutual Aid Net so they can bring together the resources in the Commonwealth, Fire Services, EMS and Emergency Management. He hopes to have some good news to report regarding this issue by the next meeting.	
<b>Medical Direction Committee – Marilyn McLeod, MD</b>	<p>Dr. McLeod referred the Board to the Medical Direction Committee's response to HB1010 in the form of a White Paper, which was distributed to Board Members. She said that this White Paper passed in the MDC unanimously. Dr. McLeod thanked the committee and especially, Dr. Lindbeck who did a lot of work on this White Paper. They are currently working on a project evaluating the opportunity for their air medical teams to possibly transport more STEMI patients from the scene. They want to determine if this will impact the patient's length of stay at the receiving PCI center. They hope to start data collection in January and be able to bring an update to the Board in February.</li> <li>• Ms. Perry also reported that the committee is still gathering and accessing data entered into the Virginia Helicopter EMS Weather Turn Down Program. No letters had to be sent out this quarter in regards to helicopter shopping.</li> </ul>	

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<p><b>Trauma System Oversight &amp; Management Committee – Paul Sharpe</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Mr. Sharpe welcomed new board member, Michael Aboutanos, who is also the new Chair of the Trauma System Oversight &amp; Management Committee (TSO&amp;MC).</li> <li>• Mr. Sharpe also announced that they have a new staff member in his unit, Robin Pearce, who will take over as the Trauma Coordinator.</li> <li>• The Trauma unit is now ready to start working with the Business Manager to contract with the American College of Surgeons to have them come in and perform a state trauma system consultation visit. They hope to get the contract done before the end of the year and it will probably be a six to 12 month process.</li> <li>• The TSO&amp;MC completed work on the Trauma Center Designation Manual and the revised manual was approved by the TSO&amp;MC at its September 2014 meeting. Mr. Critzer asked Mr. Sharpe to address the remarks. Mr. Sharpe said that he only had a short time to review the remarks but has not had a lot of time to address them. There was a lengthy discussion regarding the issues brought forth in the letter.</p> <p>Mr. Sharpe explained that the committee did not become aware of the CHKD concerns until late August, and said he thought that this was something that the committee could review at their upcoming meeting and perhaps agree to make some changes to the approved manual. He thinks it can be discussed between the Commissioner, the Chief Deputy Commissioner, Gary Brown and him on a phone call with CHKD. Mr. Sharpe encourages CHKD representatives to attend the next Trauma System Oversight &amp; Management Committee meeting to discuss this issue.</p> <p>Dr. Bartle, Chair of the Emergency Medical Services for Children Committee (EMSC) said he</p>	<p><b>MOTION:</b>  <b>The TSO&amp;MC moves that the EMS Advisory Board approve the 2015 Trauma Center Designation Manual.</b></p>

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	<p>appreciates all the work of the TSO&amp;MC. He said, however, that the letter brings out an issue that has been a concern in the pediatric community, which is that they want clarity making it unquestionable as to where you would send injured children.</p> <p>EMSC wants to bring an amendment to the motion that would clarify this issue by adding language specifying that they are brought to a Pediatric Level I Trauma Center.</p> <p>Mr. Critzer also informed the Board that there are members of CHKD who would like to address the Board concerning this issue. He said since it is not the protocol to have members from the public address the Board when they are taking an action, he has to have their approval to let the CHKD representatives speak at this time. The Board members agreed that they would like to hear from the CHKD representative.</p> <p>At Anita Perry's suggestion, Mr. Sharpe gave an explanation for adding Section 4 of the Trauma Center Designation Manual, which is a new section of the manual.</p> <p>Arno Zaritsky, Chief Medical Director at CHKD addressed the Board to explain their reason for the letter. He was accompanied by Dr. Ann Kuhn the Surgical Director of the Trauma and Burn Program and Dr. Qureshi who is the Medical Director for the Emergency Department. He said the points that they are trying to make in the letter that they wrote to the State EMS Advisory Board related to the joint relationship between Sentara Norfolk General and the Children's Hospital. They have met with the CEO at Sentara and talked with the surgeons at Sentara Norfolk General Hospital and they all agree that the goal is to figure out the best system that assures that children in the Hampton Roads region receive the best possible care if they experience a traumatic injury. They function as the component of a Level I Trauma Center and would like to receive that designation or recognition, which would allow them to work out the best system for assuring that kids are cared for appropriately, while allowing the State to have the appropriate over site to make sure that happens.</p> <p>After much discussion, the Chair decided that they need to vote on the original motion.
