

**Virginia Medication Assistance Program (VA MAP) Update through October 26, 2020**

VA MAP, formerly known as ADAP, uses four strategies to provide medications:

- 1) Direct VA MAP-Virginia Department of Health (VDH) directly provides medications.
- 2) Health Insurance Medication Assistance Program (HIMAP)-VDH pays premiums and medication copayments so clients receive medications via Affordable Care Act plans.
- 3) Insurance Continuation Assistance Program (ICAP)-VDH pays medication copayments for privately insured clients (such as those who have insurance through an employer) for certain medications.
- 4) Medicare Prescription Assistance Program (MPAP)-VDH pays premiums and/or medication copayments so clients receive medications via Medicare plans.

| 2. HIMAP          | 1434                             | 31%                          |
| 3. ICAP           | 692                              | 15%                          |
| 4. MPAP           | 818                              | 18%                          |
| Total             | 4633                             | 100%                         |

Between January 1, 2019 and October 26, 2020, 2,699 clients have transitioned from VA MAP to Medicaid.
