Part F

Funding for:

- AIDS Education and Training Center (AETC) Programs – Provide training and technical assistance to providers
- Special Projects of National Significance (SPNS) – Develop innovative models of HIV care and treatment
- Dental Programs – Provide oral health care to clients and education about HIV for dental care providers
- Minority AIDS Initiative – Help RWHAP recipients improve access to HIV care and health outcomes for minorities

INOVA

- Fairfax clinic in operation after lengthy closure due to flood.
- OAHS services increased with the hiring of a new provider. (C and D)
- VHARCC/AETC providing Prevention Counseling Series in September.
- F-MA AETC-Prevention Counseling Series in June (Fairfax, VA)

VCU AIDS Education Program

Funding & Staffing Updates

- 83% reduction in funding – Staff lay offs and furloughs
- Ryan White Part B Capacity Building grant ended
- AETC received on 42% of anticipated funding. (remaining funds may come in the fall)
- FY26/27 budget proposed eliminating Part F
- VHARCC is still fully funded

Program Activities

- Core case management & prevention programs continue
- Clinical and special topic training maintained
- Motivational Interviewing paused until fall cohort
- Partnership with Birth in Color : Statewide HIV testing training for doulas
- STI testing training planned later this year

- 262 unduplicated learners' last quarter
- 22 live programs delivered
