## Norfolk TGA / Ryan White Part A Program Updates

- The Norfolk TGA/RWPA Program is now housed under the Norfolk Department of Public Health (NDPH).
- The Planning Council Program Supervisor position closed on March 14th.
- A Subrecipient/Provider Meeting was held on Tuesday, March 18th.
  - All funded agencies were present.
  - Quarterly subrecipient meetings will begin in FY25.
- The Medical Case Management Workgroup convened on Tuesday, March 25th.
- Site Visit Monitoring Reports will be released to subrecipients on March 31st.
- Partial Award funds for FY25 have been drawn down in the amount of \$1,110,097
  - All contracts have been fully executed

- Hosting the NW VACAC Support Group at UVA for VDH has been a great addition to our patient monthly and quarterly patient support groups.

- Client Quality Meeting scheduled 04/25/25.
- Women's Support group meets monthly in clinic; next meeting is on 04/14/25.
- Men's Support Group meets monthly in clinic; next meeting is on 04/15/25.
- CAB meetings continue to take place in clinic after hours; next meeting is on 05/28/25.
- Nutrition Cooking Demos with Patients monthly in clinic; pending scheduling.
- **NEW!** VDH VACAC, NW Support Group; last meeting held 04/30/25.
- **NEW!** Psychosocial Support Gardening project to educate patients on growing their own food to help with food insecurities and promote Healthy eating habits, to better their health outcomes.
  - Squash, Zucchini, Swiss Chard, Tomatoes, Sweet Potatoes, Watermelon, Herbs harvested, shared with patients and also used in our cooking demos.

## **Part C Funded Services:**

- All dental funding has been expended since February
- Supported 35 clients with over 54 units of dental service
- Lost one Non-Medical Case Manager in February

## **Psychosocial Services:**

- Dietician on-site one half-day per week for patient counseling
- Workstation relocation increased visibility to physicians
- Now receiving more patient referrals as a result

## **Upcoming Events:**

- Exploring transition from current psychosocial program to art therapy
- Engaged in discussions with several local providers for potential partnership

# Part F

## Funding for:

- AIDS Education and Training Center (AETC) Programs – Provide training and technical assistance to providers
- Special Projects of National Significance (SPNS) – Develop innovative models of HIV care and treatment
- Dental Programs – Provide oral health care to clients and education about HIV for dental care providers
- Minority AIDS Initiative – Help RWHAP recipients improve access to HIV care and health outcomes for minorities

## **Overview of Activities**

- Fairfax clinic has reopened following an extended closure due to flooding.
- Successful CAB meeting held in March; next meeting scheduled for May 6.

## **Service Utilization**

- New Medical Nutrition Therapist hired last quarter; services to begin shortly.
- OAHS service capacity expanded with the addition of a new provider (Parts C & D).
