Virginia Medicaid & VAMAP: Final Notice about Medicaid Enrollment

October 10, 2025 VA MAP sent you a letter about changing how you get your medications if you qualify for Medicaid. If you are eligible, you must enroll in Medicaid because federal rules do not allow VA MAP to pay for medications if there is another way to pay for them. **You have another 30 days from the date on this letter to enroll in Medicaid.** **The Ramsell card that you use to get your medications from the pharmacy will not work after this time.** Please enroll in Virginia Medicaid to make sure you don't have a gap in getting your medications.

What makes you eligible for expanded Virginia Medicaid?

- You are aged 19 to 64
- You live in Virginia
- You do not qualify for Medicare
- You have household income up to 138% of the federal poverty level (see chart →)

ACTION STEP: Apply for Virginia Medicaid so you can get free or low-cost healthcare including medications and doctor visits. Eligible adults can enroll in Virginia Medicaid any time during the year, but with changes by the federal government, there may be limitations to special enrollment periods related to loss of health insurance coverage so contact Benalytics and they can help you apply for Medicaid. **How do you apply?**

- Online or call: VA MAP uses an agency called Benalytics that can help you enroll. Use this website, <https://myvamap.com> to set up an appointment. You can also call 1-855-483-4647. Their hours (in Eastern Time) are:

8A-6P (Monday, Thursday)

9A-5P (Tuesday, Wednesday)

How does Medicaid work?

Medicaid is a lot like a private insurance plan with doctors and other providers working together to offer health services. Clients can probably keep their current doctors when enrolling in Medicaid; but ask your doctors if they take Medicaid before you choose a plan. As of July 1, 2025, the plans are Aetna Better Health, Anthem HealthKeepers Plus, Human Health Horizons of Virginia, Sentara Community Plan, and UnitedHealthCare Community Plan.

What if I don't get approved or am not eligible?

VA MAP will continue to provide you with medication if you are denied for Medicaid enrollment. You must send VA MAP a copy of your Medicaid denial letter to stay on VA MAP services. **QUESTIONS?** Contact the VA MAP Call Center at 1-855-362-0658.
