## Lead Poisoning It Hurts Kick



### Early Signs of Lead Poisoning:

Often children have no symptoms and do not appear sick. However, some may have headaches, stomachaches or frequent tiredness. To be sure, your child's doctor can do a blood test.

#### Lead Poisoning Can Cause Your Child To Suffer From:

- Lower IQ (learning problems poor grades)
- Slower Growth (shorter height)
- Aggressive Behavior
- Lack of Self-Control (fighting, violence, short attention span)
- Lack of Coordination (poor balance while walking, running or playing sports)

#### You Can Protect Your Child From Lead Simply by Doing the Following:


- Have your child tested by their doctor
- · Have your home inspected for lead
- · Wash your child's hands often
- · Wash toys and other items often
- · Keep toys or other items out of their mouth
- · Wear shoes outside, take them off before coming inside
- Avoid bare soil play areas
- Wash up after playing outside
- Stay away from peeling and flaking painted areas
- Wet wipe surfaces with a clean cloth and damp mop the floor often
- Eat dairy foods, fresh fruits, green vegetables and lean meats. Reduce fried or fatty foods.

#### You CAN be Lead Safe! Take These STEPS:

If you live in a house or apartment that was built before 1978 and you see **peeling or flaking paint**, **AND** you have a child who is **6 years old or younger**, ask your child's doctor to give your child a **blood lead test** to see if your child is poisoned. – **OR** –

If you are pregnant, ask your doctor if you need to be tested for lead.

Don't Wait! Call your doctor now. It is your right. Your child will THANK YOU
