
About This Guide

These funds were intended to bolster public health infrastructure, enhance community health services, and address health disparities exacerbated by the pandemic. A key focus of ARPA funding related to public health was supporting projects that aimed to improve access to care, address social determinants of health. and promote health equity, particularly in underserved and rural communities. This included initiatives focused on expanding access to transportation, a critical component of overall health and well-being.




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The recent CENTRA 2024-2027 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) highlighted the persistent challenge of transportation access in our rural communities. Respondents to the survey ranked transportation as the third leading challenge that impacts the seven counties within the Piedmont Health District (Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway, and Prince Edward). Likewise, respondents reported difficulty accessing healthcare due to lack of transportation, as their top three priority for community health improvement. This lack of reliable transportation creates significant barriers to accessing essential healthcare services, including preventative care, chronic disease management, drug and alcohol treatment, and mental health support, ultimately impacting the health and well-being of our residents. Funding for this transportation guide was made possible through the ARPA grant, allowing us to develop a resource that addresses this critical need identified in the CHNA while helping connect residents with available transportation options.

Community survey respondents ranked transportation as the third-leading challenge that impacts the people of the Piedmont Health District.

Medicare/Medicaid Transportation

Need a ride to the doctor? Medicaid can help.

If you have Medicaid, your health plan may pay for rides to medical appointments—and sometimes to places like the pharmacy, grocery store, or church.

Here's how to make sure you get the transportation you need:

Schedule your ride early.

When you make a doctor's appointment, go ahead and book your ride too. Many programs need at least 5 days' notice.

Ask about standing orders.

If you need regular care (like dialysis), ask your doctor for a note and give it to the transportation company. This can help set up rides in advance.

Family and friends can help too.

If someone you know can drive you but gas money is a problem, ask your health plan if they offer gas money for friends or family who give you a ride.

· Be ready for delays.

You may share a ride with others, so plan for extra time.

Tell them about special needs.

If you use a wheelchair, crutches, or need other assistance, tell them when you book your ride.

You can bring one person with you.

You can bring one escort (family member, friend, or helper) with you.

How to Book a Medicaid Ride

Contact Modivcare or directly contact a transportation company. To use Modivcare:

- Call to book: 866-386-8331 (Monday-Friday, 6am-8pm)
- Use the Modivcare Trip Manager App (iTunes or Google Play)
- Online: member.Modivcare.com
- TTY for hearing impaired: 711 or 866-288-3133
- Free translation help is available.
- Book regular rides at least 5 days ahead.
- Call right away for **urgent or same-day needs**. Urgent rides will need confirmation from your doctor.

What You'll Need to Book

- Your **Medicaid ID** number
- Your birthdate
- Pick-up address
- Appointment date and time
- Doctor's name, number, and address
- Reason for appointment

- **Return time** (when you'll need a ride home)
- Any special needs (wheelchair, oxygen, etc.)
- If bringing a child, you are required to bring any needed car seat



Medicare/Medicaid Transportation

Important Notes

- Keep your **reservation number.** This is your proof the ride is scheduled.
- Be ready **15 minutes early.** Be at your door when the driver arrives.
- For return rides, wait where you were dropped off.
- If you need to **cancel**, **call 866-246-9979** at least 24 hours in advance.
- Children under 17 must travel with an adult. The adult must be 18 or older unless they are the parent.

Emergency? Call 911!

Medicaid rides are for planned trips ONLY—not emergencies.

Family & Friends Gas Reimbursement

If a friend or family member drives you to an appointment, they can get paid for gas. Here is the process:

- Call 866-386-8331 to request a mileage form.
- Bring the form to your appointment. Have it signed by the doctor.


