

EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR OVERDOSE BY OPIOID, UNSPECIFIED SUBSTANCE AND HEROIN AMONG VIRGINIA RESIDENTS

June 2017

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Background

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) currently receives data on visits to 77[§] acute care hospital emergency departments (EDs) and 13 free-standing EDs in Virginia for purposes of public health surveillance. The purpose of this report is to characterize ED visit trends for acute unintentional overdose by opioids and heroin among Virginia residents.

Chief complaints and discharge diagnoses of ED visits are analyzed by VDH to identify and monitor issues of public health concern across Virginia. The chief complaint is a free-text field that captures the patient’s primary reason for seeking medical care as interpreted by the ED registration staff. The discharge diagnosis is a coded field that uses standardized values outlined by the International Classification of Diseases (ICD) 9th and 10th Revision code sets.

Methodology

ED visits that are identified as **unintentional overdose by opioid or unspecified substance** include those with medical and non-medical use of a prescription opioid or where the substance is not specified, given evidence that the majority of fatal overdoses are opioid-related.¹ These visits must meet the following inclusion and exclusion criteria:

- Inclusion terms from Chief Complaint or Discharge Diagnosis: *overdose, OD, sobredosis, opioid, opiate, opium, narcotic, Narcan, naloxone, E850.1, E850.2, 965.00, 965.02, 965.09, 977.9, T40.0X1, T40.0X4, T40.2X1, T40.2X4, T40.3X1, T40.3X4, T40.4X1, T40.4X4, T40.601, T40.604, T40.691, T40.694, T50.901, T50.904*
- Exclusions terms from Chief Complaint or Discharge Diagnosis: *suicide, alcohol overdose alone, withdrawal, detoxification, rehab, addiction, dependency, mental health or psychological evaluation, allergies, constipation, chronic pain, refill requests, and any specified non-opioid drug or medication*

ED visits that are identified as **unintentional overdose by heroin** must meet the following inclusion and exclusion criteria:

- Inclusion terms from Chief Complaint or Discharge Diagnosis: *heroin, herion, 965.01, E850.0, T40.1X1A, T40.1X4A*
- Exclusions terms from Chief Complaint or Discharge Diagnosis: *suicide, withdrawal, detoxification, rehab, and addiction*

These criteria were revised in September 2016 in order to improve specificity in the identification of ED visits for unintentional drug overdose. Readers are strongly encouraged to review [syndromic surveillance data limitations](#) when interpreting this report.

ED visits for unintentional overdose by opioid or unspecified substance and heroin are presented by count or rate per 100,000 population. Rates are calculated using U.S. Census Bureau 2016 population estimates. To protect confidentiality and maintain accurate rate calculations, ED visit counts of 1 to 4 and rates with numerators of 1 to 4 are suppressed in this report. Counts of 0 are included.

The geographic location is assigned based on the patient’s residential zip code provided. A single zip code may span multiple city and county localities in Virginia. If a patient resides in such a zip code, the visit is assigned to the locality where the majority of the population resides. Places where the Virginia city and county populations have been combined to calculate a rate per 100,000 population due to zip codes spanning multiple localities can be found in [Appendix 1](#).

§ Between May and June 2017, fluctuations in reporting to VDH were observed. Before June, 82 acute care hospital EDs and 13 free-standing EDs submitted data. In June, one healthcare system in the Eastern Health Planning Region became unable to provide data. As a result, 77 out of an expected 82 acute care hospital EDs and 13 free-standing EDs reported data for June; any observed decreases in the count or rate of overdoses in the Eastern Region might be artificially low because of this change in reporting. Additionally, one acute care hospital ED in the Northwest Health Planning Region improved its data quality during June so that visits can be attributed to overdoses more accurately, thereby increasing the counts for that area. Please consider these changes in reporting when interpreting the contents of this report.

Highlights for June 2017

Statewide ED visits for overdose by opioid or unspecified substance among Virginia residents decreased by 22 visits (2.8%) in June compared to May 2017.

- Among the 5 [VDH health planning regions](#), visits for overdose by opioid or unspecified substance decreased in Central (41 fewer visits, 21%) and Eastern regions (13 fewer visits, 8%). Visits increased in the Northwest (14 additional visits, 12%), Northern (9 additional visits, 6%) and Southwest regions (9 additional visits, 6%). The Southwest region observed the highest rate (12.6 per 100,000 population) in June 2017.
- By sex, approximately 52% of visits for overdose by opioid or unspecified substance were among females and 48% were among males. Visits decreased among both females (19 fewer visits, 5%) and males (3 fewer visits, <1%).
- By age group, the greatest increase in visits for overdose by opioid or unspecified substance was observed among those aged 35-44 years (22 additional visits, 20%) followed by those 45-54 years (12 additional visits, 12%). A large decrease in visits was observed for those aged 15-24 years (40 fewer visits, 23%).
- Among the 35 [VDH health districts](#), the largest increases in visits for overdose by opioid or unspecified substance were observed in Central Shenandoah (14 additional visits, 127%), Norfolk (14 additional visits, 82%), and Chesapeake (17 additional visits, 77%). Roanoke remained the VDH health district with the highest rate (37.1 visits per 100,000 population) since March 2017.

Statewide ED visits for overdose by heroin among Virginia residents increased by 39 visits (31%) in June compared to May 2017, and are at the highest rate observed (1.94 visits per 100,000 population) since reporting began in January 2015.

- Among the 5 [VDH health planning regions](#), visits for overdose by heroin increased in the Eastern (22 additional visits, 61%), Northwest (12 additional visits, 52%), Northern (4 additional visits, 18%) and Southwest regions (4 additional visits, 17%). Visits decreased in the Central region (3 fewer visits, 16%)
- By sex, visits for overdose by heroin increased among both males (36 additional visits, 47%) and females (3 additional visits, 6%). Males contributed over twice as many visits for overdose by heroin compared to females.
- By age group, increases in visits for overdose by heroin were observed among those aged 55-64 years (6 additional visits, 67%), 45-54 years (6 additional visits, 60%), 35-44 years (14 additional visits, 56%), and 25-34 years (15 additional visits, 26%). Visits decreased only among those 15-24 years of age. The highest visit rate continues to be observed in those aged 25-34 years (6.1 per 100,000 population).
- Among the 35 [VDH health districts](#), the largest increases in visits for overdose by heroin were observed in Fairfax (267%), Portsmouth (175%) and Virginia Beach (157%). Portsmouth also represented the health district with the highest visit rate (11.5 per 100,000 population) among VDH health districts.

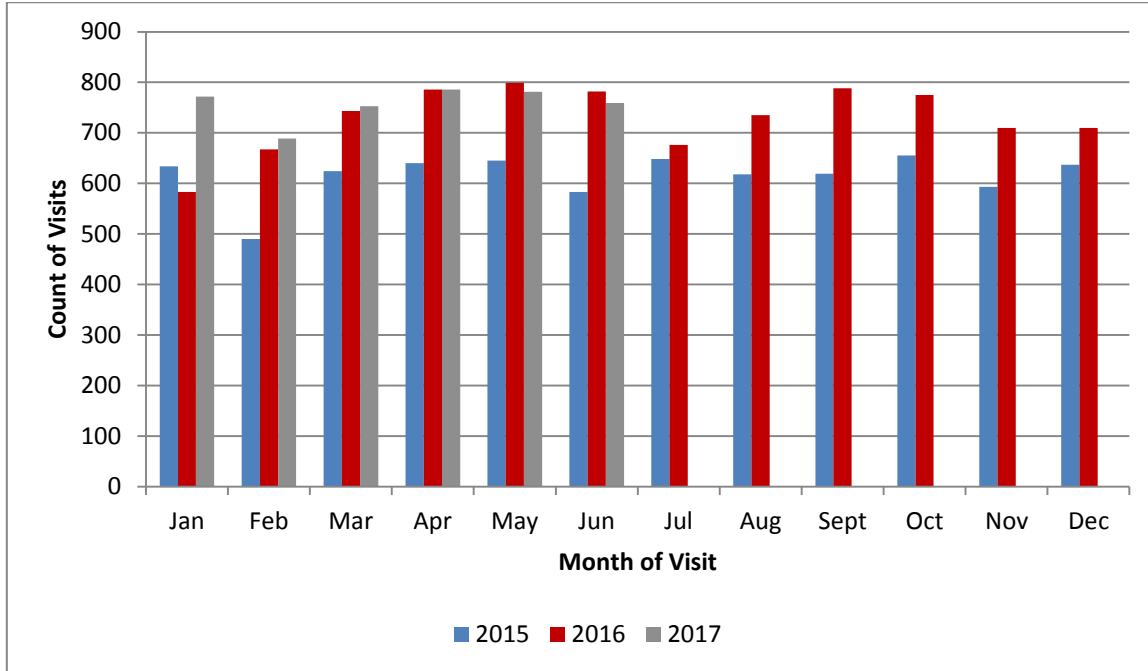
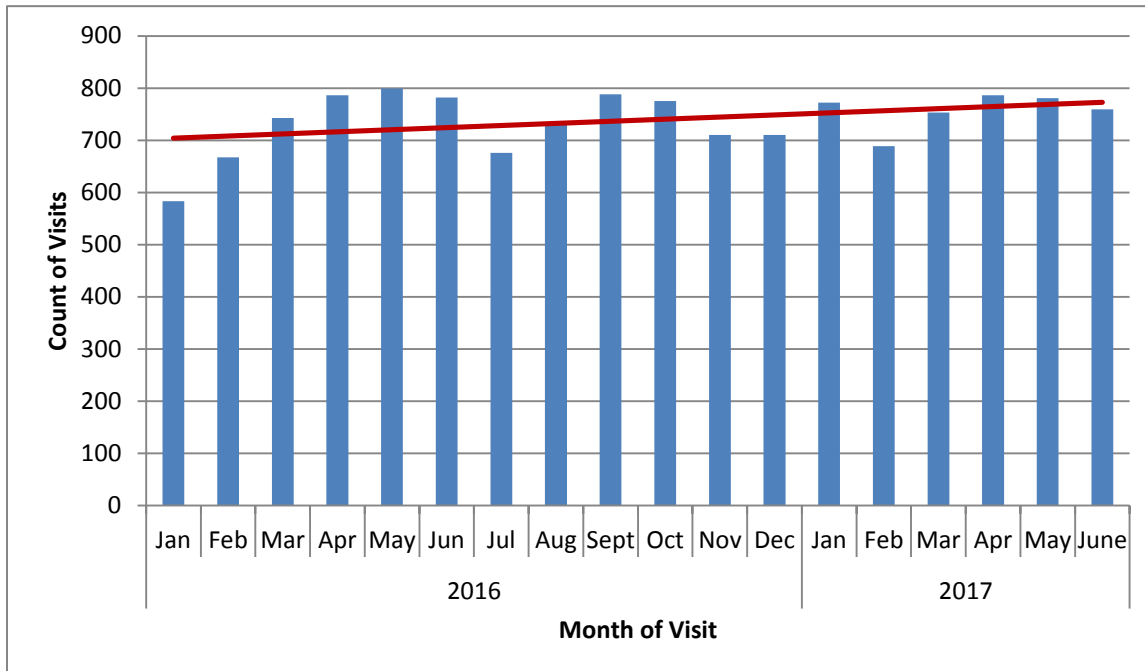


Figure 1B. Count of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Opioid or Unspecified Substance among Virginia Residents by Month with Line of Best Fit, Previous 18 Months.

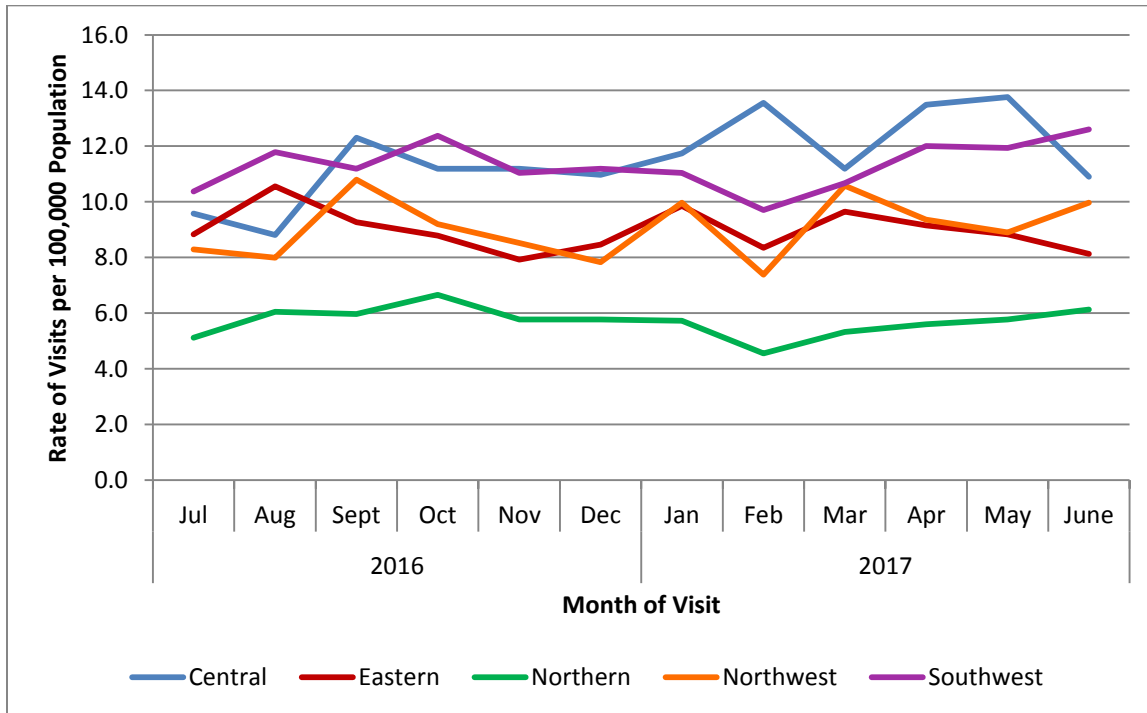


Figure 1D. Rate of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Opioid or Unspecified Substance among Virginia Residents by Month and Sex, Previous 12 Months.

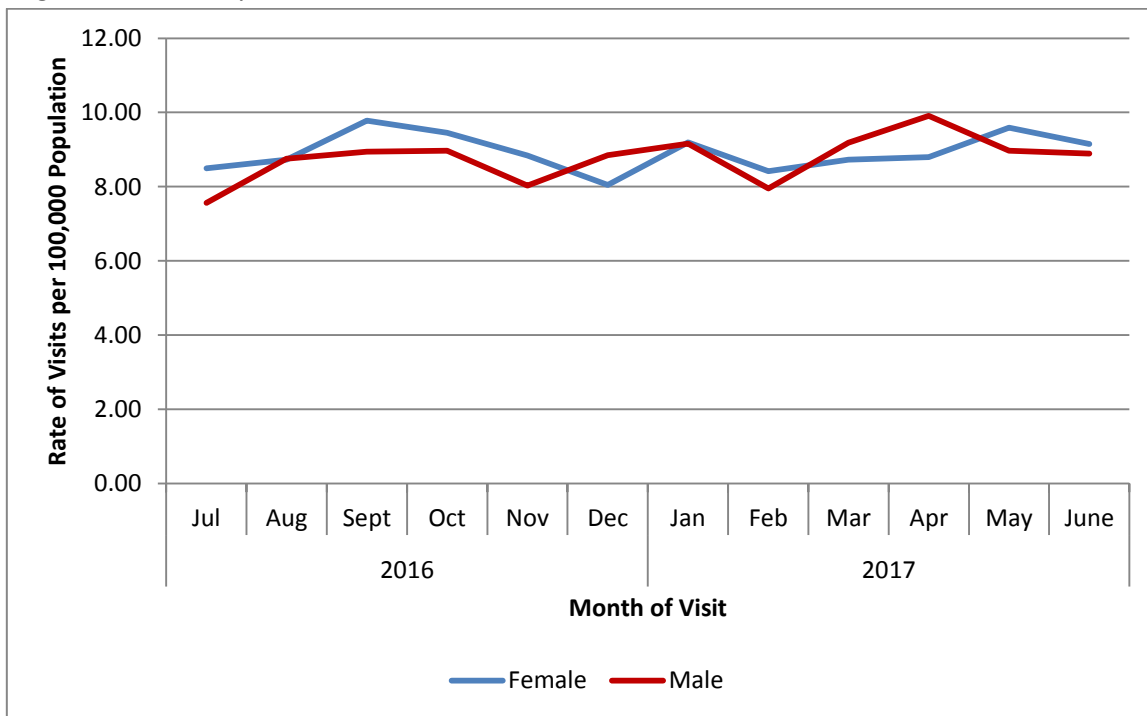


Figure 1E. Rate of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Opioid or Unspecified Substance among Virginia Residents by Month and Age Group (Years), Previous 12 Months.

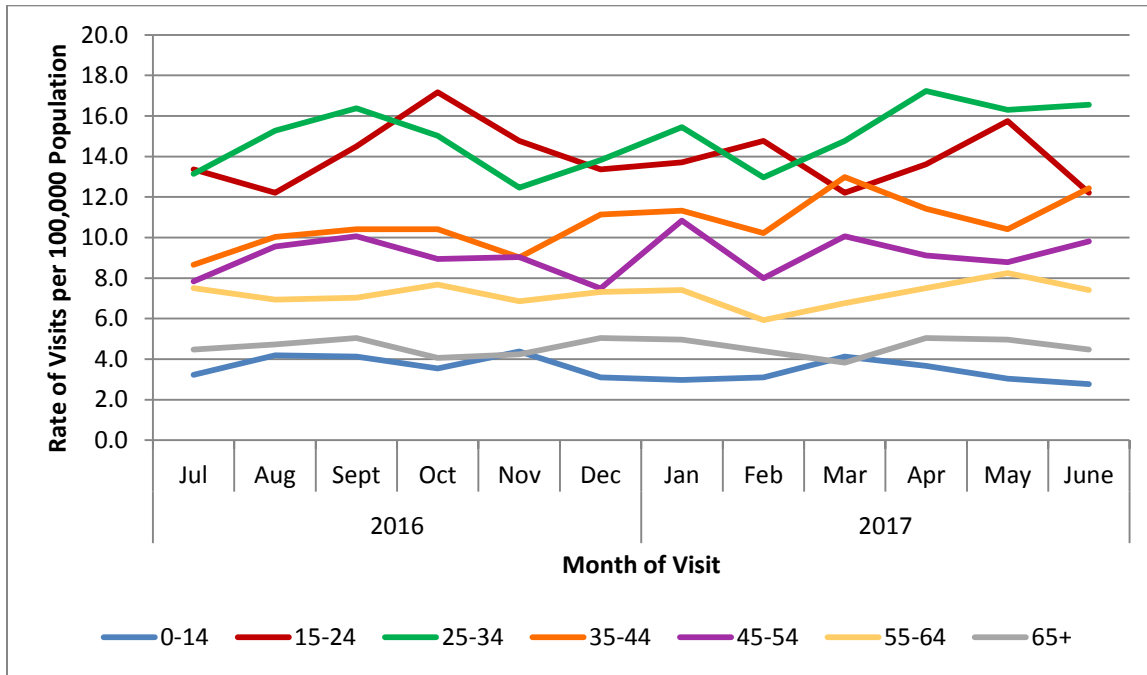

Figure 2A. Count of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Heroin among Virginia Residents by Month, 2015 – 2017.

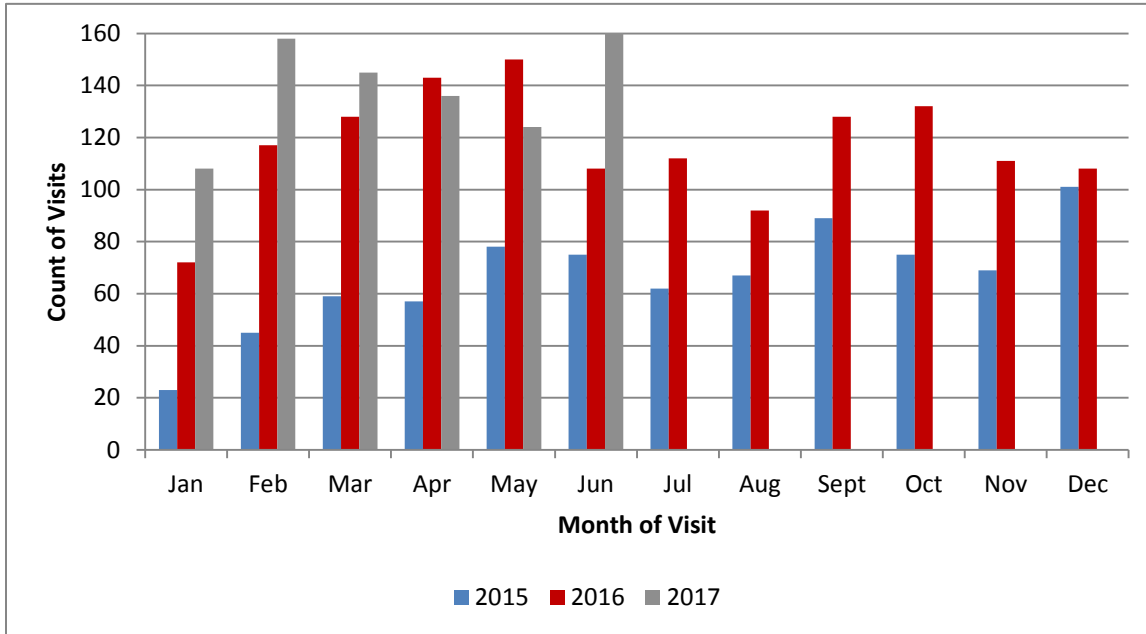
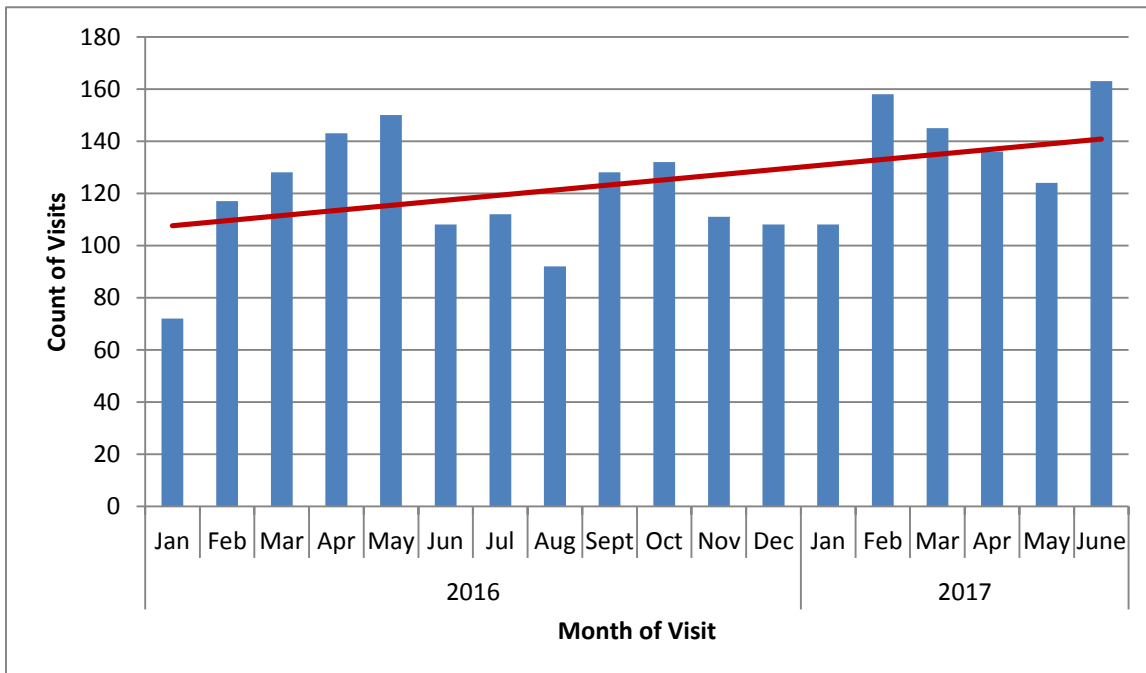


Figure 2B. Count of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Heroin among Virginia Residents by Month with Line of Best Fit, Previous 18 Months.

Figure 2C. Rate of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Heroin among Virginia Residents by Month and Health Region, Previous 12 Months.

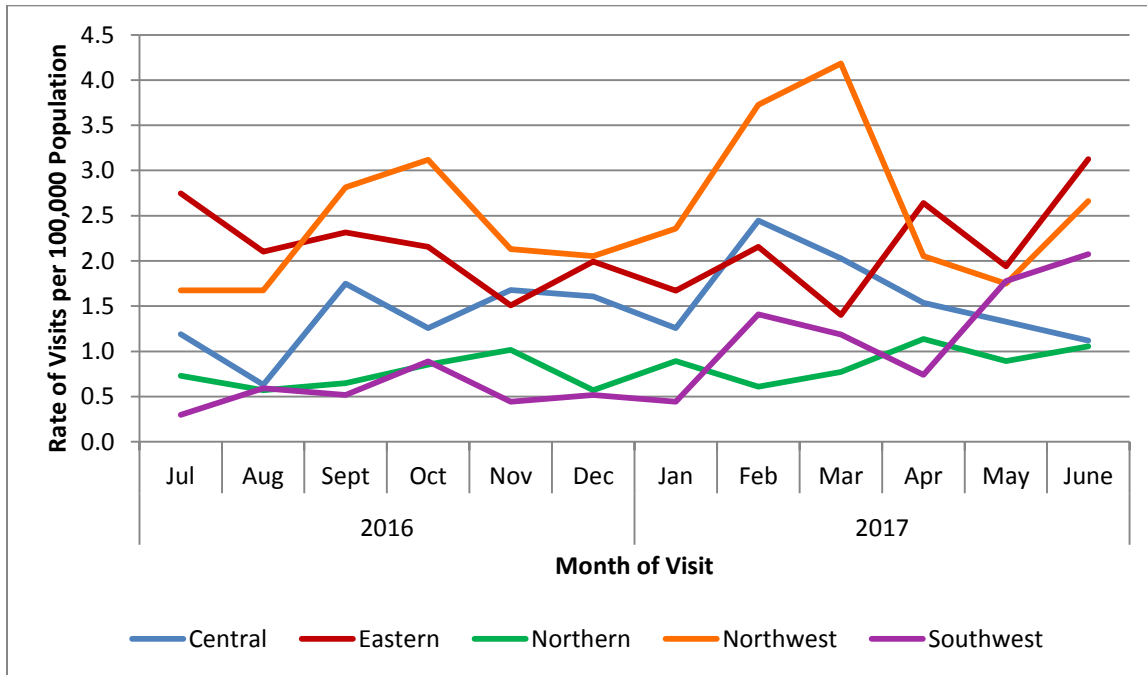


Figure 2D. Rate of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Heroin among Virginia Residents by Month and Sex, Previous 12 Months.

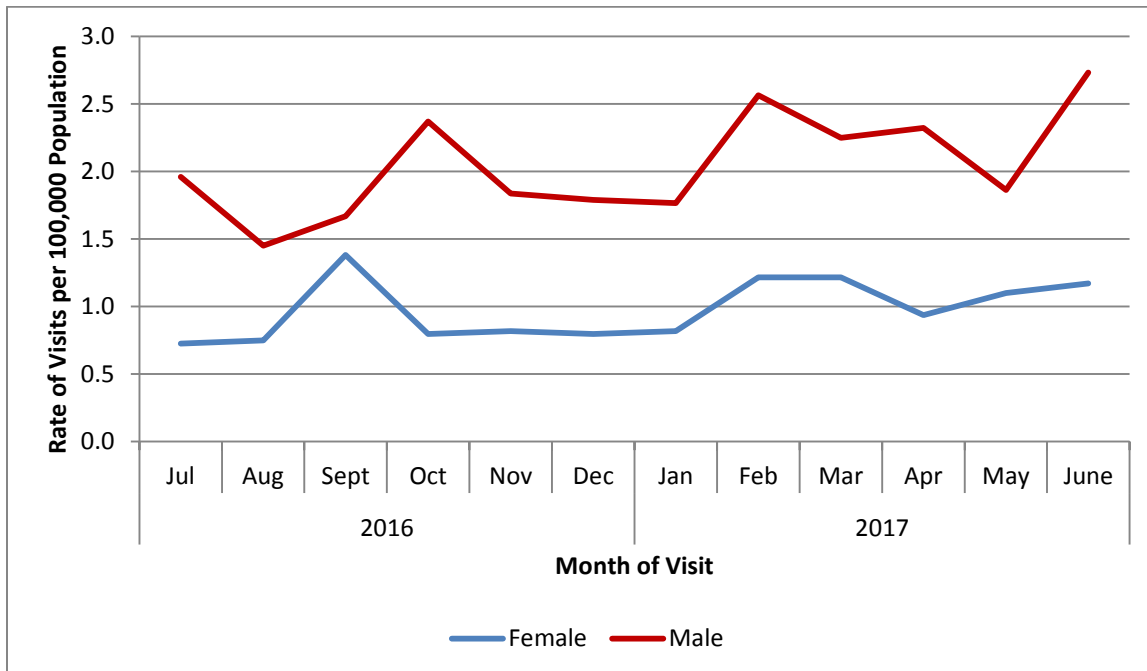


Figure 2E. Rate of ED Visits for Unintentional Overdose by Heroin among Virginia Residents by Month and Age Group (Years), Previous 12 Months.

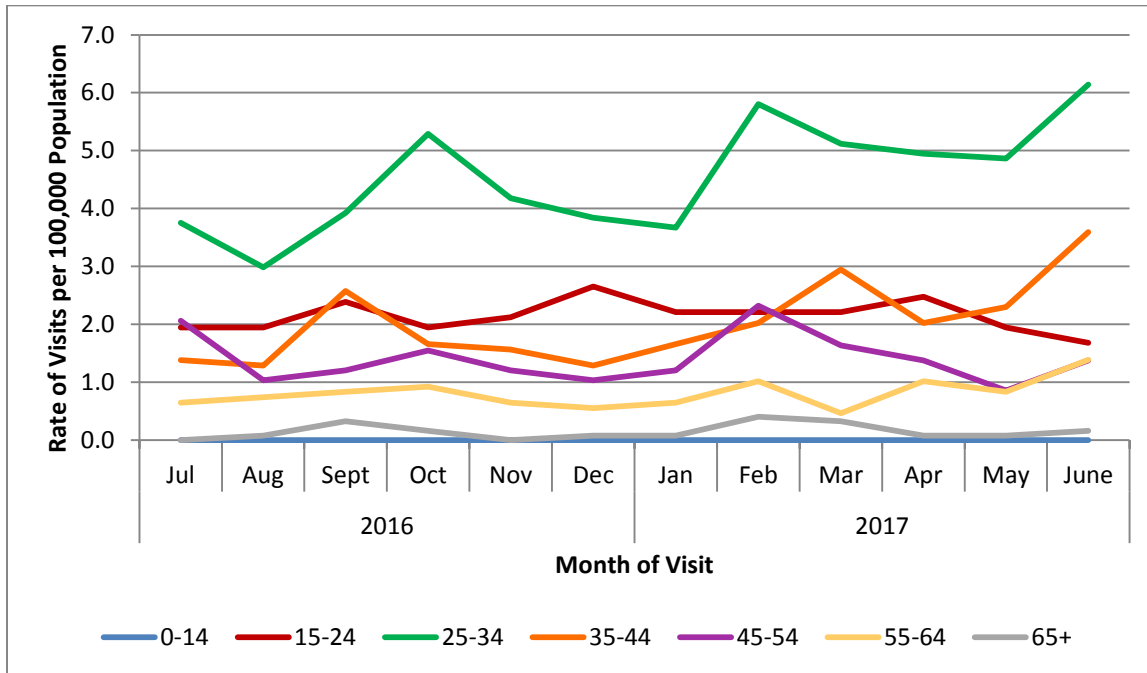
