



EMERGENCY DEPARTMENT VISITS FOR UNINTENTIONAL DRUG OVERDOSE AMONG VIRGINIA RESIDENTS

Quarter 2 (April-June) 2026

Report Generated: July 16, 2026

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Background

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) Office of Epidemiology collects and analyzes health data from emergency departments (EDs) to conduct public health surveillance. This report summarizes ED visit trends for unintentional drug overdose among Virginia residents for all drugs, opioids, heroin, and stimulants. Visits from 85 acute care hospital EDs and 29 free-standing EDs in Virginia are analyzed in this report.

VDH analyzes chief complaints and discharge diagnoses of ED visits to identify and monitor issues of public health concern. The chief complaint is a free-text field that captures the patient's primary reason for seeking medical care as interpreted by the ED registration staff. The discharge diagnosis is a coded field using standardized values defined by the International Classification of Diseases (ICD) 10th Revision or SNOMED Clinical Terms (CT) code sets.

Methodology

ED visits are categorized into the following four unintentional drug overdose case definitions: 1) all drug overdose, 2) opioid or unspecified substance overdose (excluding heroin), 3) heroin overdose, and 4) stimulant overdose. Overdoses classified as "intentional" are excluded from all categories. VDH revises the case definitions based on guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and findings from ongoing data quality evaluations. Overdose rates in this report are calculated per 10,000 ED visits rather than by total population. This metric provides a consistent rate calculation across time when the number of EDs reporting data increases or decreases. Geography-specific ED visit counts and rates per 100,000 population are included in the Monthly and Annual Statistics Excel files on the [VDH Drug Overdose ED Visits website](#). This report provides regional and statewide data for Virginia residents. The first quarter is from January to March, the second quarter is from April to June, the third quarter is from July to September, and the fourth quarter is from October to December.

As of April 2026, each figure in this report is accompanied by a data table to meet federal accessibility requirements.

Data quality improvements resulted in minor changes to ED visit rates for Q3 2024, and Q1, Q2, Q4 2025 compared to previously published reports. Use this report over previous versions.

Summary

- The statewide overdose ED visit rate per 10,000 ED visits increased for all drug types in Q2 of 2026 compared to the previous quarter (Q1 2026).
- Statewide overdose ED visit rates for Q2 2026 were lower than rates in Q2 of 2025 for all drug types, except stimulant.
- In Q2 of 2026, the all drug and opioid or unspecified overdose ED visit rates increased or remained stable in all regions. A similar trend was observed in Q2 of 2025.
- The 55–64-year-old age group had the largest quarterly increase in all drug and opioid or unspecified drug overdose ED visit rates.

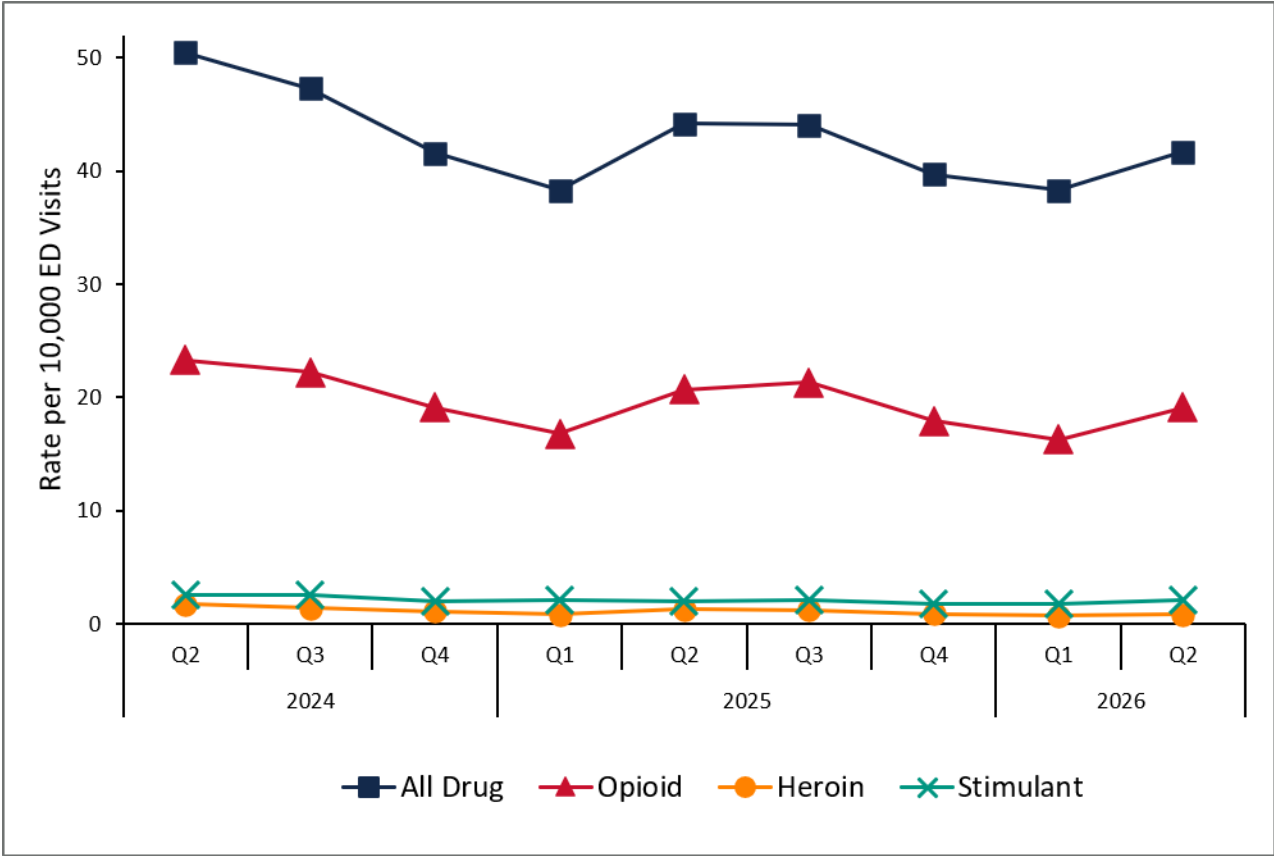

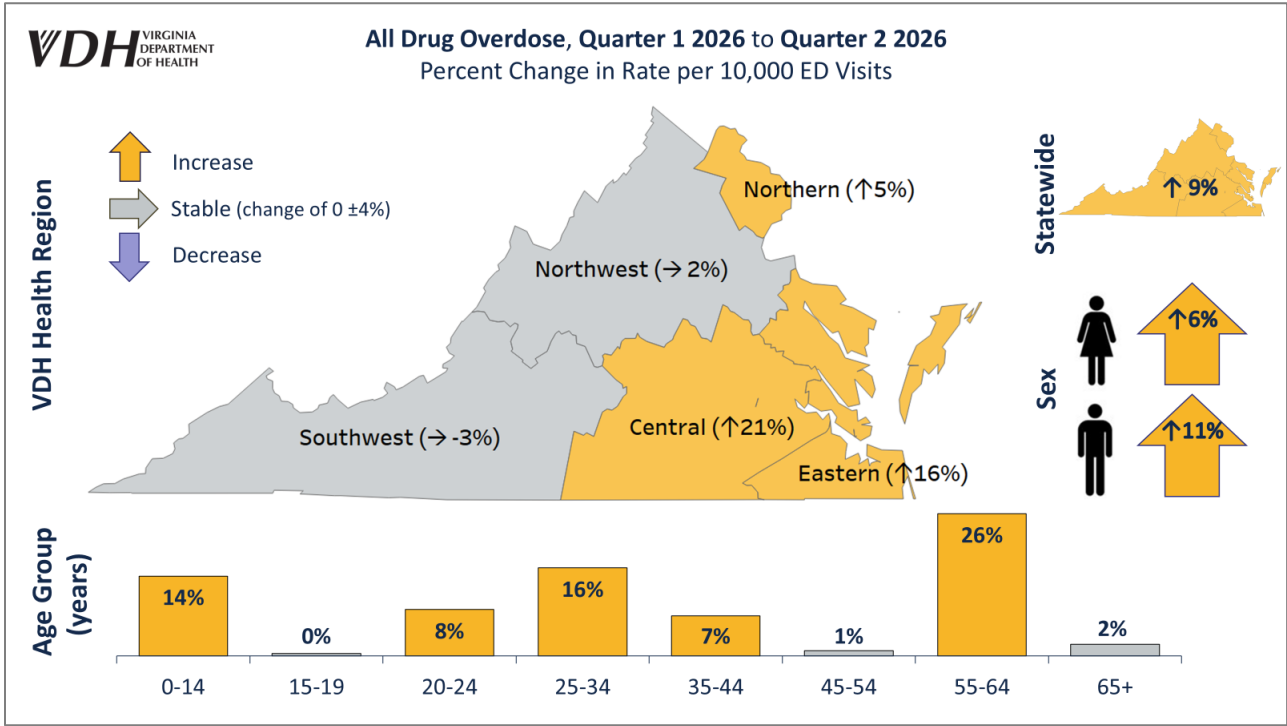

Figure 3. All Drug Overdose Visit Rate per 10,000 ED Visits among Virginia Residents by Calendar Quarter, 2024 to 2026.

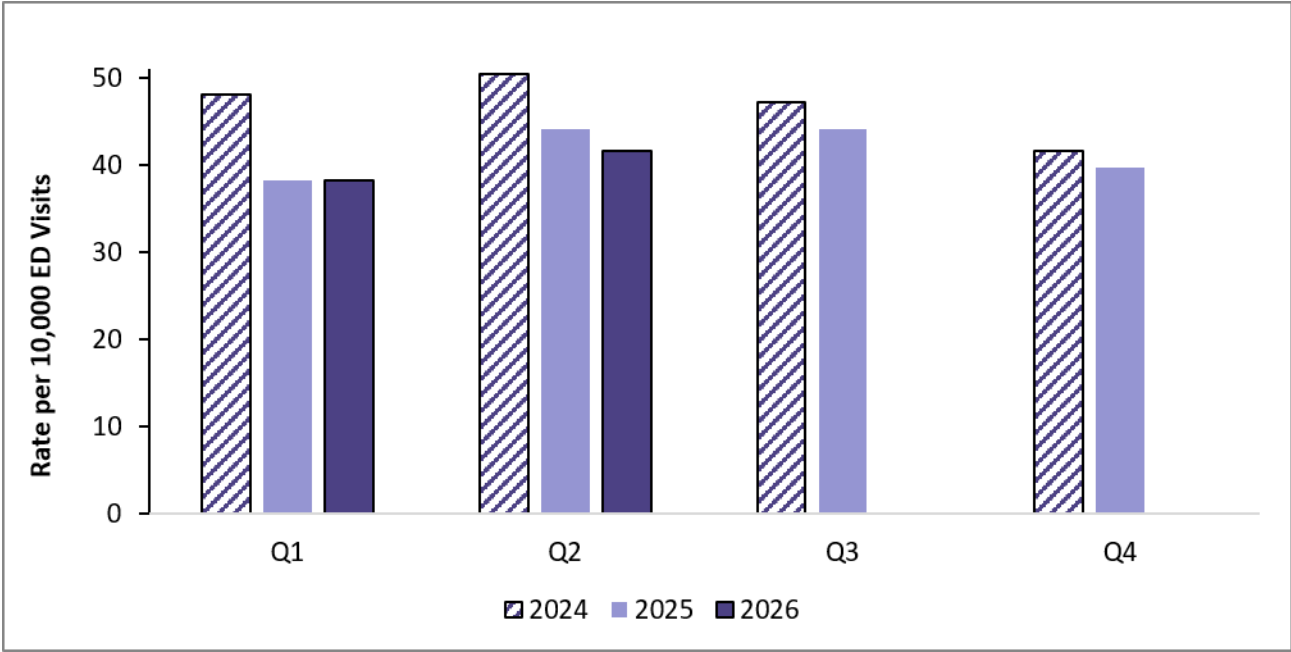

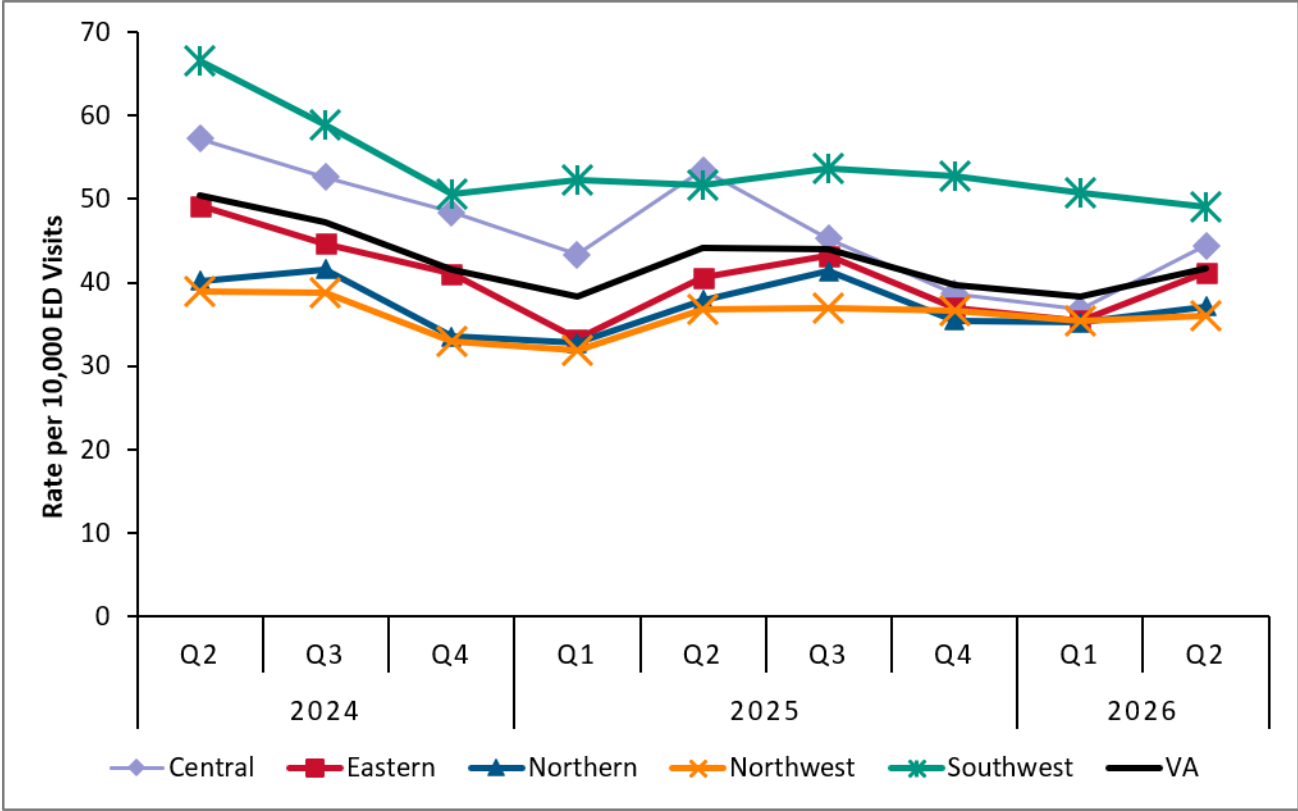

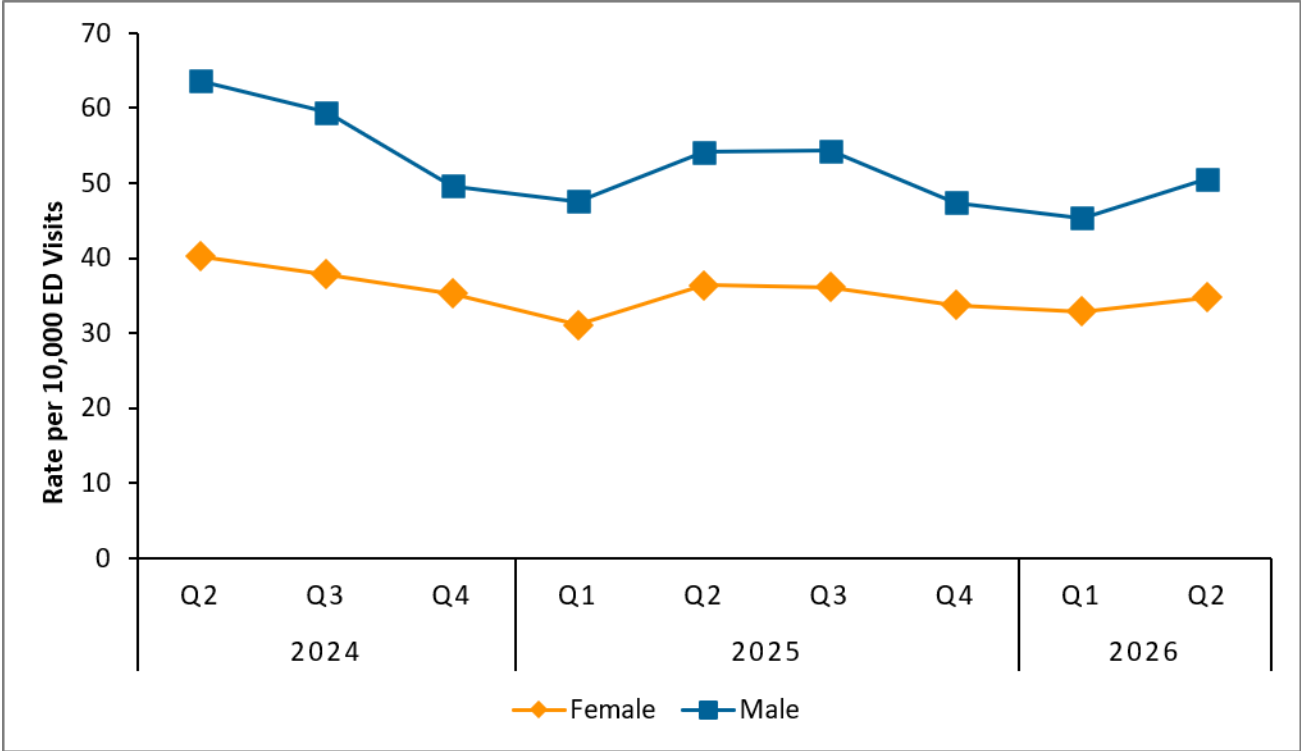

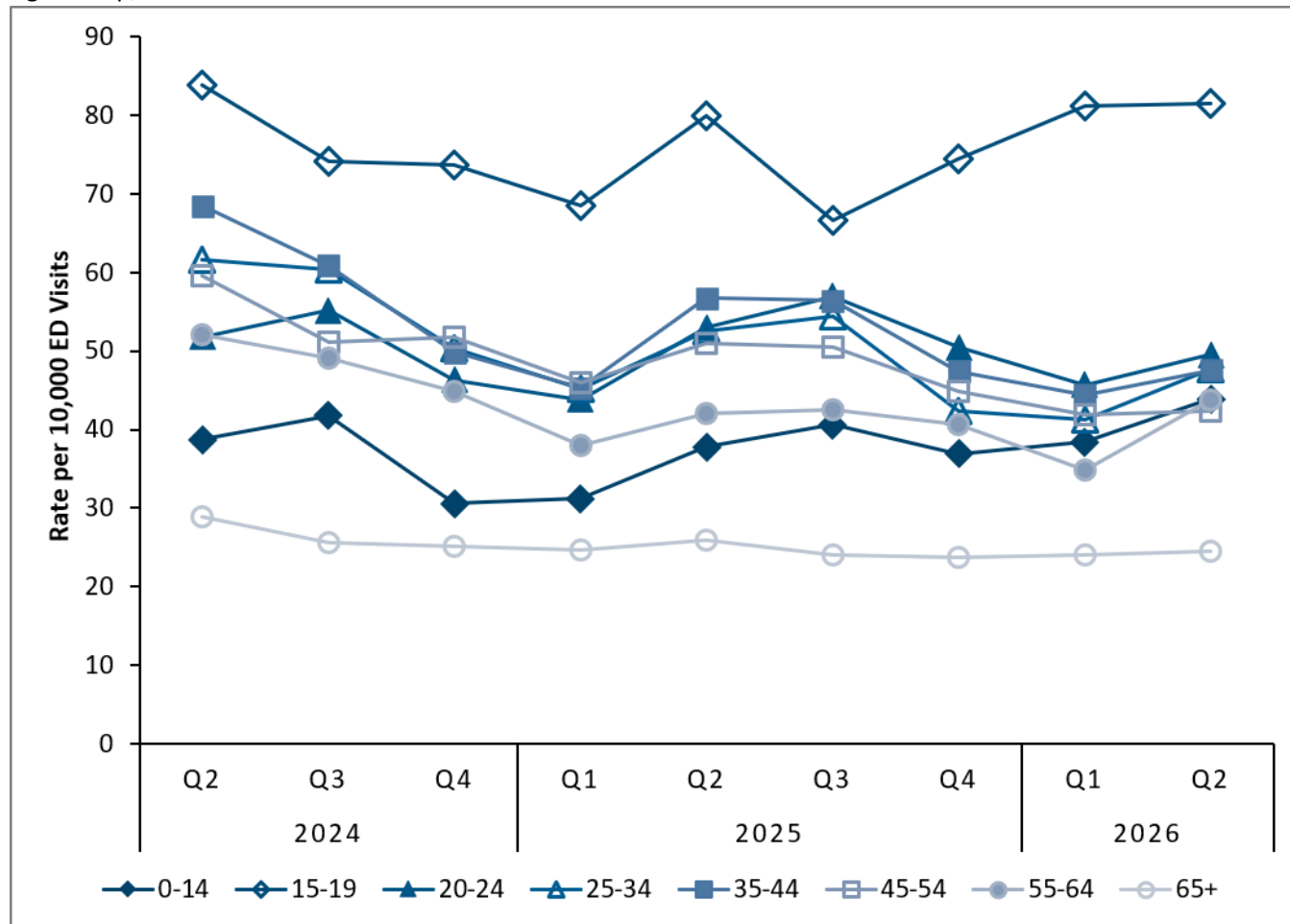

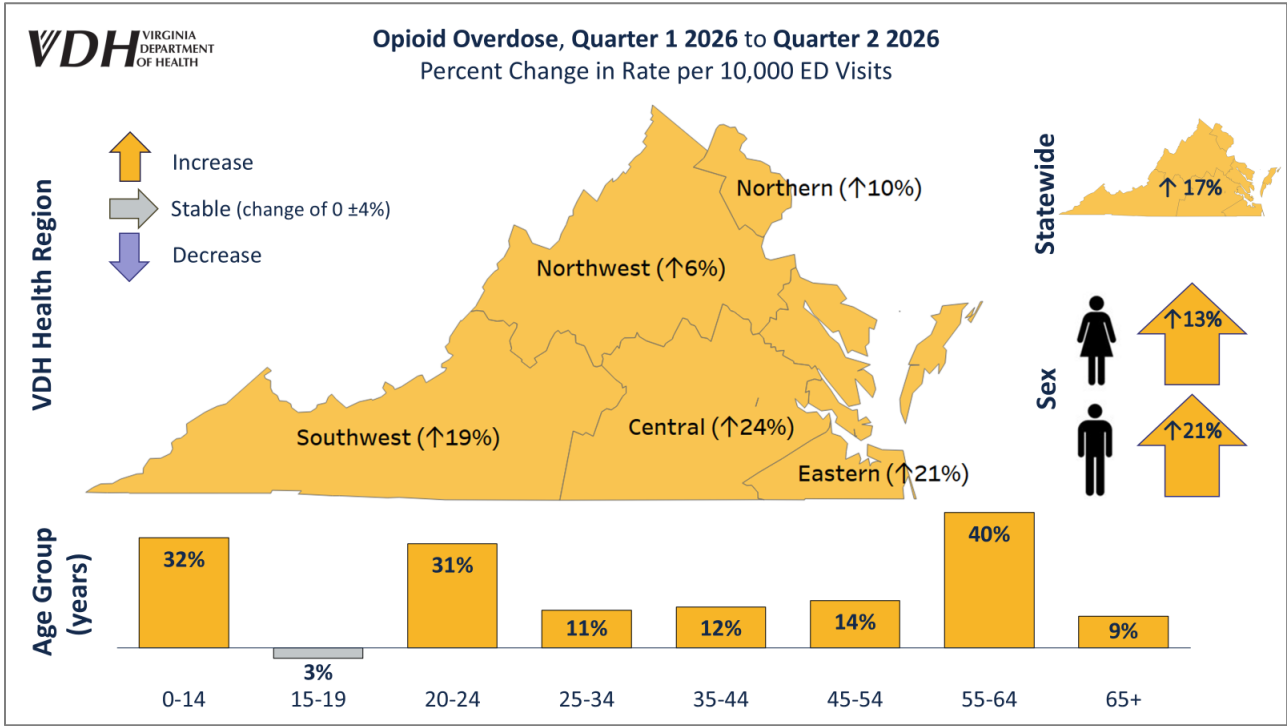

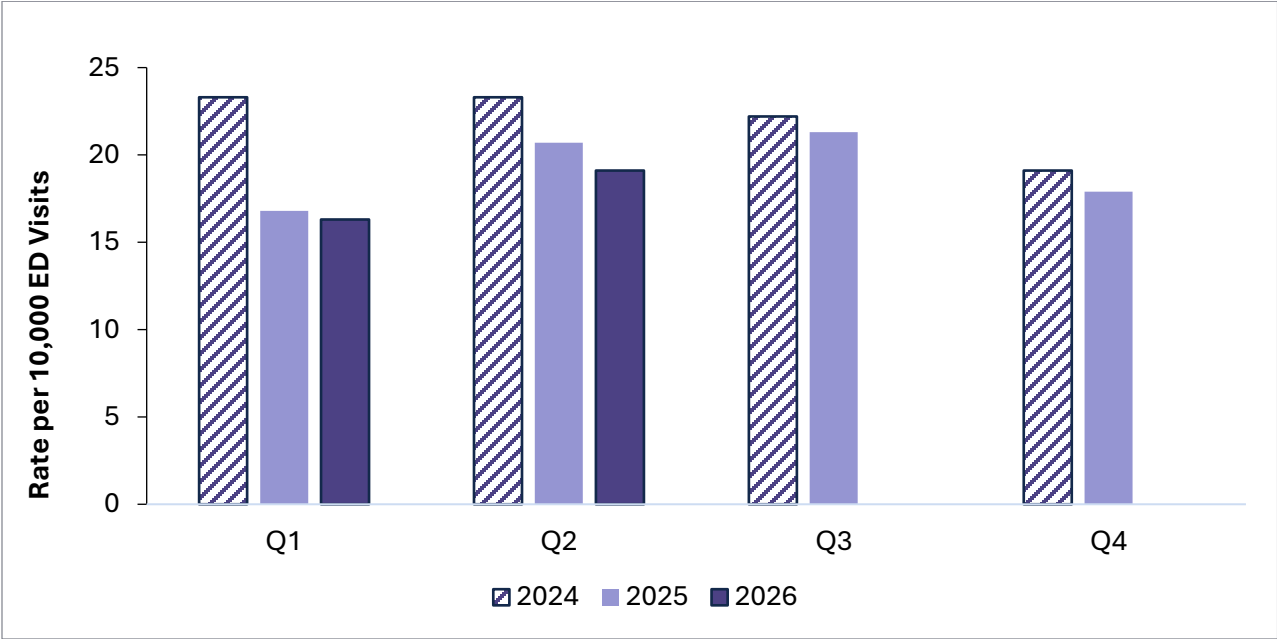

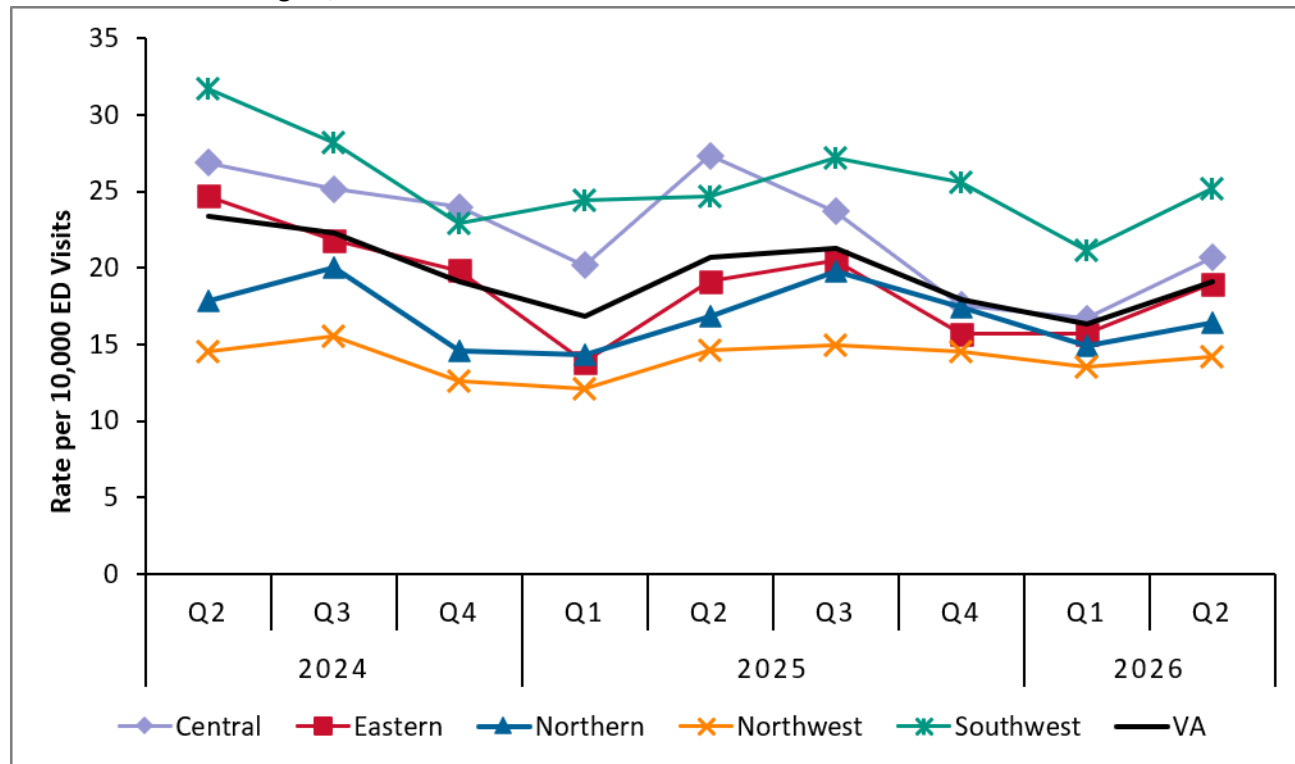

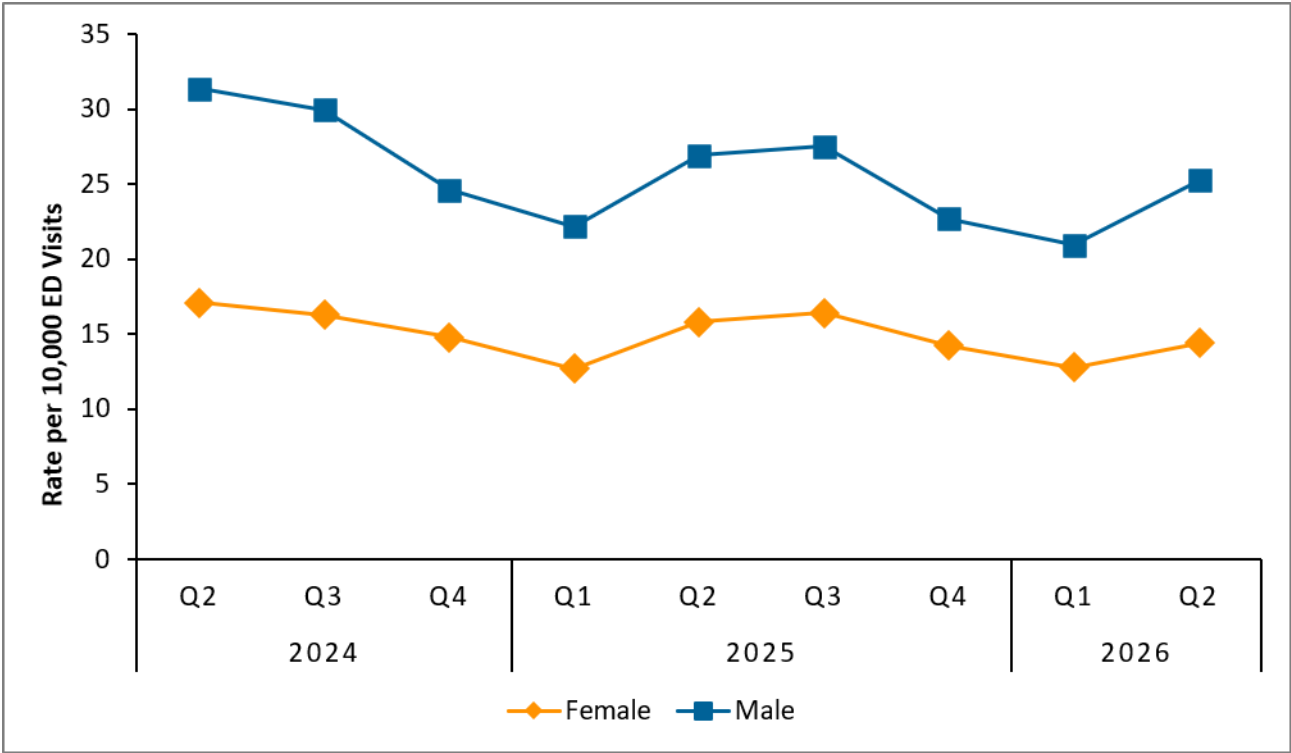

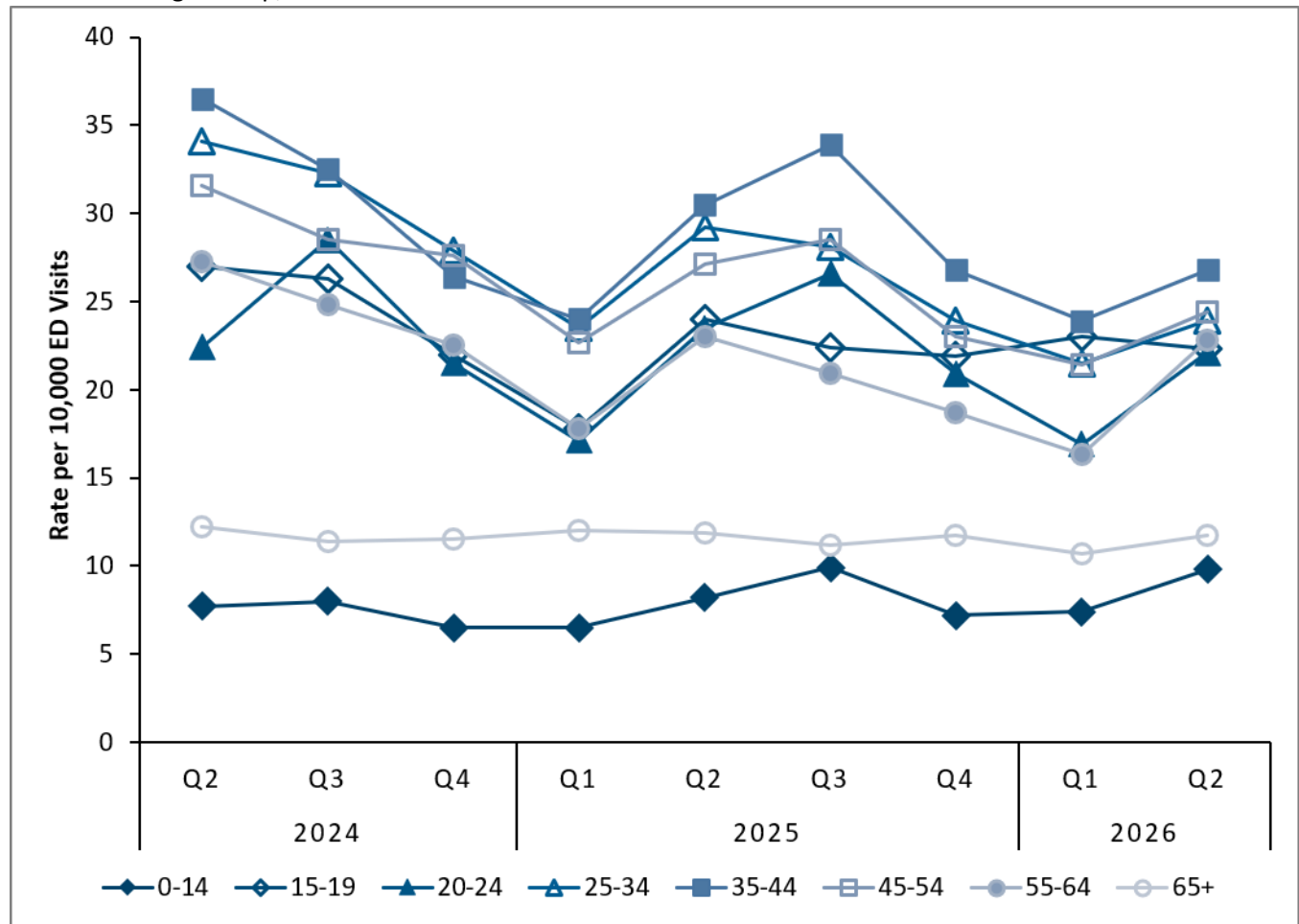

Figure 12. Heroin Overdose Visit Rate per 10,000 ED Visits Among Virginia Residents by Calendar Quarter, 2024 to 2026.

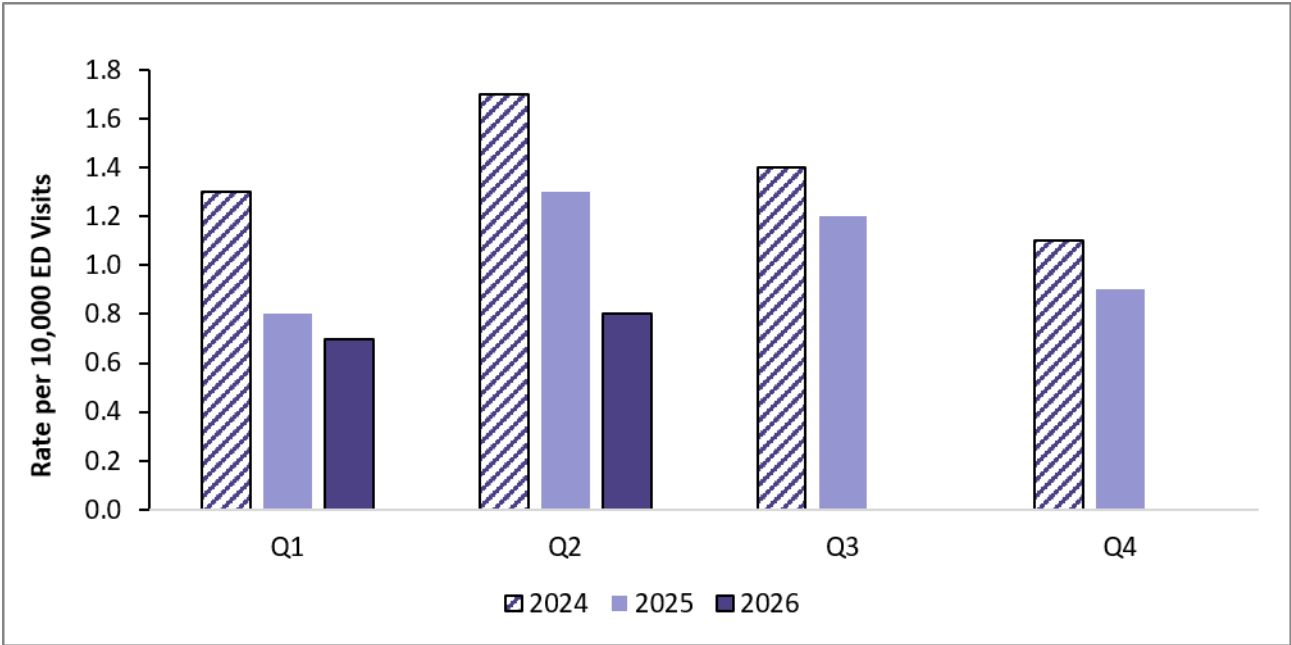

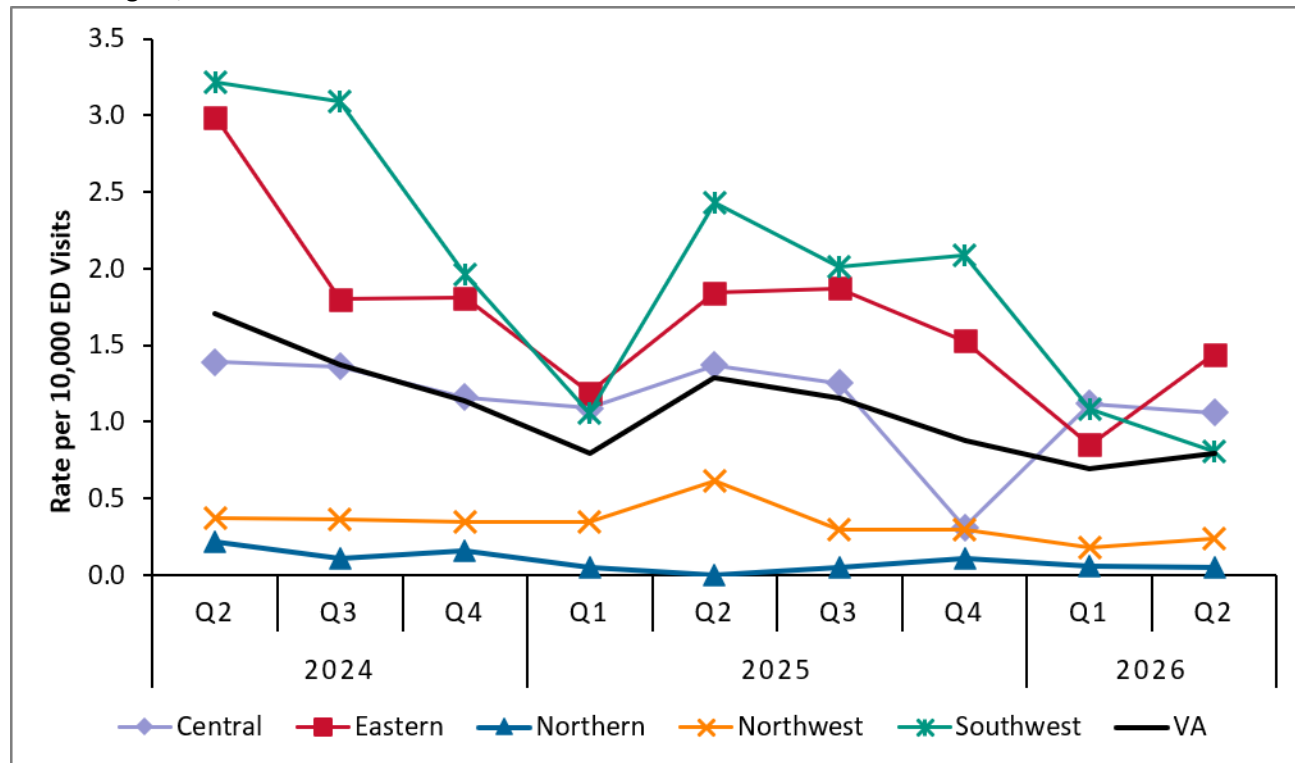

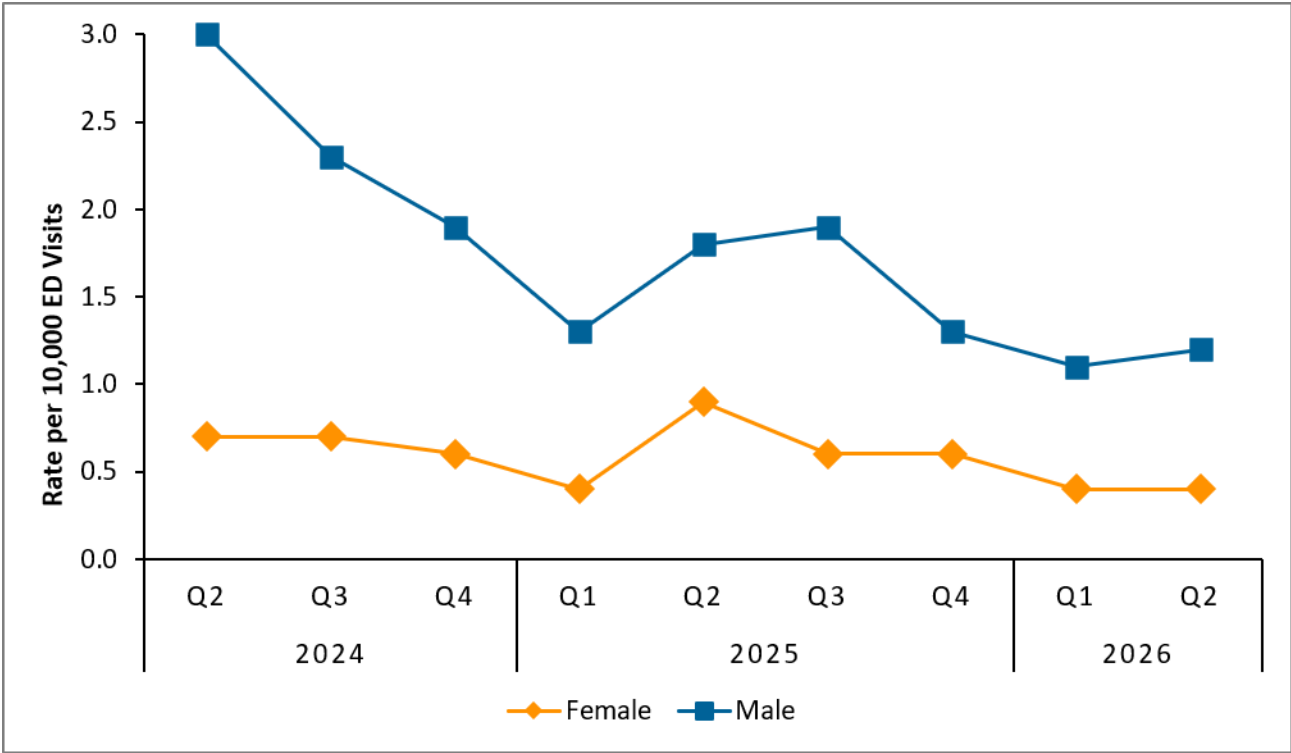

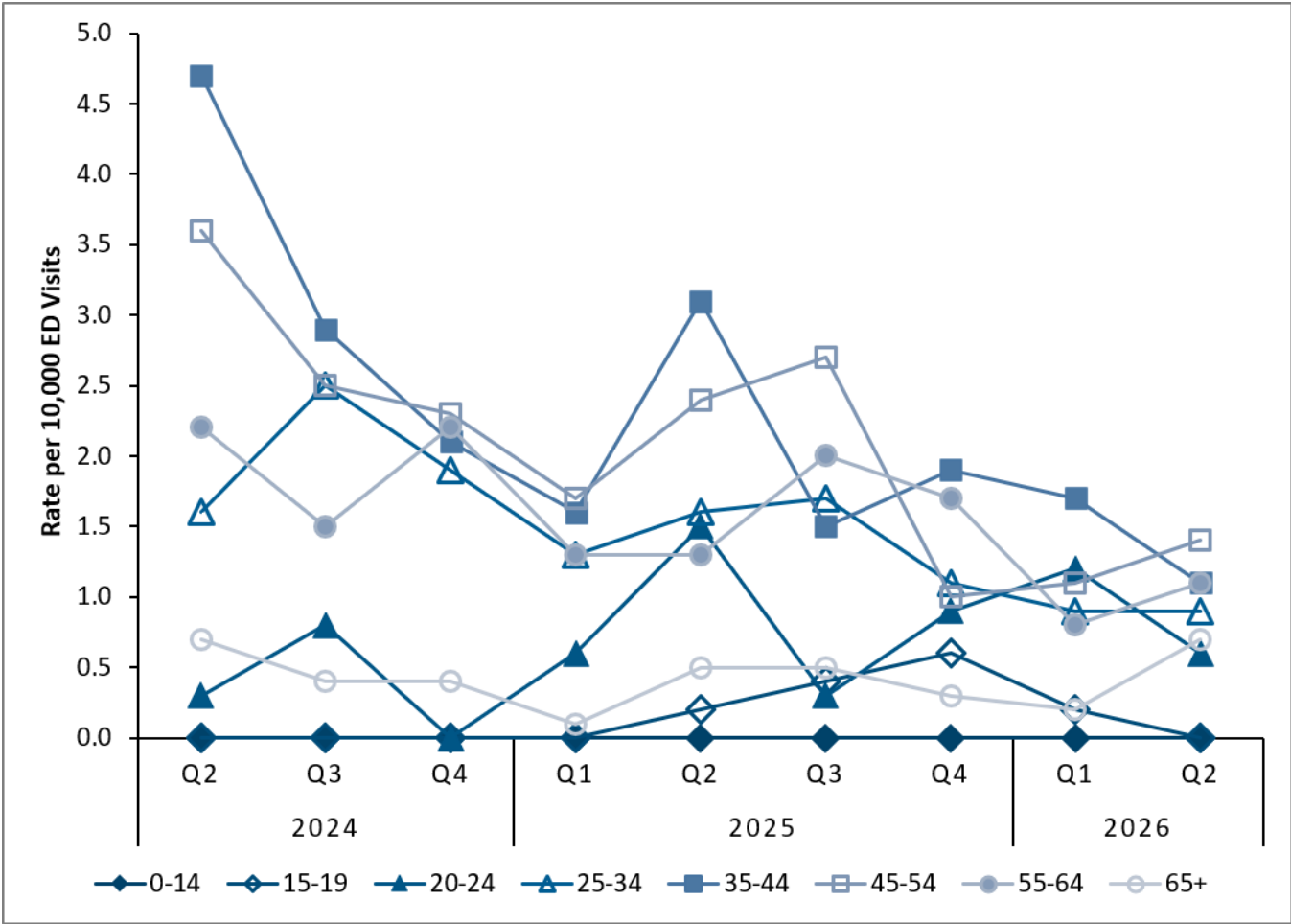

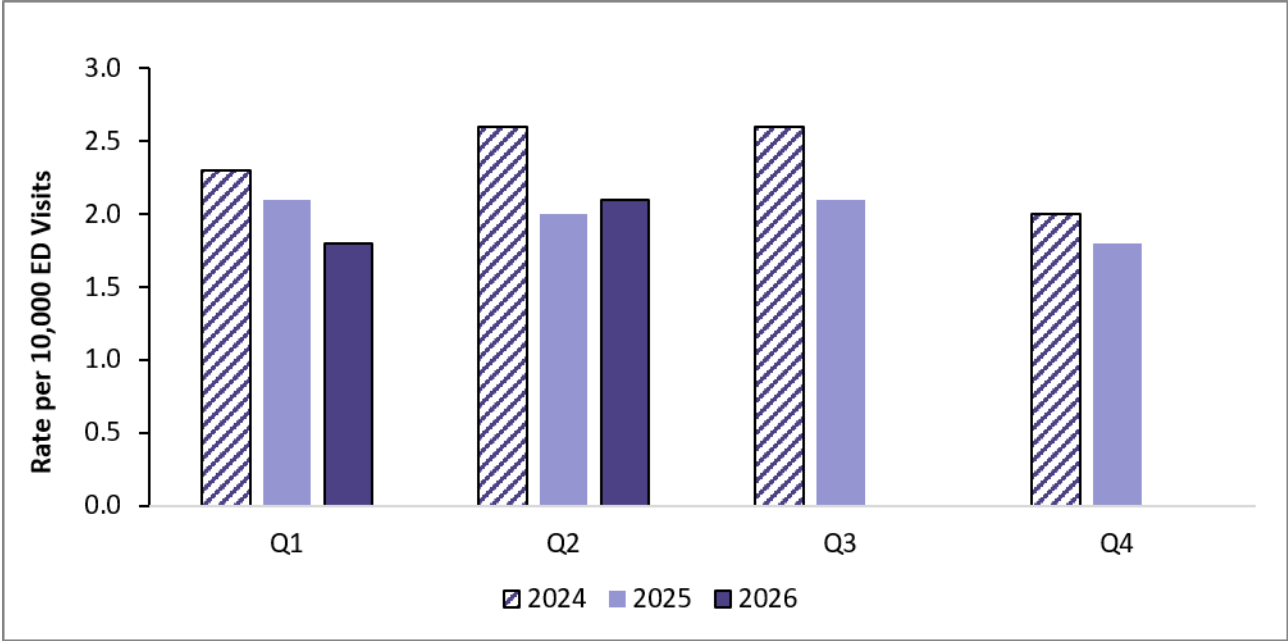

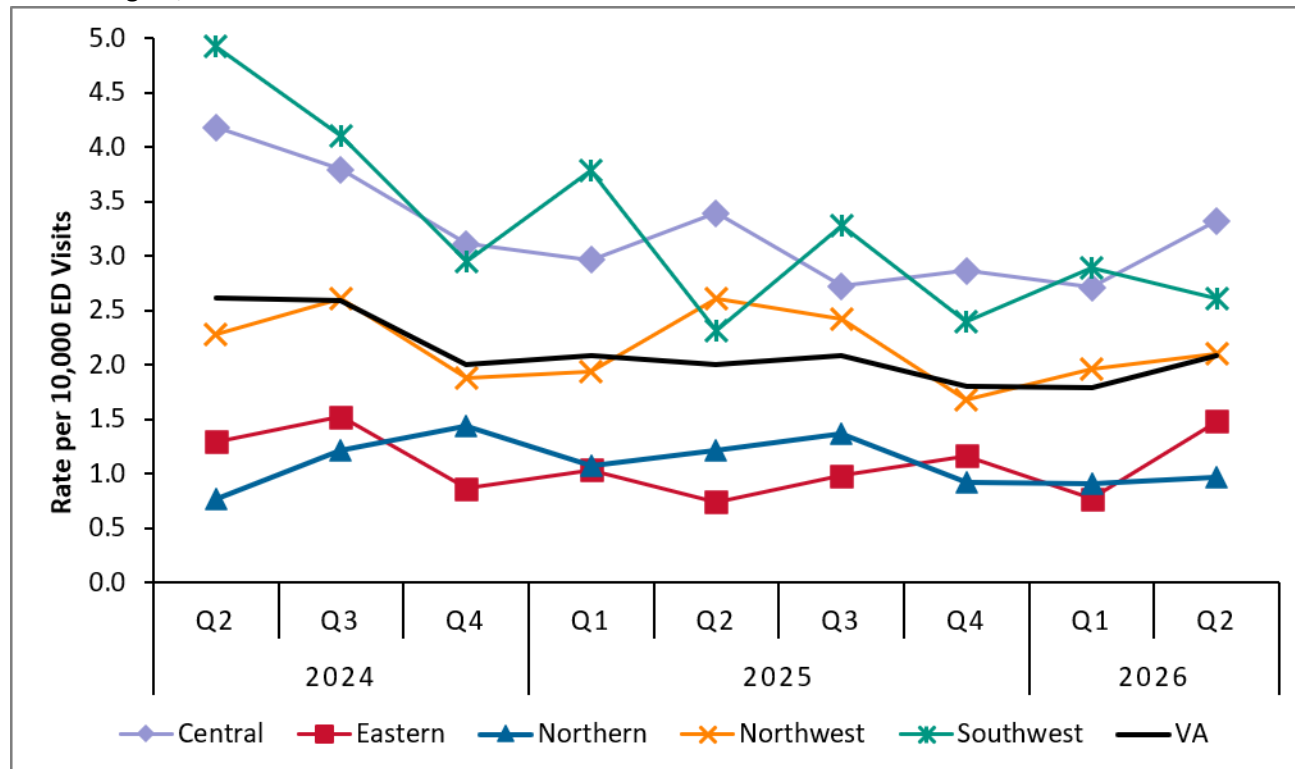

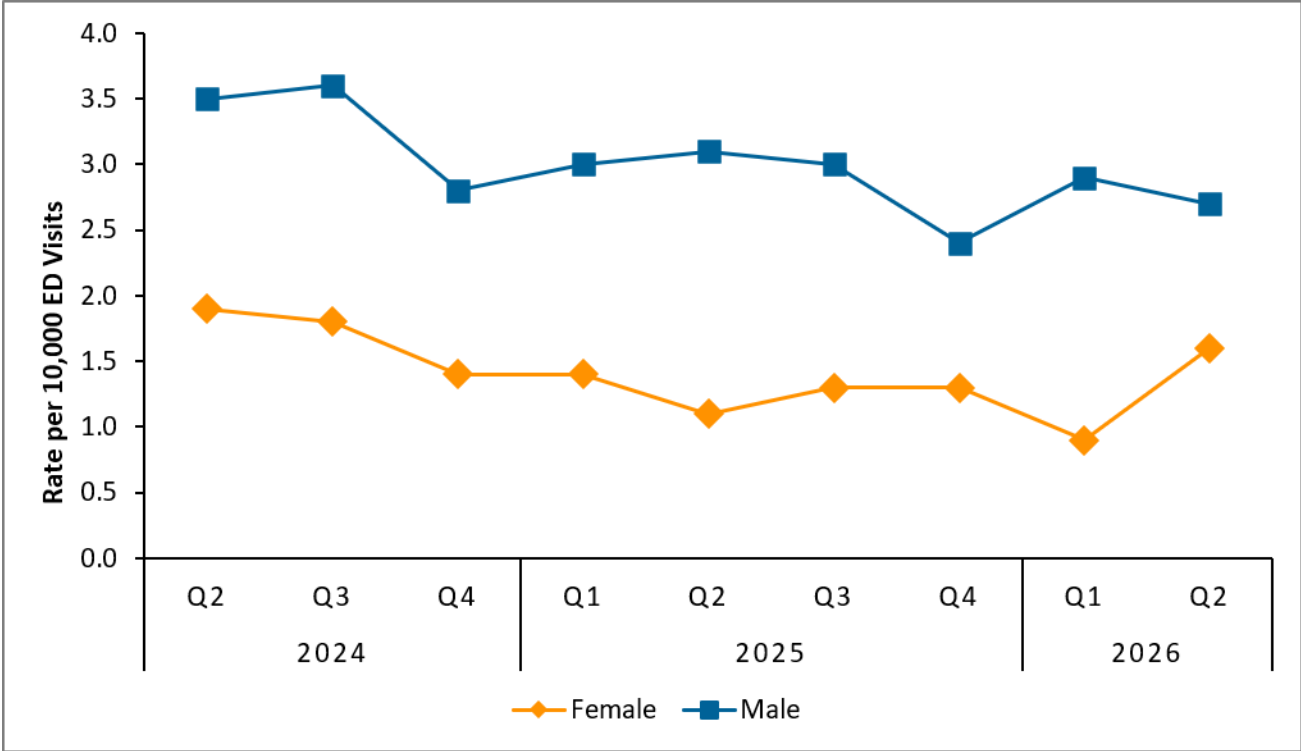

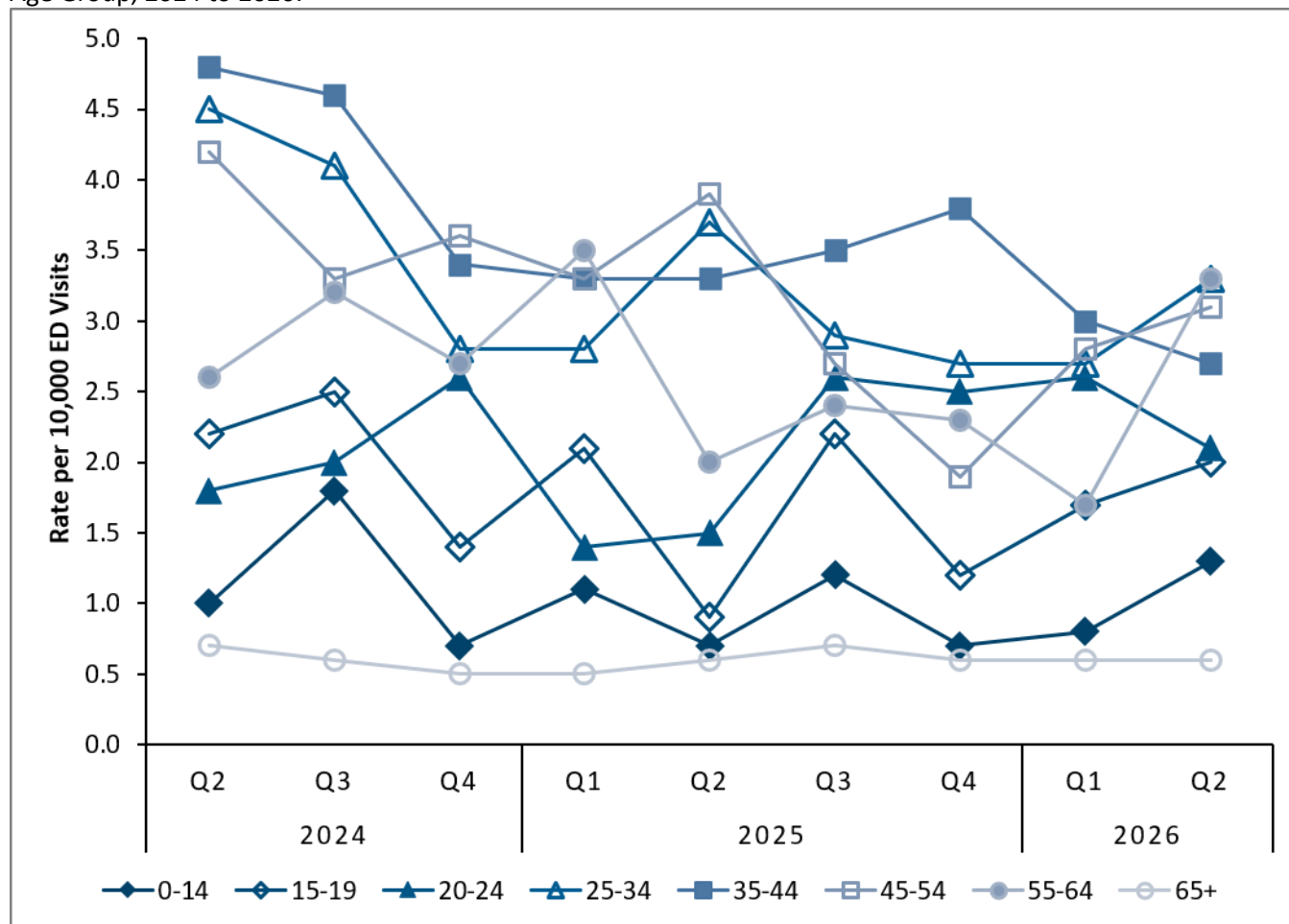
