





Campaign Work in Progress

Since the 2019 Virginia Stroke Improvement Report was published by the Virginia Department of Health, regional EMS councils across the state, including Northern Virginia, Central Shenandoah and the Tidewater, have adopted prehospital protocols to effectively triage and transport stroke patients with a suspected large vessel occlusion directly to Level 1 stroke centers. Get Ahead of Stroke provided recommendations that were included in the Virginia Department of Health's 2019 report, which offered guidance to the state's regional EMS councils in updating their respective stroke triage plans.



Wider Coverage Needed for Mechanical Thrombectomy



CURRENTLY:

- Dark Purple within 30 min of CSC / TCS
- Light Purple within 60 mins CSC / TCS

POSSIBLE SOLUTION:

- Dark Green within 30 minutes if a PSC were converted to CSCs / TCS
- Light Green within 60 minutes if a PSC were converted to CSCs /


1 in 6 US stroke patients lacks access to MT even via hospital transfer

Addressing Large Vessel Occlusions Saves Lives & Decreases Disability

- LVOs account for approximately 20 to 46% of all ischemic strokes
 - Nationally ~795,000 strokes
 - ~691,650 Ischemic Strokes
 - ~138,330 to 262,827 LVOs
- Thrombolytics are only effective in approximately 13% of LVO strokes
- LVOs are responsible for 90% of Acute Ischemic Stroke deaths
- LVOs are responsible for 60% of all post-stroke dependency



CORAZON

Virginia Thrombectomy

- 2022 VA Stroke Volume 20,880
- ~ 85% Ischemic = 17,748
- LVO rate in the range 20 46%
- Corazon Experience = ~20 28%
- Using the conservative 20% = ~ 3,550
- Research shows typically 2/3 are anterior and 1/3 posterior
- ISC 2023 was first push to expand the pool to include posterior LVOs
- Using the 2/3 anterior would expect approximately 2,378 thrombectomies
- Actual thrombectomies in Virginia in 2022 = 1526



- Stroke without tPA = DRGs 64-66



OPPORTUNITY TO EXPAND ACCESS TO THROMBECTOMY

Potential Opportunities

- Rely on Publicly reported data which is not 100% reliable
- Carillion Roanoke listed as Primary Stroke on state list but actually Thrombectomy Capable certified
- Winchester & Centra Lynchburg both Primary but show thrombectomy volume
- Sovah Health Danville & VCU Community both appear to have significant travel to get patients to thrombectomy but may not have enough volume to support thrombectomy
- Advancement of Bon Secours Southside could provide better option for VCU Community
- Mary Washington may have enough volume to support





Baptist Medical Center South Case Study



- 463-bed, not-for-profit hospital serving Montgomery, AL, and 19 surrounding counties
- Flagship for a 3-hospital system
- JC Accredited Primary Stroke Program

- In 2016, Developed a comprehensive plan for a full neuroscience program, including detailed market analysis, target volume projections with associated projected financial returns, physician manpower needs assessment, and an operational implementation plan
- Identified opportunities in stroke, intracranial surgery, and complex spinal procedures
 - Required recruitment of a talented neurosurgeon with an interest in intracranial and minimally invasive spine
 - Development and delivery of a comprehensive education plan to elevate staff knowledge and competency in the care of complex neurosurgery patients
 - Developed and implemented a physician co-management agreement to align hospital and surgeon goals along with the development of a formal process for implant selection
 - Placement of an experienced neuro CNS to lead Stroke recertification while mentoring the newly-appointed stroke coordinator



Baptist Medical Center South Case Study

- 2019 Completed gap assessment for the expansion of stroke services with the goal of achieving Comprehensive Stroke designation
- Started with recruitment of a neurointerventionalist with a projected start date in August 2020
- BMCS began planning for an expansion of Interventional Radiology to include a new bi-plane suite with projected completion in August 2020
- In May 2020, we kicked off the Thrombectomy Implementation despite COVID and the Stroke Coordinator position being vacant
- Corazon supplied an Interim Stroke Coordinator while recruiting a new Stroke Program Manager





Baptist Medical Center Thrombectomy Implementation

- Thrombectomy Program Development May through November 2020
 - Created the necessary Policies & Procedures
 - Redesigned the Acute ED and Inpatient Stroke Algorithms to incorporate best practice changes for thrombolytic administration and a parallel track for LVO identification and treatment
 - Built the necessary order sets and documentation templates for neuro-intervention and post-procedural care
 - Physicians were active participants in the clinical program development
 - Designed a marketing and outreach plan to educate outlying facilities about endovascular capabilities now available



- October & early November 2020 Delivered formal didactic neuro-intervention education for the ED staff, the ICU staff, the Acute Care nursing staff, the procedural staff, and the local EMS providers while Dr. Balasetti provided the technical training for the procedural lab staff
- Dry Runs complete 11/19 & 12/10 for staff preparedness
- The new Stroke Program Manager started just prior to the Program go-live in December 2020 with the first mechanical thrombectomy on December 17th







