WHAT IS THE DWSRF?

The 1996 Amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) created the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program. The DWSRF helps communities finance the costs necessary to ensure compliance with national drinking water standards, protect public health, and replace aging infrastucture.

HOW DOES THE DWSRF OPERATE?

The Virginia Department of Health (VDH) administers and manages the program in partnership with Virginia Resources Authority (VRA). VDH determines the eligibility of projects, and VRA oversees the financial aspects of the program.
