
Smith Mountain Lake – Blackwater River - Harmful Algal Bloom (HAB) Status Report

Issued: Thursday 6/22/2023

Next Issue: week of 7/10/2023 (weather dependent)



Investigations at four locations on the Blackwater River arm of Smith Mountain Lake (Blackwater River B48, The Cliffs B28, Kemp Ford/Kilawatt Cove B24, Virginia Key B21) collected 6/13/23 had unsafe levels of algae and are under a swimming advisory. One site which had unsafe levels of algae on 6/1/23 (Anthony Ford Landing) contained acceptable levels on 6/13/23, however, one more sample with acceptable levels is necessary to lift the advisory at that site; it remains under advisory. Two acceptable samples taken at least 10 days apart are required to lift advisories. Due to the unpredictable nature of blooms in this waterbody, the advisory remains in effect for those sites where algae concentrations were at acceptable levels (green dots). Boating, fishing and other low contact activities may continue with proper caution. There is no evidence of impacts to drinking water at this time.
