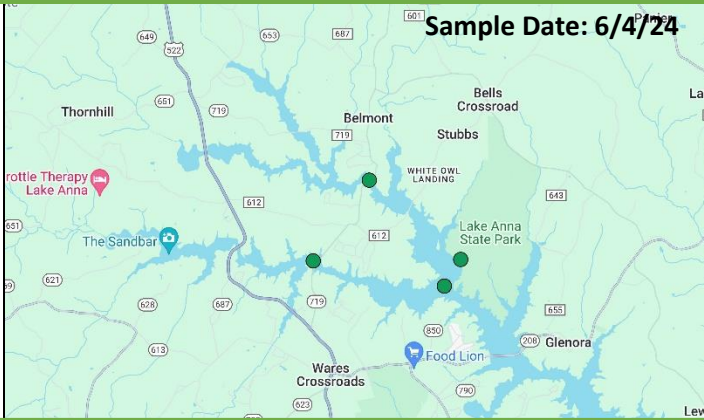


Lake Anna - Status Report – No HABs at this time

Monitoring at 3 sites by boat in Lake Anna above Rt. 208 and 1 site at the State Park beach occurred on 6/4/2024. All results indicated cyanobacteria and toxins were below advisory levels. The HAB map and this status report have been updated and are posted at www.SwimHealthyVa.com. The next sample event is anticipated on or about July 16th (weather dependent).

I DIDN'T KNOW THAT! Harmful Algal Blooms

Some species of algae are toxic to humans, pets, wildlife, and the environment. When these algae bloom, it's called a **harmful algal bloom (HAB)**.

When in doubt, stay out!

Sunny days, warm water, and increased nutrients are the perfect recipe to grow algae. HABs can occur in freshwater or saltwater.

- Avoid contact with algae.
- Wash with soap and clean water if you come in contact.
- Don't eat fish or shellfish from the water.
- Don't let pets drink the water or eat algal mats.
- Do not drink. Boiling or filtering this water will not make this water safe.
- Contact your physician or veterinarian if you or your pet have unexplained illness.
