PATIENT INFORMATION: PAXLOVID



PAXLOVID may prevent hospitalization or death in adults who are at high risk for severe illness from COVID-19. It must be taken within 5 days of when COVID-19 symptoms start.

What is PAXLOVID?

PAXLOVID is a new medicine used to treat mild-to moderate COVID-19 in people who:

- Are 12 years of age and older, weighing at least 88 pounds
- Have a positive test result for COVID-19 viral test
- Are at high risk for severe COVID-19 including hospitalization and death

PAXLOVID is a medicine that is taken by mouth (by swallowing pills) for 5 days. The course of treatment should be completed, regardless of resolution of symptoms

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has issued an Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) to make **PAXLOVID** available during the COVID-19 pandemic. PAXLOVID is not an FDA-approved medicine in the United States.



Tell your healthcare provider if you:

- → have any allergies
- → Have kidney or liver disease
- → are pregnant, may become pregnant
- → are breastfeeding a child
- have any serious illnesses
- are taking any medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, or herbal products)
- If you are taking combined hormonal contraceptives (PAXLOVID may affect how your birth control pills work)

Does PAXLOVID have side effects?

- ▶ PAXLOVID may interact with other medicines you are taking. It is important to tell your doctor about all of your current medications.
- PAXLOVID may cause liver problems.
- ▶ PAXLOVID may cause resistance to HIV medicines.
- Other possible side effects include:
 - > Altered sense of taste
 - > Diarrhea
 - > High blood pressure
 - > Muscle aches
