



Virginia Long-Term CareTask Force Monthly Updates

COVID-19 Burden in Virginia LTCFs:

There were 72 LTCF COVID-19 outbreaks reported in the past 30 days (as of 12/01/2022). This is a slight increase compared to the number of outbreaks reported (87) in the previous month (10/01 - 10/31). The number of reported nursing home resident and staff have been consistent for the past several months.

Regulatory Updates for Nursing Homes:

On 10/26/2022, CMS published a revised <u>State Operations Manual Appendix PP - Guidance to Surveyors for Long-Term Care Facilities</u>. Numerous sections related to infection prevention and control were updated including F880 (Requirements for the facility's infection prevention and control program) and F882 (Designating a qualified individual who is responsible for the infection prevention and control program; education requirements for this individual).

How to Develop a Respiratory Protection Program:

There is a new resource to help you develop a respiratory protection program (RPP). The goal of an RPP is to prevent the spread of small aerosol germs or particles that can cause disease. Most places that provide healthcare services are required to have an RPP. You should develop your RPP to meet the needs in your facility.

Enhanced Barrier Precaution Webinar Resources:

On 11/16/2022, the VDH HAI/AR Program held a webinar for nursing homes on enhanced barrier precautions. COVID-19 Variants, Subvariants, and Drug Activity:

On November 30,2022 the <u>FDA Announced Bebtelovimab is Not Currently Authorized in Any U.S.</u> <u>Region</u> and is not currently authorized for emergency use. The drug is being pulled because it is not expected to neutralize Omicron variants BQ.1 and BQ.1.1. All authorized distributors have paused commercial distribution until further notice.

COVID-19 Updates:

- CDC recently published additional COVID-19 guidance for <u>community congregate living</u> <u>settings</u> (e.g., group homes, assisted living facilities). Healthcare services delivered in these settings should be informed by <u>CDC's Infection Prevention and Control Recommendations</u>.

LeadingAge Virginia Launches Infection Control Initiative for Virginia's Adult Day Centers
LeadingAge Virginia was recently awarded funding to develop infection prevention and control
policies for all licensed adult day centers across the state. The initiative is supported by the Centers for
Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) through the Virginia Department of Health.

In partnership with Health Quality Innovators (HQI), LeadingAge Virginia will focus on the following initiative goals:

- Develop model policies in accordance with state regulations and requirements
- Provide a program of policies that can be easily adopted and decrease the risk of infections
- Support implementation of the policies
- Provide opportunities for peer-to-peer learning and collaboration
