The first case of novel coronavirus (SARS-CoV-2, now known as “COVID-19”) was first reported in Virginia and the Blue Ridge Health District in March of 2020. Since then, over 43,400 individuals in our District have been infected and sadly we have lost over 400 local community members to COVID-19.



How can I continue to protect myself against COVID-19?

- Know the facts! Stay up to date with the latest, accurate information. COVID-19 has evolved over the past two years and we will continue to learn more about the virus and its variants as more research is done.
