What is MAPP2Health (Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships)?

MAPP2Health is the 2016 community health assessment and improvement plan for the Thomas Jefferson Health District (TJHD). The District includes the City of Charlottesville and Albemarle, Fluvanna, Greene, Louisa, and Nelson Counties. The plan calls organizations and individuals to action to help improve our community's health.

What are the results of the 2016 MAPP2Health?

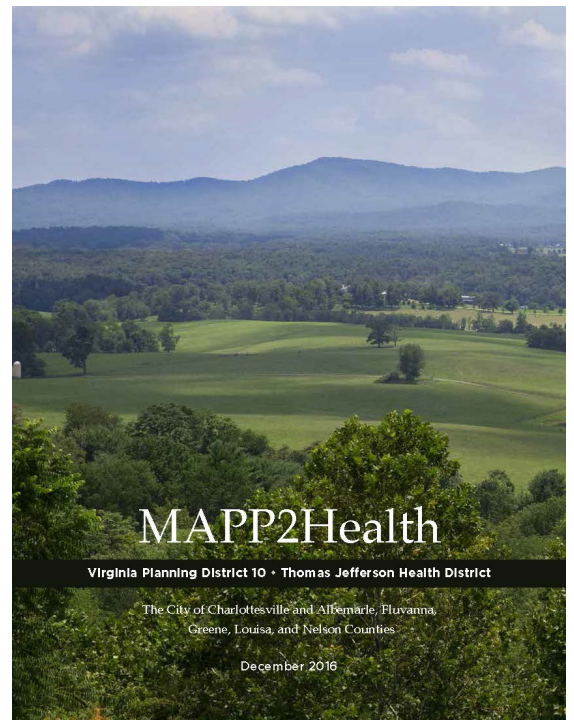
Over the last year, 105 community partners and 10 community coalitions came together to review data on the health of our community, including the survey results from 2,855 area residents. The following four health priorities were identified, each of which includes a goal, objectives and local strategies:

1. Promote healthy eating and active living
2. Address mental health and substance use
3. Improve health disparities and access to care
4. Foster a healthy and connected community

What are the next steps?
