STEMI Project – Joseph P. Ornato, M.D., Chairman Department of Emergency Medicine, VCU Medical Center	Dr. Ornato gave a presentation regarding the STEMI Project. Dr. Ornato gave some history on the ST Elevation MI heart attack; and informed the Board that an emerging trend in EMS has states trying to organize systems for caring for ST Elevation MI heart attack victims in a manner similar to the trauma care systems now in place in most states. North Carolina is already organizing to put in place a statewide plan for helping the EMS community get the right patient to the right institution at the right time; and helping the institutions partner with each other to make timely transfers.	The Office of EMS is researching information provided by Dr. Ornato. Mr. Brown pointed out that this is a system issue and not an Office of EMS alone decision. Any decision would have to be discussed with the Medical Direction Committee and the Advisory Board, as well as talking with both Drs. Kaplowitz and Stroube. Resource allocation issues would have to be discussed and resolved, as well.
Study of Regional Councils – Kevin K. McGinnis, MPS, EMT-P	Mr. Brown introduced Kevin McGinnis and gave the Board a brief bio of Mr. McGinnis. Mr. McGinnis is representing ASMI (Association of Society Management International) and told the Board that ASMI has a core group within ASMI that are EMS system planners, people who have always put the system of EMS first. Mr. McGinnis explained that ASMI supports National Association of State EMS Officials and a lot of other related entities. Mr. McGinnis gave an overview of the project scope and what they will be reviewing: 1. Functions that are currently or could potentially be done to support the local EMS systems that are now done on a regional basis. 2. The advantages and disadvantages of doing the functions in a couple of different ways: a. the way that it is currently being done – through the regional council structure b. the potential of doing functions through a state affiliated OEMS structure 3. cost related with the current system as a part of its performance history 4. contracts between the state and the regions 5. reports of how the deliverables were delivered over the past few years 6. survey individuals served by the regions a. determine how well they feel they are being served b. are there alternative ways that they can be served 7. history of previous evaluations and discussions on this subject 8. current literature and organization structure of EMS including the recent Institute of Medicine report 9. Rural/Frontier EMS Agenda for the Future 10. Review other statewide models that exist	Mr. McGinnis passed around a sign up sheet for councils and other interested individuals to schedule a time for an in-person interview.

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	 Review other ways that regions in the state might be configured, in terms of the number and types of regions and their borders. Approach: Document review looking at all the records, including financial records of the regions and the financial state of the Office of EMS. Survey of leaders and providers. Individuals will be receiving a letter of invitation to complete a web-based survey A sample of providers, approximately 5,000, will be invited to answer the survey. Phone and in-person interviews will be conducted. Schedule: Most of the interviews will be conducted in the month of March. The study should be finished in May 2007 and a project report should be provided. 	
2007 Department of Homeland Security Grants – Amanda Davis	Ms. Davis gave a brief background on the Department of Homeland Security Grants. Ms. Davis explained that last year Virginia got about \$16.8 million dollars from the Department of Homeland Security Grants; but none of those dollars came to EMS. In an effort to secure funding this year, approximately 18 EMS representatives took part in a stakeholders meeting on January 29-30. Paul Sharpe explained more about the EMS Trauma Registry. OEMS has been working on a project to replace the PPCR. If they obtain the Homeland Security Grant it will enable OEMS to make this a system wide system to track more information. It is a 36 month grant; but once EMS is approved for the initial investment, it is very likely that they will continue to get funding. OEMS should know by July if they are getting funded; and they should receive the funds by September. All monies are being allocated through the Department of Emergency Management; and thus the funding would come from the Department of Emergency Management.	EMS decided to ask for: \$1.5 million dollars for an EMS Registry that will link things such as Patient Care, assess the quality of care; illnesses and trends in illnesses.
