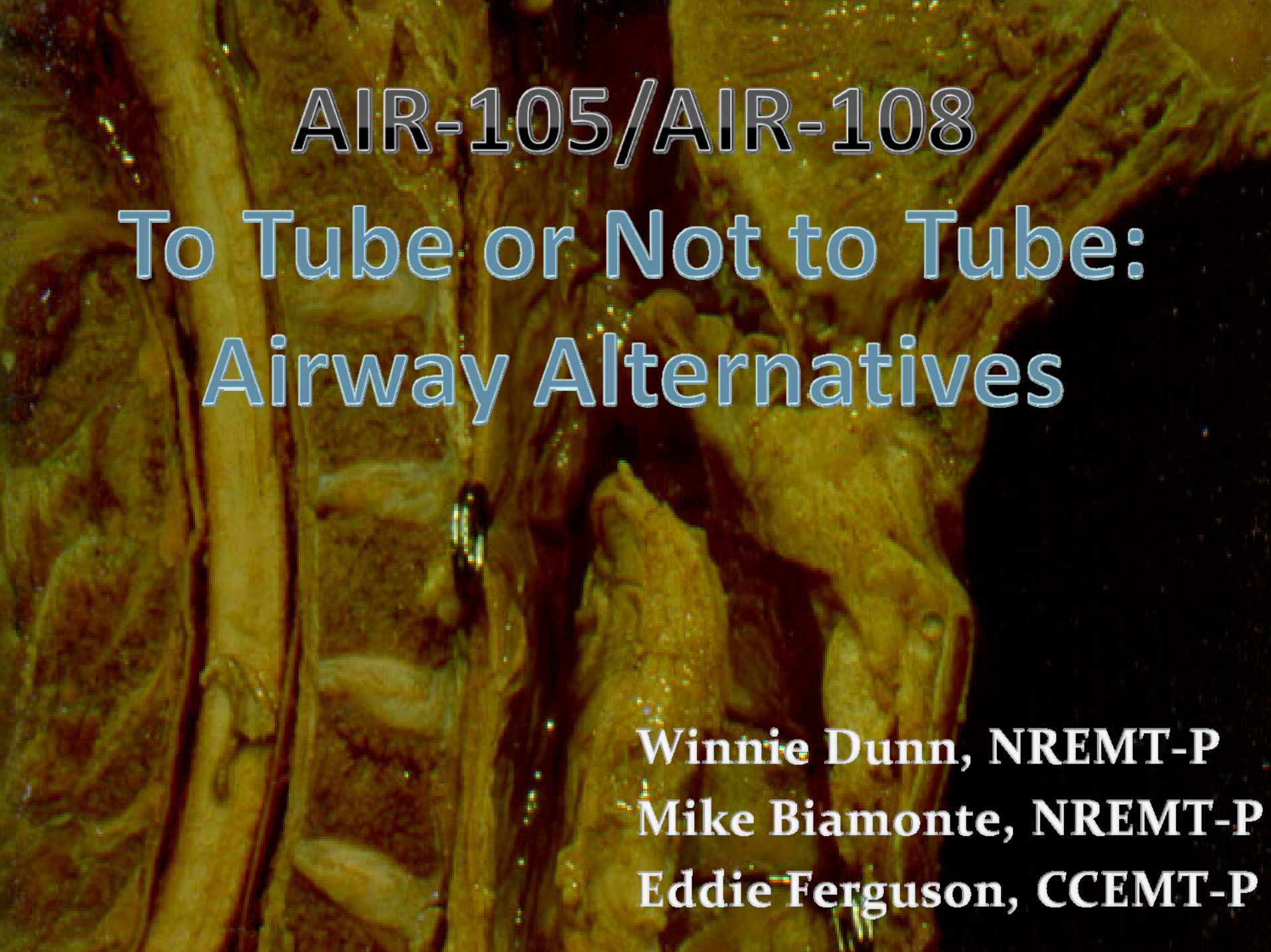

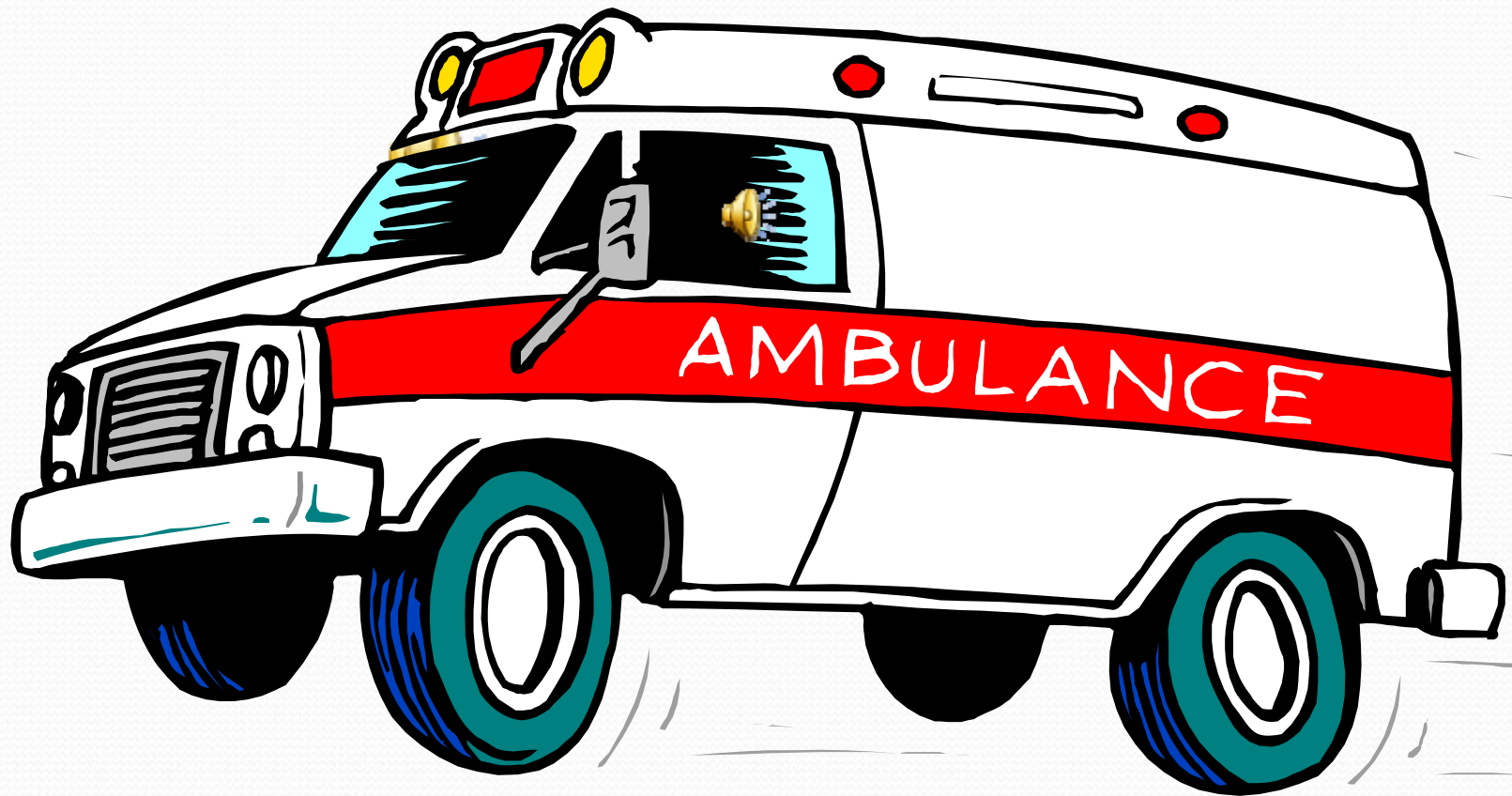
Objectives
