

# TRAUMA CENTER SITE REVIEW

## DOCUMENT RESOURCE GUIDE

The following is a checklist of documentation that needs to be available to a trauma center designation site review team. This document is a resource to help designated trauma centers prepare for a trauma site review and is designed to follow the current Trauma Center Designation Manual. Site review team members may ask for additional items to be made available in advance or during a review. Likewise, individual trauma centers may have single documents that satisfy more than one criterion.

Evidence of physician board certifications, continuing medical education, and Advanced Trauma Life Support certification must be in a form that can be validated; attestations and tracking sheets are not accepted as evidence. Evidence of nursing trauma education hours and certifications should be available upon request. Nursing education may be maintained on individual nursing units, but must be available for review during the site review.
