Dear Educator,

With the 2019 Virginia EMS Symposium now in the rearview mirror, we are starting to look forward to the 41st Virginia EMS Symposium as well as the spring semester. Here are a couple of updates for you.

2020 Virginia EMS Symposium Call for Presentations

The 41st Annual Virginia EMS Symposium, scheduled for November 10 – 15, 2020, is one of the nation's premier educational opportunities for EMS providers and Registered Nurses to obtain continuing education and network. Each year, more than 1500 registrants choose from 360 different programs over the 5-day event. National and local educators participate to make this event one of the top pre-hospital educational opportunities in the country. The Symposium has 12 tracks covering Airway, Respiration, Ventilation, Cardiac, Critical Incident Stress Management, Communications, Critical Care, Educator, Leadership & Management, Medical, Operations, Preconference, Safety, Special Considerations and Trauma. Sessions generally run 1 hour. Pre-convention sessions vary in length from 3 hours up to a total of 24 hours.

The Symposium Call for Presentation Web Portal allows you to submit proposals for the annual Virginia EMS Symposium. Once you set up your account, you will be able use this portal to submit and keep track of the status of your proposals as well as review, update and submit previous submissions. You can even start a proposal and save it to finish later if necessary. Once your proposal is submitted, it will be reviewed by the EMS Symposium Committee. If selected, you will be notified by a member of the Virginia Office of EMS.

CE Scanner Application Version 4.0

Yesterday, the Office of Information Technology released an update to the CE Scanner Application. If you are connected to a live internet connection when you open the CE Scanner Application, you will be prompted to download and install the latest update.

Only minor fixes were implemented, so there should be no change in the look and feel of the application to which you have become accustom.

Please make sure you update your CE Scanner Application to the latest version as soon as possible.

Education Coordinator Candidate Teaching Hour Requirements

Recent investigations conducted by the Division of Regulation and Compliance have turned up several issues surrounding the Education Coordinator Candidate program. As a reminder, anyone serving as a Mentor in this process shall:

A. Assure the Education Coordinator Candidate has the knowledge, skills and abilities to teach.

- B. Provide guidance for educational delivery of material.
 - a. The Education Coordinator Candidate must teach all assigned "teaching hours" under the direct supervision of their mentor or a certified Education Coordinator approved by the Candidate's mentor.
 - Candidates are not permitted to gain "teaching hours" if their Mentor or a Mentor approved EC is NOT present in the classroom during their teaching time.
 - c. Candidates SHALL NOT be allowed to earn teaching hours from an Education Coordinator who is below the 16th Percentile Peer-to-Peer Benchmark. The 16th Percentile can be checked at: http://www.vdh.virginia.gov/emergency-medicalservices/education-certification/program-rankings-based-on-16th-percentilepeer-to-peer-benchmarking/
 - d. Candidates determined by the Division of Regulation and Compliance to have taught hours on their own or with an Education Coordinator who is below the 16th Percentile Peer-to-Peer Benchmark will not be eligible to attend the Education Coordinator Institute and will be required to reteach all hours which do not meet these requirements.
- C. Allow the Education Coordinator Candidate to participate and discuss administrative course activity.
- D. Allow the Education Coordinator Candidate to participate in all aspects of coordinating a program/class.

EMS Program Representative Boundary/Territory Changes

With the retirement of Heather Phillips-Green on October 31, 2019 and the promotion of PJ Fleenor to the role of EMS Program Representative Supervisor, the Division of Regulation and Compliance has made some adjustments to the boundaries/territories for all EMS Program Representatives and Supervisors.

Please see the attached map and table listing the new boundaries/territories statewide for EMS Program Representatives.

18 & Under Virginia Certified Providers

If you are aware of any Virginia certified EMS Providers who are under 18 and whose class ended after November 1, 2018, please reach out to these individuals and have them send an e-mail to National Registry (support@nremt.org) and request that their NREMT assessment exam be converted to a certification. National Registry will convert all valid assessments into NREMT certifications for free.


