IV. Approval of Minutes	Approval of the April 6, 2023 minutes. The minutes were approved.	Approved by consensus
V. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) & Board of Pharmacy (BOP) Compliance Issues – Dr. George Lindbeck	Dr. Lindbeck stated that there has been no change in the status. Indicated that all agencies needed to move toward getting a Virginia CSC.	
VI. Special Reports	Quarterly Data Report Jessica Rosner provided a quarterly report on Patient Care data and distributed a written version of the same. During the presentation, committee members asked questions which were addressed by either Jessica, Cam Crittenden or Adam Harrell . MDC members were very positive about the presentation and appreciative of the new reporting being provided by OEMS.

Old Business	<p>EMS Physician Nomenclature Dr. Asher Brand presented the findings of a workgroup which was set up to discuss the term “EMS Physician: which has been in the OEMS Regulations since 2012. The term and its use is concerning since there is a board certification for EMS Physician which causes confusion in the system. The workgroup which consisted of Dr. Asher Brand, Dr. John Morgan, Ron Passmore and staff liaison Debbie Akers discussed whether this issue us worth the time and energy it will take to change.</p> <p>PA/NP Roles and Nomenclature Committee did not meet. Issue will be addressed with the establishment of the workgroup for EMS Physician nomenclature.</p>	<p>Motion by Dr. Brand to request OEMS establish a workgroup, together with Legislative and Planning to look at the terms EMS Physician & PA/NP in order to have it changed to best reflect reality in the COV and EMS Regulations. Motion seconded by Dr. Louka – Motion carried.</p>
VIII. New Business	<p>a. Regional Council Roundtable</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) PEMS – Dr. Louka discussed the need to create a framework for the use of whole blood across the state. Is this best done by the agency, the region or the state? The committee had a discussion about how to proceed. Some regions are better off than others. Another issue concerns waste and how best to prevent the waste of this expensive life-saving product. ii) NOVA – Drug shortages are an issue and implementation of the DEA changes for drug boxes. iii) ODEMSA – CAH removed OB/GYN services. The hospital is refusing these patients. Next closest hospital is 45 minutes away. What should the region do? How best to address this situation? Feedback provided by the committee. iv) WVEMS – Manpower is the main issue. The region is also looking at a way to expand access to paramedic training programs. v) TJEMS – Nothing to report. vi) BREMS – Nothing to report. vii) SWEMS – Nothing to report. viii) TEMS – Nothing to report. ix) CSEMS – Nothing to report. x) LFEMS – Nothing to report. xi) REMS – Nothing to report. <p>b. Cyanokits to AEMT Dr. Asher Brand wanted the committee to consider the following proposal - to “Permit AEMT providers to be able to access and use cyanokit – provided they have the necessary training – as part of their scope of practice as a red dot skill.</p>	<p>Motion by Dr. Asher Brand Seconded by Dr. Phillips. No discussion – Motion passed unanimously.</p>

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	<p>c. Out of State EMS Education Dr. John Morgan brought up out of state EMS education – specifically George Washington University’s new paramedic program. He has concerns about whether field calls should be done in Virginia from a non-Virginia based program based on EMS Regulations. Dr. Reed Smith added that the GW program used to be based in Virginia. He believes this could be a very good thing for Virginia, especially in the NOVA region. Debbie Akers Explained the rationale behind why this was a requirement. She indicated that the paramedic program at GW is not an issue in Virginia due to the EMS Physician and Program Director both being certified in Virginia. Ultimately however, the final approval of the program and the program structure will be determined by CoAEMSP.</p>

	<p>a. Post exposure testing of decedent blood i. This process is still undefined in Virginia. Dr. Linbeck indicates a pathway has been developed but implementation of the pathway has been slow and difficult. The group is still working on this project.</p> <p>b. Maintenance of Chest Tubes i. Nothing to discuss.</p> <p>c. AEMT Student Minimum Competency (SMC) Guideline Discussion i. NREMT is moving away from psychomotor testing at the ALS level and transitioning it to the programs. NASEMSO has developed a document that is very similar to what AEMT programs are currently doing based on the TR-17 document. The Training and Certification committee approved the new document and is seeking endorsement by Medical Direction to support the adoption of the AEMT SMC. Dr. Charles Lane indicated that it is a good document and it allows for programs to be flexible depending on their resources.</p> <p>d. Paramedic Practitioner i. Dr. Lindbeck provided a summary overview of the FICUMS developed Paramedic Practitioner legislation. This is an item that the committee should keep an eye on over the next few years. Debbie Akers will provide the committee members with the link to the public comment for this proposal.</p>	<p>Motion by Dr. Martin to accept the document, Seconded by Dr. Phillips. We have 263 candidates in the pipeline, of which 40 are eligible for the next Institute to be held the end of September. The September Institute will be held at Tidewater Community College. iii.
