

Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program (MDPP)

STEPS TO BECOME A SUPPLIER



Does your organization have Preliminary or Full Recognition? If so, these are your next steps.

STEP 1

Host a Meeting with your organization's leadership and discuss the excellent work that you have done to achieve Interim Preliminary or Full Recognition.

- Share your NDPP results.
- Share the evidence of the Diabetes Prevention Program and that individuals engaged in the program can reduce their risk of developing diabetes by as much as 58%; and hence, reduce healthcare costs. www.cdc.gov/diabetes/prevention.

STEP 2

Coaches Obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI) from the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES).

STEP 3

The Organization completes a Medicare Enrollment Application and pay the fee*. (even if the organization is already enrolled as a Medicare Provider, it must re-enroll).

Two ways to apply:

1. The Paper Application (form CMS-20134) at <https://www.cms.gov/Medicare/CMS-Forms/CMS-Forms/Downloads/CMS20134.pdf>.
2. Online the PECOS system: <https://pecos.cms.hhs.gov/pecos/login.do#headingLv1>.

*The fee is \$569. Organizations may apply for a hardship exemption to have the fee waived.

STEP 4

Preparation for the MDPP payment structure and new billing codes (HCPCS G-Codes for MDPP Services are G9873 – G9885) For more information go to the CMS
