## Medicare Diabetes Prevention Program (MDPP) STEPS TO BECOME A SUPPLIER



Does your organization have Preliminary or Full Recognition? If so, these are your next steps.

STEP 1 Host a Meeting with your organization's leadership and discuss the excellent work that you have done to achieve Interim Preliminary or Full Recognition.

- Share your NDPP results.
- Share the evidence of the Diabetes Prevention Program and that individuals engaged in the program can reduce their risk of developing diabetes by as much as 58%; and hence, reduce healthcare costs. www.cdc.gov/diabetes/prevention.



Coaches Obtain a National Provider Identifier (NPI)

from the National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES).

The Organization completes a Medicare Enrollment Application

and pay the fee\*. (even if the organization is already enrolled as a Medicare Provider, it must re-enroll).
