

Facts about Community Water Fluoridation

- 1 Community Water Fluoridation (CWF) is the controlled addition of a fluoride compound to a public water supply to achieve a concentration optimal for dental caries prevention.¹
- 2 Tooth decay is the most common chronic disease among American children. One of four children living below the federal poverty level experience untreated tooth decay.²
- 3 Water fluoridation prevents tooth decay by providing frequent and consistent contact with low levels of fluoride, ultimately reducing tooth decay by about 25 percent in children and adults.^{3, 4, 5, 6}
- 4 School-aged children living in fluoridated communities on average have 2.25 fewer decayed teeth compared with children living in unfluoridated communities.⁷
- 5 The safety and benefits of fluoride are well documented and have been reviewed comprehensively by many scientific and public health organizations.^{8, 9, 10}
- 6 CWF is one of the top ten greatest public health achievements of the 20th century.¹¹
- 7 Virginia's Board of Health recommends all public water systems in Virginia fluoridate their water.¹² Over 95 percent of Virginians whose homes are served by public water systems receive fluoridated water.¹³
- 8 CWF has been identified as the most cost-effective method of delivering fluoride to all members of the community regardless of age, educational attainment, or income level.^{14, 15, 16}
- 9 CWF is cost-saving, even for small communities.¹¹
