



FLUORIDE VARNISH IN YOUR PEDIATRIC PRACTICE

AN EFFECTIVE, QUICK, LOW-COST HEALTH INTERVENTION

Tooth decay is the most common chronic disease in childhood – yet, it’s completely preventable. Poor oral health can inhibit a child’s ability to eat nutritious foods, socialize, and learn in school. Thankfully medical providers and their teams have an easy way to improve oral health through fluoride varnish.

Fluoride varnish is a concentrated dose of fluoride that is painted on the teeth with a small brush; it only takes a few seconds to apply during a well-child visit. It works by rebuilding weakened tooth enamel, making it harder and stronger to prevent further decay. In Virginia, Medicaid reimburses medical providers for applying fluoride varnish.

WHO CAN APPLY FLUORIDE VARNISH?

Many members of the pediatric team can apply fluoride varnish during well-child visits including:

- Physicians
- Physician assistants
- Nurse practitioners
- Nurses (both RN and LPN)
- Medical assistants

HOW DO I BILL FOR FLUORIDE VARNISH?

Virginia’s Medicaid program and most private insurers will reimburse for fluoride varnish applications. Medicaid will cover up to six applications starting at six months of age through the child’s sixth birthday. Providers typically

apply fluoride varnish every six months along with age-appropriate preventive services. Use the code below to bill Medicaid for fluoride varnish services, and contact private insurance companies for their billing policies.
