I. Policy

Five levels of nutrition interventions have been developed for staff that provides nutrition education. Levels 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 correspond to increasing levels of complexity of the nutrition intervention as well as increasing competency and technical skills required to provide the intervention.

The five levels are defined as:

Level 1:	Nutritionist Assistant Non CPA	Lowest Intervention Level – Limited assessment, <i>cannot certify participants</i> . Provides follow up education to low risk participants under nutritionist's supervision. Must complete designated WIC Web Based Paraprofessional Training Program Modules.
Level 2:	Breastfeeding Peer Counselor	Moderate Intervention Level – Limited assessment, <i>cannot certify participants</i> . Provides WIC pregnant and breastfeeding participants with education, counseling, and support on maintaining a positive breastfeeding relationship with their infants through the first year. Basic breastfeeding services are rendered under the Breastfeeding Coordinator's supervision. Must complete Virginia's <i>Loving Support Through Peer Counseling</i> ® Training Program modules as part of orientation.
Level 3:	Nutritionist Associate (Paraprofessional CPA)	Moderate Intervention Level – Expanded assessment, <i>can certify all participants</i> . Provides initial nutrition education to all participants and follow up education to low risk participants under nutritionist's supervision. Must complete all of WIC Web Based Paraprofessional Training Program Modules. Includes LPNs, dietetic technicians and home economists with a general bachelor's degree.
Level 4:	Nutritionist (Professional CPA)	High Intervention Level – Expanded assessment, <i>can certify all participants</i> . Provides initial and routine follow up nutrition education to low risk participants. Functions as local agency breastfeeding coordinator (if applicable). Includes home economists with a major in food/nutrition, nutritionists, registered nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants and physicians.
Level 5:	Registered Dietitian	Highest Intervention Level – Can assess and provide initial and follow up nutrition education to high risk participants. Required provider for required high risk counseling. Reinforces medical care plan provided by the health care system and provides Medical Nutrition Therapy (MNT)* services. Functions as local agency breastfeeding coordinator (if applicable). Works with other community programs to integrate nutrition services. In some settings, may perform management functions (i.e. supervise WIC nutrition and administrative staff). Must be Registered Dietitian

Assessment	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Receives referrals from Health Department and WIC personnel. • Completes Breastfeeding Referral/Contact Form (WIC-386) for pregnant and breastfeeding WIC participants. • Collects and documents weight and length for breastfeeding infants. • Collects breastfeeding, health, and nutrition information pertinent to breastfeeding family. • Identifies the needs and concerns of breastfeeding family. • Identifies high risk breastfeeding families and refers to Breastfeeding Coordinator. • Utilizes information collected to assess and document breastfeeding status in Crossroads.
Counseling and Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promotes breastfeeding as the preferred infant feeding method. • Provides basic level information on breastfeeding, infant feeding, and nutrition. • Provides WIC pregnant and breastfeeding participants with continual education, counseling, and support on maintaining a positive breastfeeding relationship with their infant through the first year. • Works individually, in groups, and/or in classes with pregnant and breastfeeding WIC participants. • Contacts participants on the phone from home or in person at the hospital, clinic setting, or their home. • Creates a breastfeeding friendly environment
