Happy New Year from the Virginia WIC Program! As we put 2020 behind us, we are looking forward to continued progress and successes in 2021. Because of the ongoing pandemic, the Virginia WIC Program continues to operate remote services for our participants. A new participant survey is being developed and will focus on these remote services. The results from the survey will help shape future services and improvements for the program.

Also on the horizon is the movement towards online shopping. USDA is funding a study that will be conducted by The Gretchen Swanson Center for Nutrition to research and test WIC online ordering. They have started collecting information and will be

developing the roadmap for WIC to provide online shopping for participants. The study will be piloted in a few states however the states have not yet been selected. We will keep you updated as more information is provided but we are excited about the potential to offer this service to our participants in the future.

Thank you for your continued support of the Virginia WIC Program especially during these trying times.



Annual Compliance

Annually, the Virginia WIC Program publishes a compliance and program integrity reminder. Minimum Stock at a Glance

The State WIC office (SWO) has created an easy-to-read, one-page chart to help retailers understand the minimum stocking and shelf label requirements. Please refer to the policy document in the retailer manual for more details. <u>Click here</u> for direct link to entire document. See below a sample of the document:

Virginia WIC Minimum Stocking

The minimum stocking requirement (MSR) must be met at all times. The products must be in the store during normal business hours. Expired foods do not count toward the requirement.

Use the Approved Product List (APL) and the Approved Food List to determine approved brands, varieties, and UPCs that may be used to meet the MSR. View the official requirement document:

This document can be used to prepare you for your next monitoring visit.

How to prepare for monitoring visits:

- 1. Be sure you have all products (review MSR)
- 2. Locate your store's WIC binder (3-ring binder) and inform staff of its location
- 3. Check all registers for WIC Food List 2020 and Formula Flyer
- 4. Check all mandatory WIC labels (MSR at a glance document and WIC Food List 2020 for product details)

Q. What is the current Food List?

Answer: 2020 Food List

This publication is updated every few years. You will receive communication from our office before a new publication is released. Please note our current edition is 2020 see picture below and Spanish version with red banner.





Q. What WIC literature do I need at the register?

Answer: WIC Food List 2020 and Infant Formula Flyer should be at each eWIC register.

Q. Where do I need to store the Cashier's Handbook?

Answer: Store it in your Retail Store Binder. Please Note: Only one copy needed at each store.

Q. Where should you store the WIC Retail Store binder?

Answer: WIC Retail Store binder should be stored in a central location in the store. It is a great reference for WIC questions. An Agency representative will ask to see it during a monitoring visit.

Q. How do I order WIC supplies?

Answer: Retailer Supply Request Form or Web Form or Document downloads can be found on our WIC Resources website.
