

Dwayne Roadcap Director, Office of Drinking Water



Dwayne Roadcap, REHS, LPSS, AOSE, is the director of the Office of Drinking Water and has more than 30 years of experience with environmental programs in Virginia. He began his career as a water treatment operator with the Rivanna Water and Sewer Authority in Charlottesville, Virginia and later transitioned to the Virginia Department of Health as an environmental health specialist and technical consultant with the Thomas Jefferson Health District. In 2000, Dwayne started working with the Office of Environmental Health Services (OEHS) and served multiple roles, including the indemnification fund program manager, director for the division of onsite sewage, water supply, environmental engineering, and marina programs, and acting office director for OEHS.

Dwayne has presented at national and state conferences regarding the Virginia Department of Health's environmental health programs, including the National Onsite Wastewater Recycling Association and the National Environmental Health Association. For more than five years, Dwayne helped mentor environmental health program managers and leaders across the United States through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Environmental Public Health Leadership Institute (EPHLI). EPHLI was a 12-month learning program that assigned students to a complicated real world environmental health problem to teach methods of problem analysis, verbal judo, conflict resolution, project management, logic models, strategic thinking, and systems thinking.

Dwayne holds an environmental sciences degree from the University of Virginia and enjoys spending time with his wife and daughter. Dwayne also served as a volunteer reserve deputy sheriff for two years in Albemarle County, Virginia, and has a second-degree black belt in a traditional martial art.
