Sustainability



- Home Visiting trainings in-person or online
- Bright Smiles for Babies, Fluoride Varnish training for community health nurses
- Quality Improvement Measures
- **Promote the Age 1 Dental Visit**
- Train dental providers
- Dental providers that treat pregnant women and accept Medicaid
- Standardized curriculum and resources
