

UVA Health & Rural Partners Expanding Remote Patient Monitoring

The University of Virginia Health System is working to make it easier for rural patients to access the care they need. The hospital is teaming up with six community health organizations to provide at-home monitoring. This project is being funded by more than \$700,000 in grants from the Federal Communications Commission and the U.S. Department of

Agriculture. Each of the community health organizations will get 40 reusable patient-monitoring kits, which include tablets with an Internet connection and medical equipment such as blood pressure cuffs and thermometers.

Connecting the Community for Maternal Health Challenge

This challenge is designed to help community-based or community-oriented 501(c)3 (non-profit) organizations develop the infrastructure and capabilities needed to pursue maternal

health research in areas that specifically impact their communities. These advocacy, local community, faith-based, and other similar groups will receive training and mentoring in writing research proposals and assistance in building the infrastructure required for research activities. There is a total prize purse of \$3.038M, and winning organizations will also receive non-monetary incentives such as training and mentoring.

HUD's Funding Opportunity to Address Unsheltered and Rural Homelessness

Application Deadline: Thursday, October 20, 2022 by 8:00 PM ET

In June 2022 HUD announced **\$322 million in competitive funding available to communities to address unsheltered and rural homelessness**. This funding opportunity includes a \$54.5 million set aside for communities in rural areas. Funding is available for permanent housing, street outreach efforts and other supportive services, and Homeless Management Information Systems (HMIS).
