

Mt. Rogers crisis center leads commonwealth in responding to mental health emergencies

"Mental health professionals, state and local leaders, and law enforcement from around the [Mount Rogers] region... gathered at Mount Rogers Community Services' crisis center in Marion, which after opening in 2019 is now transforming into a receiving center. As part of a pilot project, the Marion center on North Main Street is the first in the state to take this step.

K.J. Holbrook, Mount Rogers' chief clinical officer, said she hopes this transition will change the dynamic that now often sends people in a mental health crisis to the emergency room, frequently in police custody, and instead directs them to the center."

The Appalachian Region: A Data Overview from the 2016-2020 American Community Survey

State- and county-level information on population, age, race and ethnicity, housing occupancy, education, labor force, employment, income, health insurance coverage, disability, and veteran status, for the 13 Appalachian states. Features statistics with breakdowns by 5 levels of population density. Includes data explorer options for Appalachian categories such as population and age, education, income and poverty, computer and broadband access, rural Appalachia versus rural America, and employment and commuting.

Does Training Physicians in Rural Places Lead to Rural Practice?

Researchers analyzed data on training and placement of 12,162 clinically active physicians who completed an accredited family medicine residency between 2008 and

2012. They found that more than 90 percent of residents had no rural training during that time and only 14 percent practiced in a rural location by 2018. But the data showed that rural exposure during family medicine residency training is associated with a 5- to 6-fold increase in subsequent rural practice.

Virginia Dental Loan Repayment Program

Application Deadline: Saturday, October 15, 2022

Despite significant dental workforce shortages, oral health remains an essential need in many Virginia communities. The Delta Dental of Virginia Foundation is committed to addressing these shortfalls with a one-year student loan repayment program designed to help Virginia dentists and dental hygienists in exchange for 12 months of service with a safety-net clinic.

Virginia Behavioral Health Student Loan Repayment Program (BH-SLRP) NOW open!

Application Cycle: Saturday, October 1, 2022 - Saturday, April 15, 2023



The 2021 General Assembly established a \$1.6 million Virginia Behavioral Health Student Loan Repayment Program (BH-LRP) to help recruit and retain behavioral health (BH) professionals to practice in underserved areas of the Commonwealth and/or provide counseling and treatment to underserved populations. This program will repay a portion of an eligible BH professional's student loan debt. In return, recipients commit to practicing in Virginia for a minimum of two years at an eligible site.

Comer Family Foundation: Syringe Service Program

Application Deadline: Tuesday, November 1, 2022

Funding will support comprehensive **harm reduction** programs that improve the health and wellness of people who use drugs. These programs provide free sterile syringes, education, and community wraparound services to reduce opioid overdose and the transmission of HIV and viral hepatitis.

School Based Mental Health Services Grant Program

Application Deadline: Thursday, November 3, 2022

Grants to increase the number of qualified mental health service professionals providing school based mental health services to students in local educational agencies with a demonstrated need.

SeedMoney: Grants for Garden Projects

Application Deadline: Saturday, November 12, 2022

Each year, SeedMoney offers challenge grants to diverse food garden projects through a 30-day crowdfunding challenge running from November 15th to December 15th. Grants are open to all types of public food garden projects (youth gardens, community gardens, food bank gardens, etc.) regardless of their location.

The grants offered are on a sliding scale. The size of a grant a project can receive depends on how much it is able to raise over the 30-day period compared to other projects participating in the challenge. This year, a total of 370 grants ranging from \$100 to \$1000 will be offered.

Grants and technical assistance to support communities that are ready to take concrete steps toward implementing transportation solutions to help underserved residents become more fully engaged in economic opportunities, improve their health and well-being, and/or become more integrated into their community.

National Health Service Corps Students to Service Loan Repayment Program

Application Deadline: Thursday, December 1, 2022

Loan repayment assistance for medical, nursing, physician assistant, and dental students who agree to provide services in eligible Health Professional Shortage Areas of greatest need.

Federal Funding for Transportation Programs Serving Older Adults and People with Disabilities

Discusses the role of federal funding as a primary source of funding to support transportation programs that meet the needs of older adults and people with disabilities. Describes funding programs from the Department of Transportation, the Department of Health and Human Services, AmeriCorps, and the Department of Veterans Affairs. Highlights programs for rural and tribal communities.



Rural Residency Planning & Development (RRPD) Program

Application Deadline: Friday, January 27, 2023

The RRPD program is a multi-year HRSA initiative to develop new, accredited and sustainable rural residency programs or **rural track programs** (RTP) in family medicine, internal medicine, psychiatry, general surgery, preventive medicine, or obstetrics and gynecology, to support the expansion of the physician workforce and increase opportunities for residents to train in rural communities. There are two pathways for this program: General Primary Care and High Need Specialty Pathway and Maternal Health and Obstetrics Pathway.
