Governor Glenn Youngkin Announces Transformational Behavioral Health Care Plan for Virginians

On December 14th, Youngkin "unveiled his three-year plan to transform Virginia's behavioral health system, entitled 'Right Help, Right Now.' This is a six-pillared approach to address our



behavioral health challenges, encompassing crisis care, law enforcement burden, substance use disorder support, behavioral health workforce and service delivery innovation. The current behavioral health system is being overwhelmed and failing to meet the needs of Virginians in crisis with an outdated model of care that relies too heavily on hospitals. Year one of this three-year comprehensive plan invests over \$230 million in Virginia's behavioral health system, which will be proposed in the Governor's budget amendments on Thursday."

# **Critical FCC Broadband Initiatives for Rural & Underserved Communities**

About 15 million of an estimated 48 million eligible households are enrolled in the Affordable Connectivity Program. Rural Americans benefit the most from telehealth, yet enrollment in urban states appears to be doing better than in rural states. The

The Notice of Funding Opportunity for Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) outreach grants will fund community organizations to publicize the program and create ACP navigators to help with enrollment. This is very important for rural areas.

"People in rural America live an average of three to four times further from types of important hospital-based health care and skilled nursing facilities than people in urban communities. These long distances—combined demographic factors related to age,

income, employment, and less access to paid and unpaid leave than people in metropolitan areas—create unique challenges for people in America's rural communities. Without access to paid sick time and paid leave for serious family and medical needs, workers are often forced to manage taking care of themselves or loved ones without pay while struggling to make ends meet, potentially jeopardizing their health, job, or economic security."

### **Federal Support for Financially Distressed Hospitals**

#### **USDA Funding Remote Education in Rural and Tribal Communities**

### **Application Deadline: Monday, January 30, 2023**



The U.S. Department of Agriculture will make \$64 million in awards for real-time, interactive distance learning and telemedicine services. The **USDA Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grants** allow students to participate in class remotely and also connect rural residents to medical professionals without leaving home.

### **SAMHSA Minority Fellowship**

**Application Deadline: Friday, February 3, 2023** 

Supported by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), the SAMHSA Minority Fellowship provides a one-year fellowship to psychiatry residents who are at the PG1 level or higher and are committed to addressing minority psychiatric mental health issues. Those who are interested in becoming a leader and are committed to a career providing culturally sensitive psychiatric services for minority underserved populations, are invited to apply.

#### **USDA Emergency Food Assistance Program- Reach and Resiliency**

Application Deadline: Monday, March 6, 2023

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) will make approximately 54 awards with total funding of more than \$60 million. The funding extends a \$1 billion investment in the country's food network made 18 months ago to support community-level food banks during the pandemic. Most of the 38 states that received funds in round one describe distribution to rural areas among their projects.

New Funding Opportunity: Rural Communities Opioid Response Program-Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome



**Application Deadline: Wednesday, March 8, 2023** 

HRSA's Federal Office of Rural Health Policy will be making a \$20 million investment for approximately 40 grants to reduce the incidence and impact of neonatal abstinence syndrome (NAS) in rural communities. Over the course of a three-year period of performance, RCORP-NAS recipients will collaborate with local, state, and regional stakeholders to provide coordinated, trauma-informed, and family-centered behavioral and maternal health care services, including medication-assisted treatment, to rural pregnant and postpartum persons and their families. Applicant organizations may be located in an urban or rural area; however, all activities supported by the program must exclusively occur in HRSA-designated rural areas.

## **FCC Rural Health Care Telecommunications Program**

### Application Deadline: Saturday, April 1, 2023

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) provides funding for telecommunications expenses related to health care in rural areas. To be eligible, applicants must be one of the following: post-secondary health professions training institution; community health center; local health department or agency, community mental health center; nonprofit hospital; rural health clinic, including mobile clinics and dedicated emergency departments in rural for-profit hospitals; skilled nursing facilities.
