- Safe Online Surfing Program- <https://sos.fbi.gov/en/>
  - The FBI Safe Online Surfing (SOS) Internet Challenge is a free, educational program for children that teaches cyber safety and helps them become better digital citizens in a fun and engaging way. The program, created for students in third through eighth grades, covers age-appropriate topics like cyberbullying, passwords, malware, social media, and more.
- Child ID App- available in Apple or Google Play stores
  - The Child ID app allows you to store photos and vital information about your child so you can quickly share it with security or police. It also includes tips on keeping children safe and guidance on what to do in those first crucial hours after a child goes missing.
  - Data and photos are stored only on your mobile device. They are not shared until you choose to send the information to authorities.
