Miss Virginia School Tour – Elementary School

Learn what it means to be a leader in their community and among their friends.

Be able to identify who is a trusted adult and understand the role they play in their lives.

BOLT – Middle School

Cost: Free resource

Trainings for professionals with downloadable classroom resources

Through BOLT middle schoolers will:

Demonstrate knowledge of the effects of alcohol and other drugs on the body and brain as well as identify substance use consequences

Understand the importance of peer leadership and positive decision making

Recognize youth substance use influences and the key concepts of social providing and peer pressure

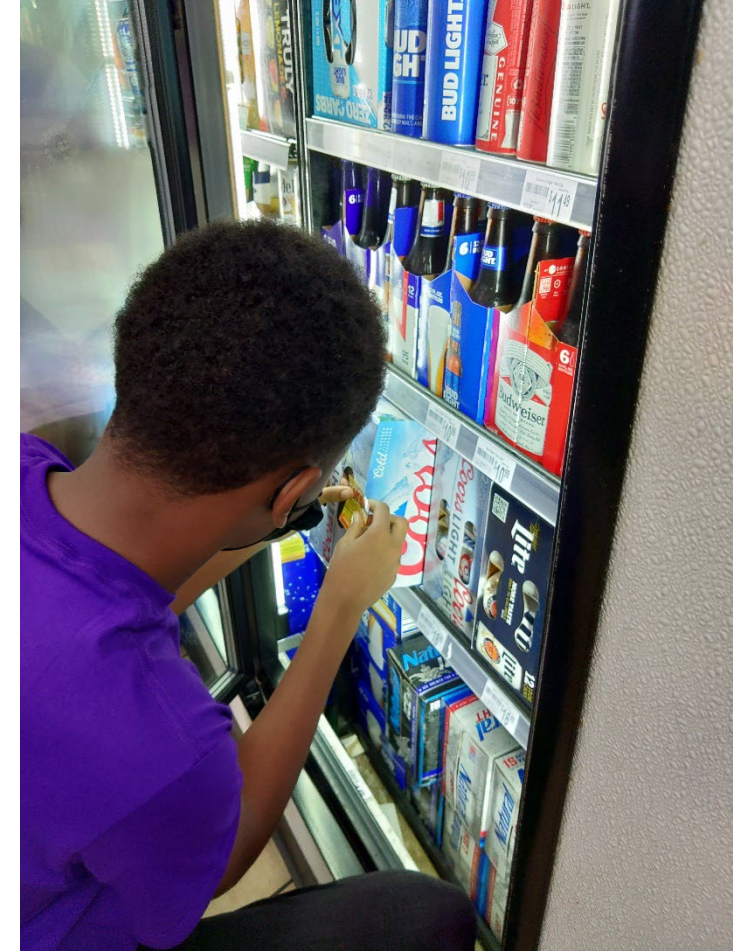
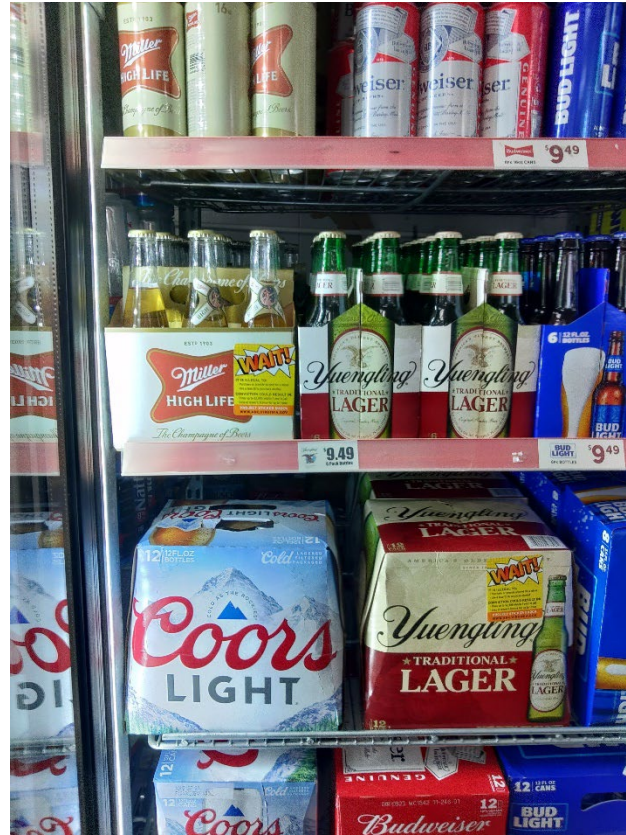
Audience: Adults 21 and older

HEADS UP - College



Higher Education Alcohol & Drug

Audience: College Students & Partners

Cost: Free resource

HEADS UP provides free online trainings, resources and materials to increase knowledge of substance misuse and high-risk drinking among college faculty/staff and students to build the capacity of student leaders to hold substance misuse education or awareness events.

HEADS UP – Online Trainings



Alcohol Basics Training is intended to help college students become aware of Virginia law, common myths about alcohol and how to make healthy and responsible decisions.

Alcohol and Other Drug Prevention Training is intended to provide college faculty and staff with knowledge on student substance use and skills to intervene with students who may be experiencing problems related to substance use.

HEADS UP – Posters and Flyers

HOW TO BE AN ACTIVE BYSTANDER

An active and empowered bystander takes action when they witness a person in need. Warning signs can include excessive drinking, verbal arguments and body language signaling that someone is uncomfortable.

FIVE STEPS TO BEING AN ACTIVE BYSTANDER:

- 1 Notice the event.
- 2 Determine whether the event is a problem or an emergency and how you can safely respond.
- 3 Assume responsibility.
- 4 Come up with a plan.
- 5 Take action to protect yourself and others.

Intervening early and often can help create a **safe and respectful environment**.

THE THREE D'S OF BYSTANDER INTERVENTION

DIRECTLY INTERVENE. ASK SOMEONE WHO LOOKS UNCOMFORTABLE "ARE YOU DOING OKAY?"

DELEGATE. SEEK ASSISTANCE FROM SOMEONE ELSE.

DISTRACT. BE CREATIVE! INTERRUPT THE SITUATION WITHOUT DIRECTLY CONFRONTING THE HARMFUL BEHAVIOR.

CAN YOU RECOGNIZE ALCOHOL POISONING?

SYMPTOMS CAN INCLUDE:

- VOMITING
- CONFUSION
- BLUISH LIPS
- SEIZURES
- TROUBLE BREATHING
- CLAMMY + PALE SKIN
- DIFFICULTY OR INABILITY TO REMAIN CONSCIOUS

TAKE ACTION

- ROLL THEM ON THEIR SIDE
- CALL 911
- DON'T LEAVE THEM ALONE
- DON'T GIVE FOOD OR FLUIDS
- BEGIN CPR IF HEART RATE STOPS

TIPS TO PREVENT ALCOHOL POISONING

STANDARD SIZE DRINKS contain the same amount of alcohol.

12 OZ BEER = 5 OZ WINE = 1.5 OZ 80 PROOF LIQUOR

- Don't drink on an empty stomach. Eat foods high in protein before, during and after drinking.
- Pace yourself, alternate with water and keep track of how much you drink.
- The liver typically processes one standard size drink per hour. Only time can sober you up.
- Avoid drinking games and binge drinking. They increase your risk of alcohol poisoning.

CAUTION! Some drinks have a higher alcohol by volume (ABV) than others.

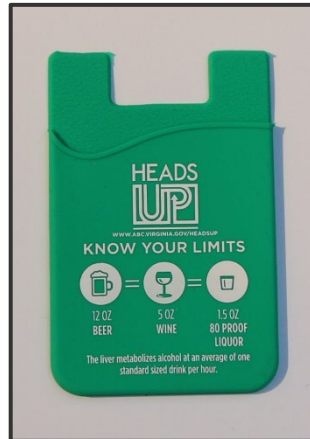

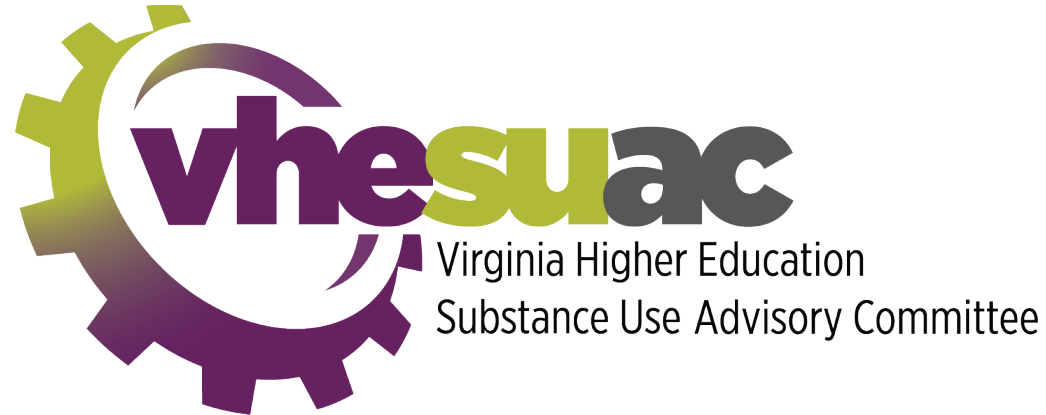

VHESUAC is comprised of public and private universities and colleges, student leaders, state agencies and partners in substance misuse prevention. VHESUAC is tasked with:

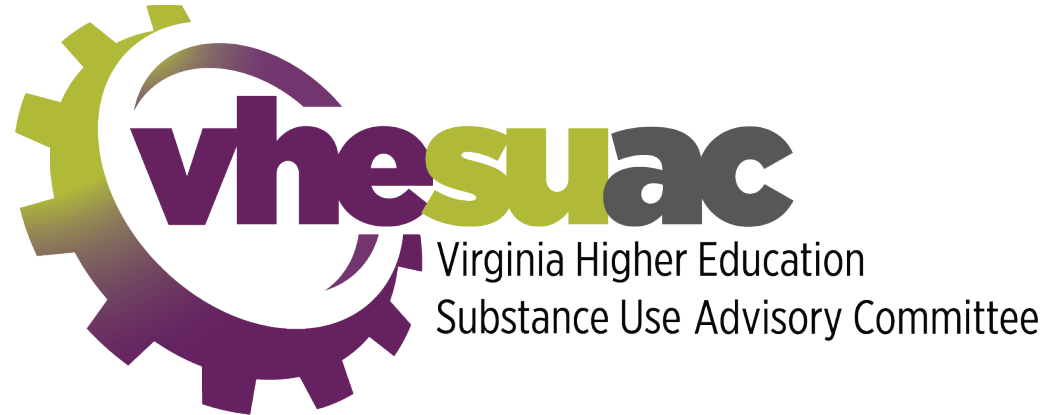
- Developing a statewide strategic plan

Licensee Training (RSVP and MART)



Audience: Sellers, Servers, Managers, Owners at any licensed establishment

Cost: Free resource

Designed to support sellers and servers in understanding the facts of alcohol education and prevention and Virginia ABC's laws and regulation. The trainings provide the participants the tools and knowledge needed to be successful and compliant.

Seller/Server Training Approval Program (STAP)



Virginia ABC approves external alcohol seller server training courses pursuant to [COV 4.1-227.E](#) which states that the Virginia ABC Board shall “Provide for a reduction in the length of any suspension and a reduction in the amount of any civil penalty for any retail licensee where the licensee can demonstrate that it provided to its employees **alcohol server or seller training certified in advance by the Board;**”

Responsible Alcohol Delivery Driver (RADD)



Audience: Licensees, delivery drivers

Cost: Free resource

Designed to educate licensees and alcoholic beverage delivery drivers on delivery best practices.

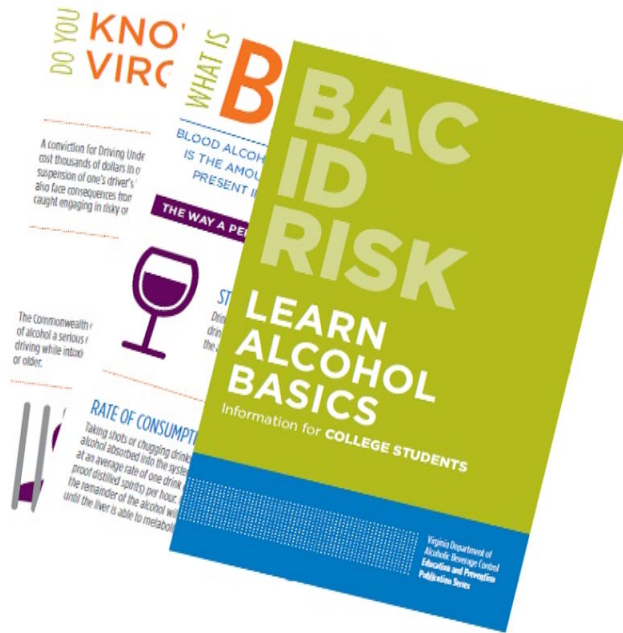


