CONTACT TRACING & EPI SUPPORT

Beginning on Easter Weekend, volunteers began assisting with Patient Monitoring calls to CV19 contacts. This included many interpreters to talk with Spanish-speaking citizens. Volunteers continue to assist with Patient Monitoring, Testing Prep, Contact tracing and case management.


TESTING OPERATIONS
