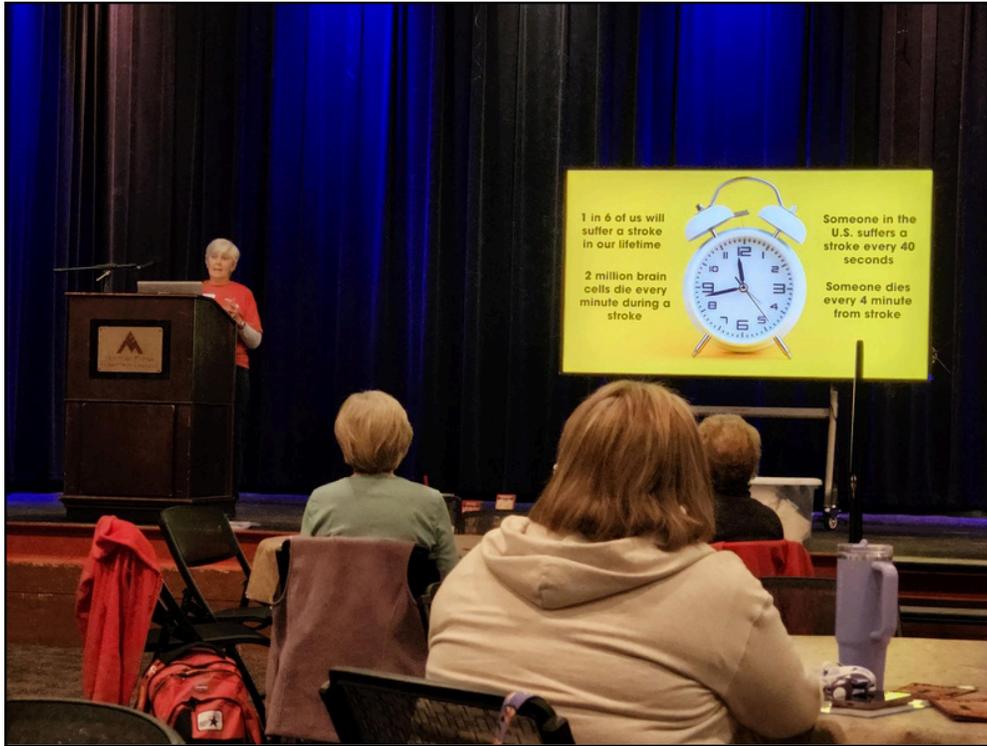

We are making progress on our amateur radio project. We have started a bi-monthly regional net on the first and third Tuesday of the month. We also have local nets on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month. A net is like a meeting, but on the radio.

When needed, we can use a net to provide communications with the Health Departments located within this area and any related shelters or field operations where members of our MRC Radio team are deployed.

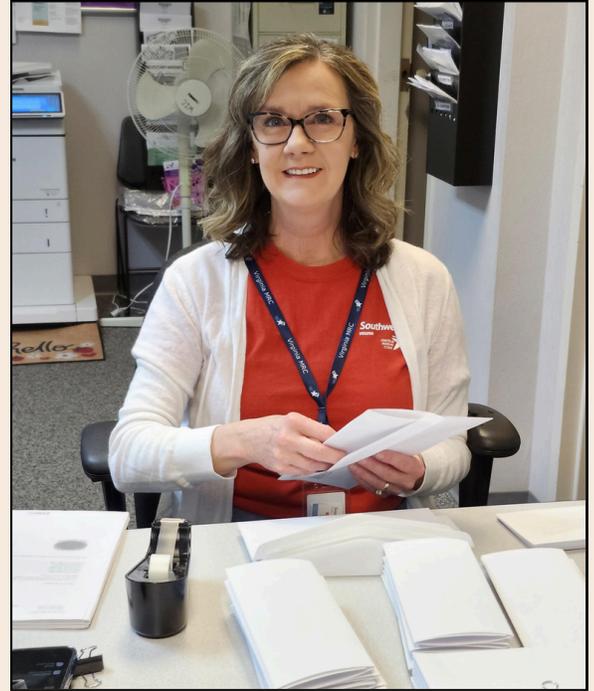

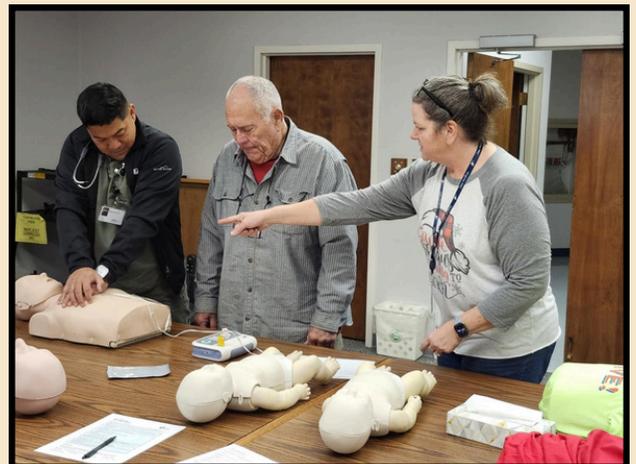
More Training
