





Number of Testing Encounters, Number of Positive Testing Encounters, and Percent Positivity** by Lab Report Date - All Health Districts, PCR Only






PCR Testing Only – All Health Districts


Current 7-day percent positivity rate = 6.3%



Current 7-day percent positivity rate = 6%



Daily Statewide Number of Tests Conducted: February¹

Across the Commonwealth, an average of 29,681 tests (antigen and PCR) were conducted per day over the past seven days. The current 7-day average PCR tests per day is 20,129 and the 7-day average antigen tests per day is 9,551.





Public health experts say 'we can't give up on testing' as vaccinations ramp up

Coronavirus testing is down by at least a third from its peak during the winter holidays in the greater Washington region, sparking concern among public health experts who worry that lower testing numbers mean officials could be late to recognize a future surge in cases or the next vaccine-resistant variant.

Extension of expiration date of Abbott BinaxNOW Covid-19 Antigen Cards

- During the week of March 1, 2021, Abbott Labs extended the expiration date of BinaxNOW COVID-19 Antigen Cards by 3 months
- Extended expiration date goes back to early Feb 2021
- If your facility has received BinaxNOW COVID-19 Antigen Cards, you
 will receive an email this week from the VDH Antigen Testing Team
 with Abbott's letter and a 9 page list of lot numbers on the boxes of
 cards, and new expiration dates for those boxes of cards

New Home Antigen Test = Quidel QuickVue At-Home COVID-19 Test

- Received FDA Emergency Use Authorization on 3/1/2021
- Is a prescription item
- Indication = test symptomatic people felt to have Covid-19 within first 6 days of illness
- Specimen = anterior nasal swab
- Can be used on children as young as 8; for children 8-13 years old, adult collects swab
- Written directions go through swab collection and test procedure
- For people ages >= 14, collect swab on their own
- Test results in 10 minutes; patient advised to contact healthcare provider with result
