Secure and Resilient Commonwealth Panel Charter

Secretary Public Safety and Homeland Security chairs.

The Panel shall have as its primary focus emergency management and homeland security within the Commonwealth to ensure that prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery programs, initiatives, and activities, both at the state and local levels, are fully integrated, suitable, and effective in addressing risks from man-made and natural disasters. The Panel shall where necessary review, evaluate, and make recommendations concerning implementation of such initiatives*. The Panel shall also make such recommendations as it deems necessary to enhance or improve the resiliency of public and private critical infrastructure to mitigate against man-made and natural disasters.






PHEP / HPP UPDATE




HPP & PHEP Structure

Office of Emergency Preparedness

The Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP) exercises oversight of and coordinates Emergency Preparedness, Response, and Recovery across VDH to include coordination with all local health districts and healthcare facilities statewide. OEP:

- Facilitates staffing of the VDH Emergency Coordination Center; and, when activated, coordinates providing liaison representatives to the Virginia Emergency Operations Center (VEOC) to lead the health and medical response (Emergency Support Function 8).
- Coordinates statewide distribution of emergency medical countermeasures.
- Leads the development, implementation, maintenance and regular exercising of the statewide VDH Emergency Response Plan, ensuring coordination with local, state and federal agencies and private sector partner planning.
- Manages the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) Cooperative Agreement and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) grant.



Operation Allies Welcome


The Commonwealth supported Operations Allies Welcome (OAW) since August of 2021 for the repatriation and resettlement of American Citizens (<5%) and Afghanistan citizens (Special Immigrant Visa-holders and Humanitarian Parolees).

- 4,518 guests processed through the National Conference Center (Loudoun County)
- 5,081 guests processed through Marine Corps Base Quantico (Prince William County)
- 7,480 guests processed through Fort Pickett (Blackstone, VA)
- Roughly 3,000 guests processed through Fort Lee (Prince George County)
- Roughly 52,000 guests processed during the initial phase/evaluation at Dulles International Airport, serving as the original Point of Entry (POE).
