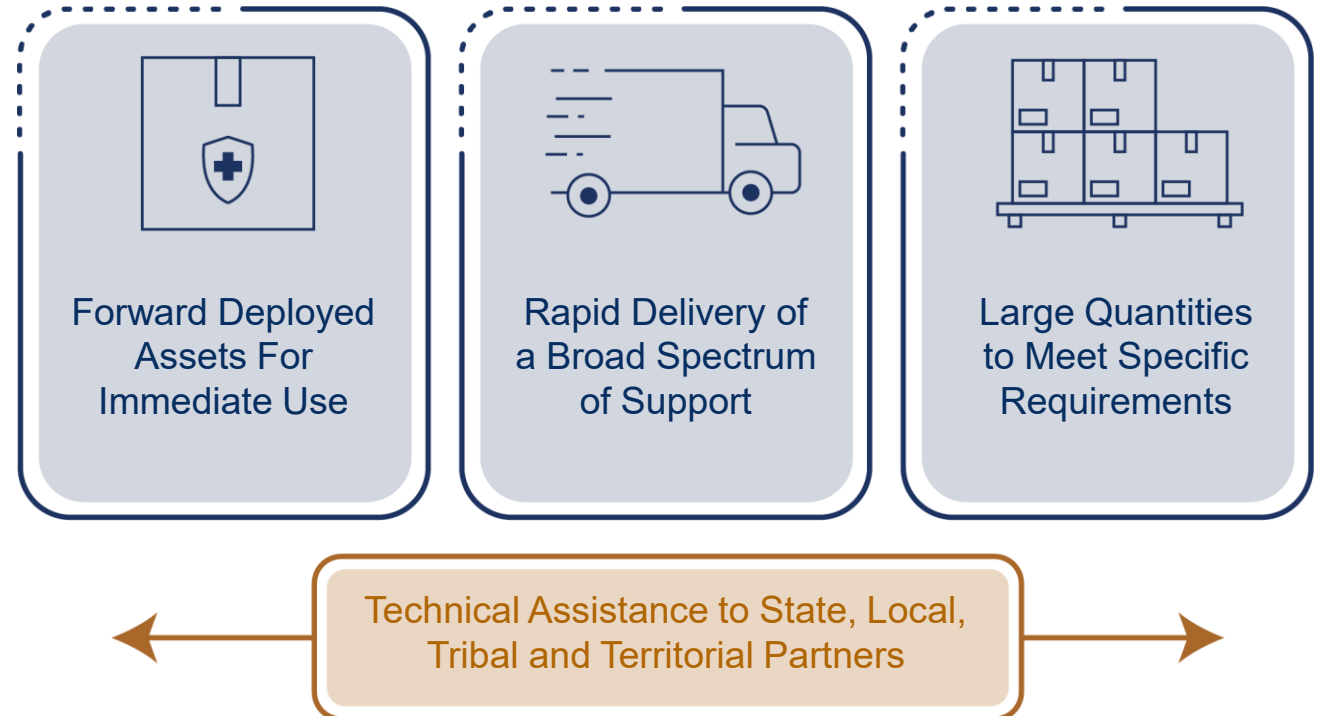
Purpose and Mission

- **Purpose:** Supplement and resupply state and local public health agencies in the event of an emergency
- **Mission:** Prepare and support partners and provide the right resources at the right time to secure the nation's health



Strategic National Stockpile

- The U.S. federal government's largest repository of emergency medical countermeasures (MCMs)
- Established in 1999 as the National Pharmaceutical Stockpile
- **~\$11.6 billion** inventory of MCMs to respond to
 - **Chemical, biological, radiological and nuclear threats**
 - Burn and blast events
 - Emerging infectious diseases and pandemics
- Commercial logistics providers manage SNS warehouses and transportation

Glanders & Melioidosis	Oral antimicrobials	Oral and IV antimicrobials
Influenza (Pandemic Only)	PPE	Oral, IV and inhalation antivirals, ventilators
Pneumonic Plague	Oral antimicrobials	IV antimicrobials
Radiation	None	Oral and IV chelating agents for specific isotopes, anti-neutropenics for acute radiation syndrome
Radioactive Iodine Exposure	Oral thyroid blocking agents	None
Smallpox	Vaccines	Oral and IV antivirals
Smallpox Vaccine Adverse Event		Oral and IV antivirals; IV vaccinia immune globulin
Tularemia	Oral antimicrobials	IV antimicrobials
Typhus	None	Oral and IV antimicrobials
Viral Hemorrhagic Fevers	Vaccine (Ebola Zaire), PPE	Ebola therapeutics

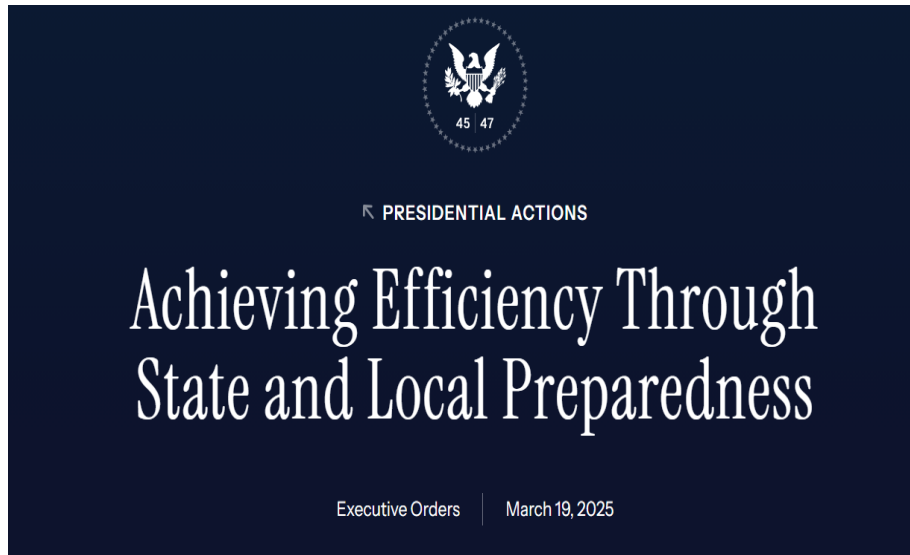

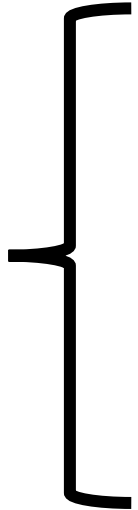
Stockpiling Type	Primary Holder	Availability
Type I – Federally Stockpiled	SNS	Not commercially available
Type II – Shared/Jurisdictionally Supplemented	Joint (SNS + SLTT)	Commercially available but scarce in emergencies
Type III – Jurisdictionally Stockpiles	SLTT	Commercially available

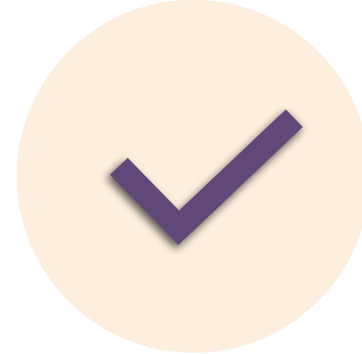

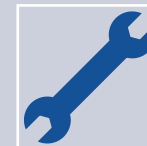

Opportunities for SNS Material

Federal Medical Stations

- 50-bed FMS sets deployed: 19 sets
- 250-bed FMS sets deployed: 23 sets
- Stand-alone bariatric kits: 5 kits
- Upcoming second round of applications for up to 17 available 250-bed FMS sets

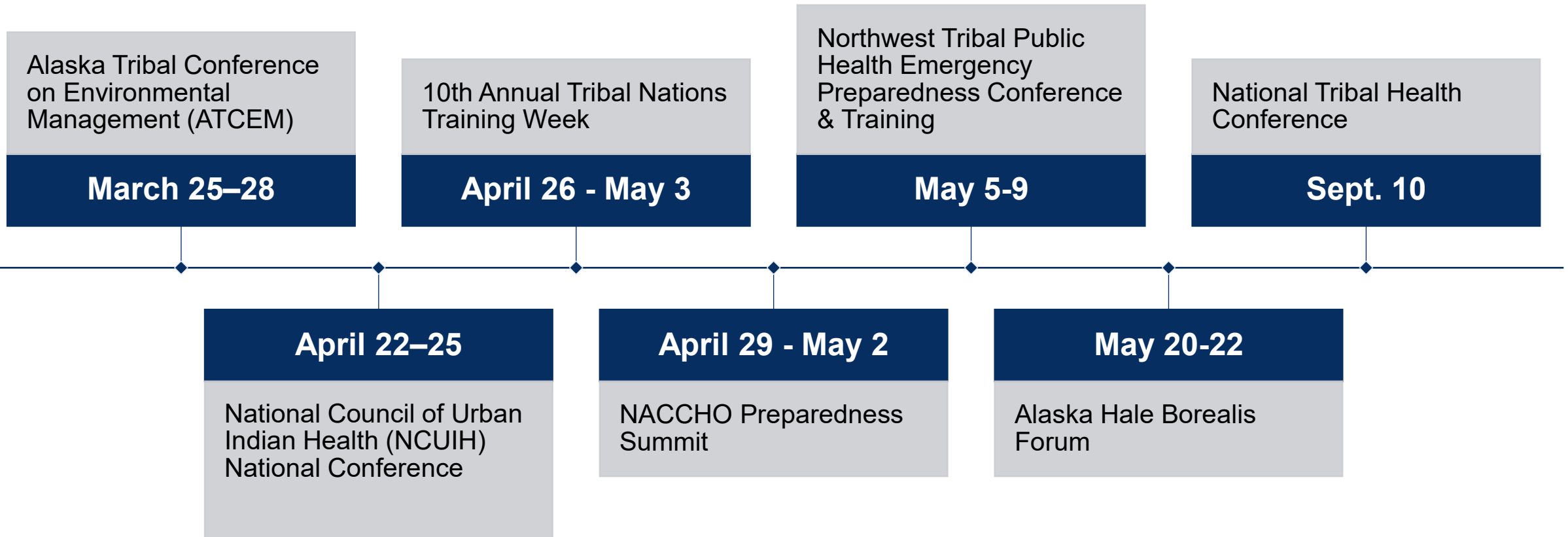
Personal Protective Equipment

- Ongoing discussions between White House and HHS leadership

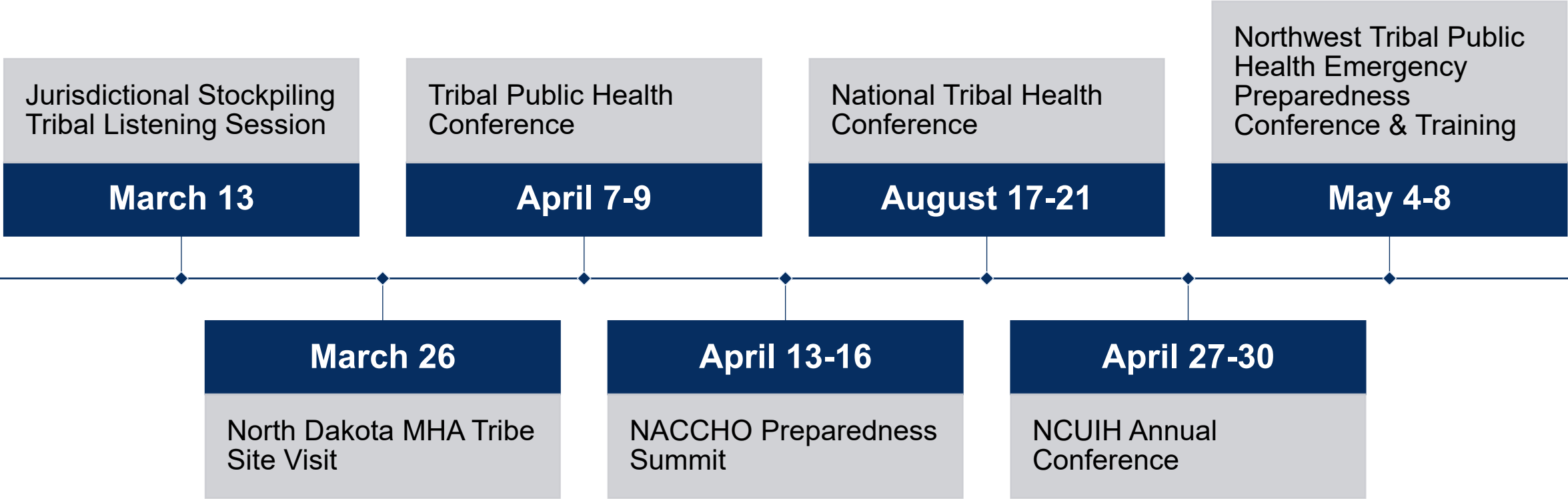
Improving Tribal Access to SNS

- Federal interagency working group convened in 2021
- Conducted tribal consultation sessions with tribal leaders and leaders from Urban Indian Organizations (UIOs)
- Used session feedback to refine strategy
- Strategy approved by ASPR in 2024
- Pathways: The strategy clarifies the pathways for tribal access to SNS
- Milestones: Establishes milestones to educate tribal officials and partners about the pathways
- Technical assistance: Includes providing assistance to enhance tribal community plans for requesting and receiving materiel from the SNS

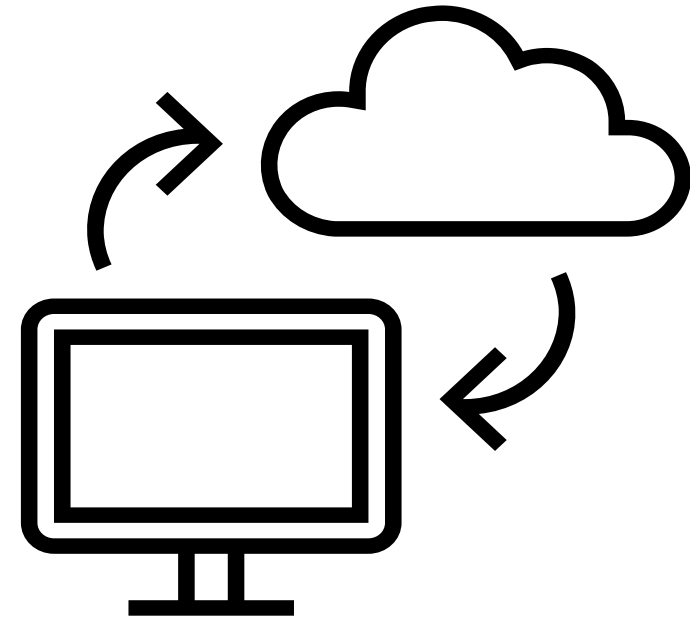
IMATS Modernization: Cloud Migration

- **Key Benefits**

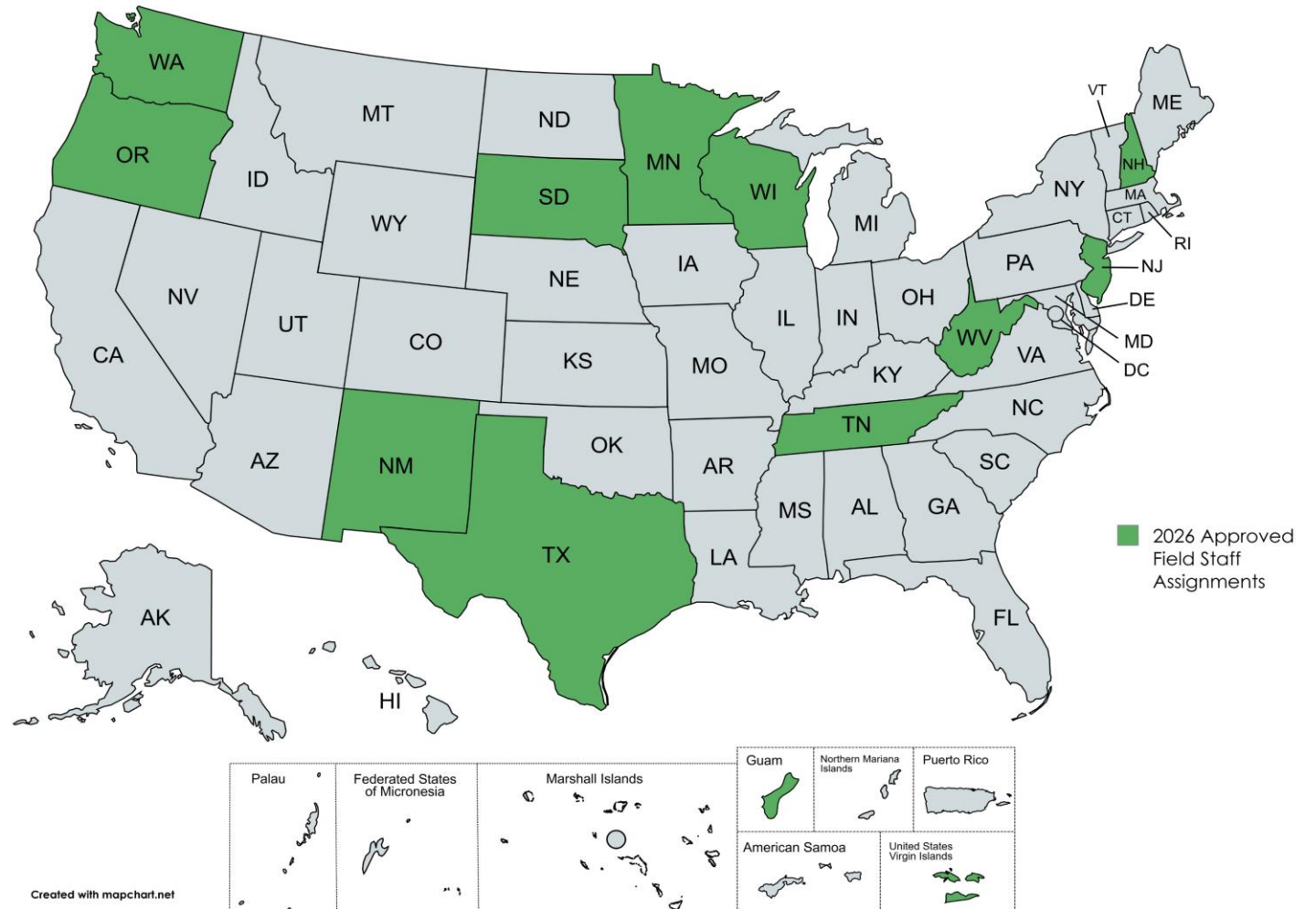
- Eliminates CDC SAMS authentication requirement

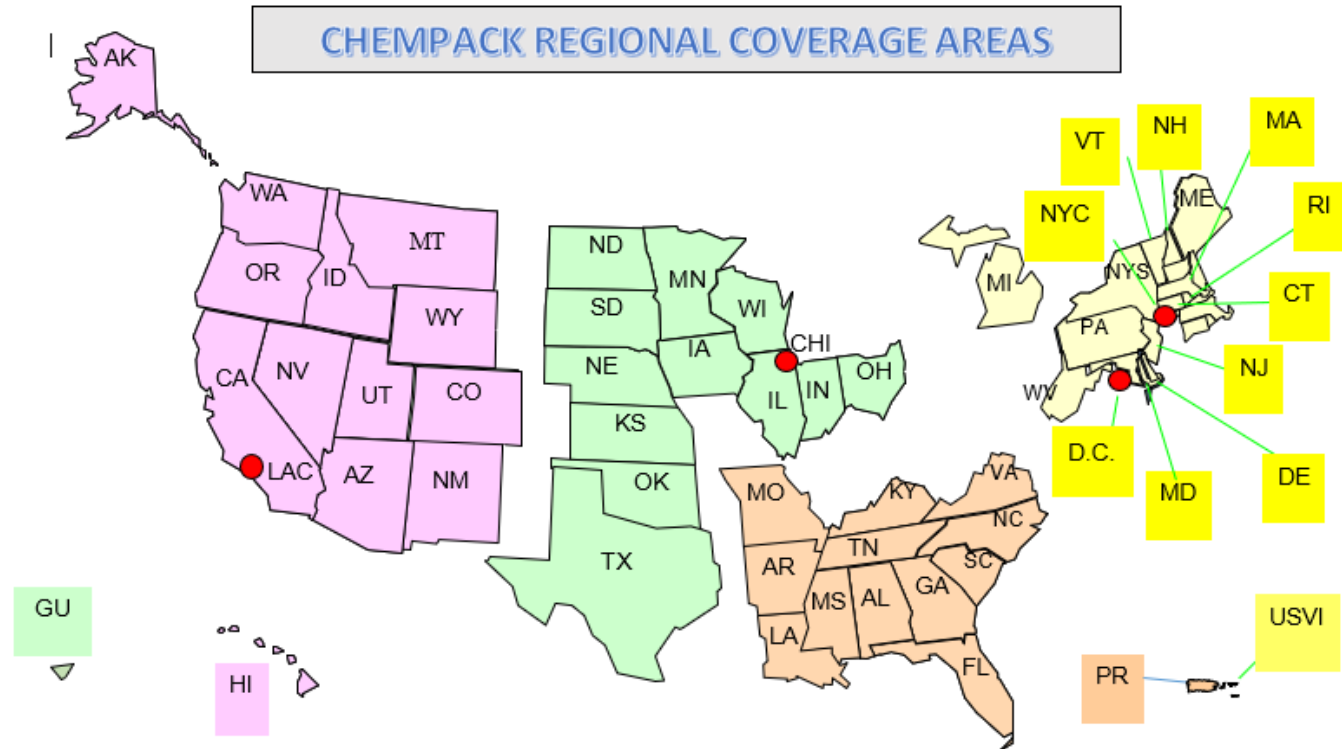

CHEMPACK Activities 2025

- **Program Sustainment**

- Completed eight on-the-ground sustainments across Florida, Maryland, California, Georgia
- Completed 143 drop shipments across 62 jurisdictions (states, directly funded cities, territories)

- **Product Shipments & Returns**

- 11,810 cases shipped via 155 drop shipments
- 15,448 cases of expired product returned

- **National Special Security Events Supported**

- NFL Super Bowl – New Orleans, Louisiana
- Kentucky Derby – Louisville, Kentucky
- Thunder Over Louisville – Louisville, Kentucky

CHEMPACK Activities 2026

- **Future Procurements**

- Procurement actions on-going in FY26
- Currently on-track to procure critical products before Sept. 30, 2026

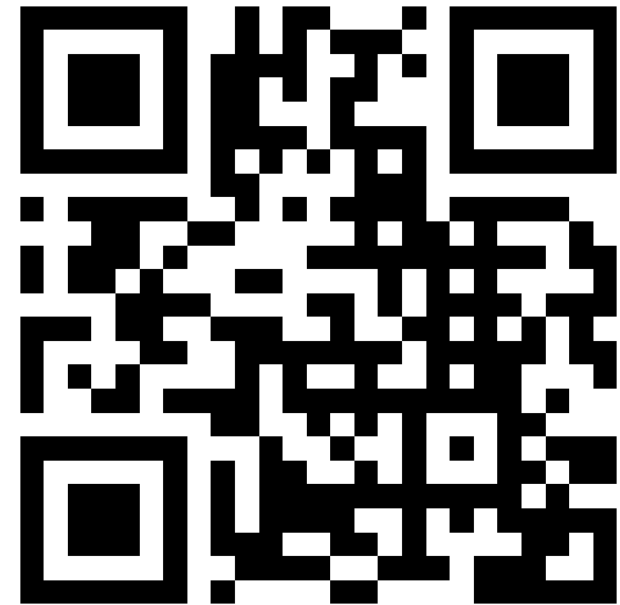
