National Radon Action Month takes place every January to increase the public's awareness of radon, promote radon testing and mitigation, and advance the use of radon-resistant new construction practices.

If left unchecked, radon (which is colorless and odorless) in the home can lead to dangerous health effects like lung cancer. Test it, fix it, and save a life!

COVID-19 MITIGATION &



Continue to keep you + loved ones safe

With the new variants, a rise in cases + hospitalizations due to COVID-19, + 1.6M Virginians still not fully vaccinated, keep these precautions in mind throughout the New Year.

Get vaccinated

- Authorized COVID-19 vaccines can help protect you from COVID-19
- Visit vaccinate.virginia.gov to get your 1st, 2nd, or 3rd dose

Wear a mask

- Everyone 2 years or older not fully vaccinated should wear a mask in indoor public places.
- If you are fully vaccinated, to maximize protection + prevent possibly spreading COVID-19 to others

Stay 6 feet apart

- . If possible, maintain 6 feet between others
- Remember that some people without symptoms may be able to spread virus.



Vaccination is our number one line of defense in defeating COVID-19. All COVID-19 vaccines approved and authorized in the United States are safe, effective and free. The Central Shenandoah Health District encourages everyone who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine do so as soon as possible!

In addition to vaccination, layering other public health mitigation measures can keep you and your family safe! This can include:

• Masking up in areas of high transmission, even if you have already been vaccinated. Currently, the majority

- of localities throughout the state are in a state of substantial to high transmission. Read more about transmission <u>here</u>.
- Practice physical distancing (also known as social distancing), and stay 6 feet apart from others. It is a
 way to slow the spread of COVID-19 by reducing close contact between people. The closer you are to other
 people who are not fully vaccinated and the more time you spend with those people, the higher the risk of
 COVID-19 spread.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, rubbing your hands together for at least 30 seconds until they are dry.
