### CSHD LAUNCHES SURVEY TO BETTER SUPPORT OUR COMMUNITY IN ACCESSING THE COVID-19 VACCINE


The Central Shenandoah Health District is launching a Rapid Community Assessment (RCA) to learn how we can better support our community with accessing Covid-19 vaccines. We invite you to share this survey with your family, friends, and community. This survey has been tailored to gather insight from folks who have not been ready or have not been able to get vaccinated against Covid-19. The survey is available in both English and Spanish.

The online survey will be open until we are able to gather a sufficient number of responses. Please feel free to share the survey link throughout the week to promote community member access. By early next week, paper forms of the survey will be available at most libraries throughout the health district. We will communicate with survey distributors when the survey is closed. The results of the survey will be included in a report at the end of our RCA process. This report will be available to the community as soon as it is finalized.

All responses to this survey will be kept anonymous and personal information will not be collected.

#### MAKE SURE YOUR MASK IS WORKING FOR YOU!



As we experience another surge in COVID-19 cases throughout the health district, it is important to choose the right masks, and make sure you're wearing them correctly! Masking up in public spaces lowers your chances of contracting and spreading COVID-19. Along with vaccination, masking is one of the most important tools to ending the pandemic.

Masks should always cover the nose and mouth, while laying flat against your face. A mask should <u>not</u> be worn if:

- It's wet or dirty.
- The fit is loose, or you can see gaps around the nose or mouth.
- It's made of a material that makes breathing difficult, like vinyl.\

The chart below illustrates the rate of cases throughout the Central Shenandoah Health District over the last 90 days.




17-Day Average Number of New Cases Reported, Rate per 100,000 Population within last 14 days

You are considered to be fully vaccinated 2 weeks after your second dose in a 2-dose series or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine.

#### January is National Radon Awareness Month!

National Radon Action Month takes place every January to increase the public's awareness of radon, promote radon testing and mitigation, and advance the use of radon-resistant new construction practices.

If left unchecked, radon (which is colorless and odorless) in the home can lead to dangerous health effects like lung cancer. Test it, fix it, and save a life!

# COVID-19 MITIGATION

Vaccination is our number one line of defense in defeating COVID-19. All COVID-19 vaccines approved and authorized in the United States are safe, effective and free. The Central Shenandoah Health District encourages everyone who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine do so as soon as possible!

*In addition to vaccination*, layering other public health mitigation measures can keep you and your family safe! This can include:

- Masking up in areas of high transmission, even if you have already been vaccinated. Currently, the majority
  of localities throughout the state are in a state of substantial to high transmission. Read more about
  transmission here.
- Practice physical distancing (also known as social distancing), and stay 6 feet apart from others. It is a
  way to slow the spread of COVID-19 by reducing close contact between people. The closer you are to other
  people who are not fully vaccinated and the more time you spend with those people, the higher the risk of
  COVID-19 spread.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, rubbing your hands together for at least 30 seconds until they are dry.
