

#### CSHD COVID-19 SURVEY CLOSES AT 5 PM ON FEBRUARY 11

On January 24th, CSHD launched a <u>Rapid Community Assessment (RCA)</u> to learn how we can better support our community with accessing Covid-19 vaccines. A quick, anonymous survey has been available, both online and at libraries, as the first phase for gathering this valuable community insight. The questions are tailored to gather responses from folks who have not been ready or have not been able to get vaccinated against Covid-19. The survey can be completed in English or Spanish.

All responses to this survey will be kept anonymous and personal information will not be collected.



You are considered to be fully vaccinated 2 weeks after your second dose in a 2-dose series or 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine.

With Valentine's Day around the corner, let's talk about heart health!

Additionally, medical conditions such as heart disease can make you more likely to get severely ill from Covid-19.

Increase your physical activity - moving more can help reduce your risk factors for heart disease!

Eat a heart healthy diet - a diet low in sodium and saturated fat is key!

Get quality sleep and reduce your stress - most adults need 7 to 8 hours of sleep each night.

## COVID-19 MITIGATION



Vaccination is our number one line of defense in defeating COVID-19. All COVID-19 vaccines approved and authorized in the United States are safe, effective and free. The Central Shenandoah Health District encourages everyone who is eligible to receive the COVID-19 vaccine do so as soon as possible!

*In addition to vaccination*, layering other public health mitigation measures can keep you and your family safe! This can include:

- Masking up in areas of high transmission, even if you have already been vaccinated. Currently, the majority
  of localities throughout the state are in a state of substantial to high transmission. Read more about
  transmission here.
- Practice physical distancing (also known as social distancing), and stay 6 feet apart from others. It is a
  way to slow the spread of COVID-19 by reducing close contact between people. The closer you are to other
  people who are not fully vaccinated and the more time you spend with those people, the higher the risk of
  COVID-19 spread.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, rubbing your hands together for at least 30 seconds until they are dry.
